### Dear Parents,

Alleluia, Alleluia, He is Risen! - He is Risen Indeed!

What wonderful life changing truth this is. We have completed our Lenten journey of forty days, the journey of Triduum, and we are on the other side. Amazingly this journey of Lent parallels what we all have been living these past many weeks. We must remember that the same God who was with the first disciples from the crucifixion to the joy of the resurrection, is the same God who is here with us now in our journey - share this with your kids.

The first Sunday after Easter is known as Divine Mercy Sunday. On this day we are reminded of our call to share the divine love and mercy of Jesus Christ with everyone we meet. Use the sections that follow to invite Jesus into your hearts and into your home. We encourage you to draw your family more deeply into relationship with: God, with one another, and with friends. Make time this Sunday to strengthen these foundational relationships.

## These 50 Days

We celebrate the Easter Season from now through Pentecost on May 31st. In the upcoming weekly readings at Mass, the Church will remember how the early Christians lived, loved and worshiped.

We invite you to live this in a special way within your families - remembering in faith that Jesus' death on the cross for our salvation *changes everything*. Help your family to focus on hope and to trust in the promise that nothing can separate us from the love of God - neither death nor life nor viral pandemic!

This is an opportunity for you to show your children that the Christian life is rooted in hope, love, mercy and service, seeing to the needs of others as we trust God to provide for our own.

## Gospel Reading - John 20:19-31

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side.

The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. - Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe."

Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now, Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

## **Spiritual Communion:**

(After the celebrant receives communion, mute your livestream and lead your family in making a spiritual communion)

#### **Parent**

Repeat after me: My Jesus...
I believe that You are truly present...
in the Holy Eucharist.
I love You above all things...
and I want to be with you.
Since I am unable to receive you at Mass...
please Jesus, come into my heart.
Be with me now...
and never let me be separated from you. Amen.

## **Dinner Conversation Tonight**

As we read about the Apostles waiting locked away in the upper room after Jesus Resurrection use some of these questions for discussion during your family meal. Ask for each person to share an answer before moving to the next family member.

Our family has been together more during the "stay in place" mandate.

- How have our dinner conversations been?
- In what ways are they the same? In what ways have they been different?
- How has our time together helped us to experience God's presence in a new way?

- Do you call upon the Holy Spirit to help you forgive ask for forgiveness? Why or why not?

## **Family Conversation**


How can we as a family better practice forgiveness with one another?

- Share how you feel about what happened



## Asking for a Friend

## Make Divine Mercy "Sundaes"

Check out this great idea from Catholic Icing. Get the groceries you need and consider doing this at the same time with another family from your parish.
