

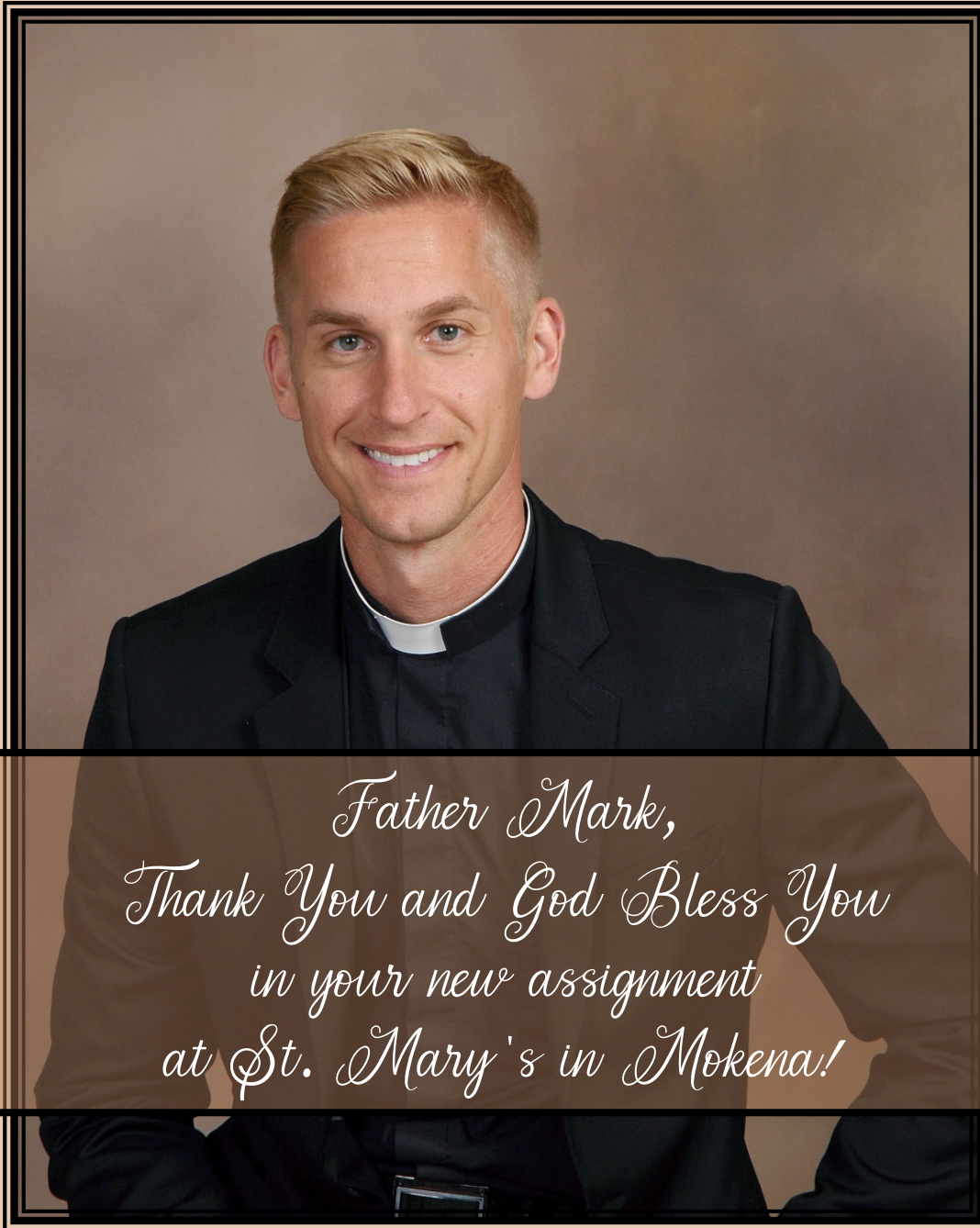

From The Pastor's Desk...

Sadly, today is Fr. Mark's last weekend with us. Most newly ordained priests find it difficult to leave their first assignment. I hope Fr. Mark will carry with him treasured memories of his first priestly assignment here at Our Lady of Mercy. I

know I do after leaving my first assignment 35 years ago at St. Alexander in Villa Park. I don't know whether it is true or not, but it's been said about priest transfers (to keep us humble I suppose) that 10% of parishioners are happy to see you go, 20% are really upset, and the rest just kind of go with the flow. I suspect that a much greater percentage here at OLM are extremely sad to see Fr. Mark leave! I join you! I know that Fr. Mark and all of us feel short-changed with the COVID-19 restrictions. Not being able to express our gratitude, love, and best wishes to him with a proper reception and opportunity to greet him individually really stinks! Priest transfers are strange in that this weekend we say goodbye to Fr. Mark, and next weekend, while we are still grieving the loss of Fr. Mark, we welcome Fr. James. And Fr. Mark is welcomed at a new parish. A week hardly seems enough time to grieve!

I especially want to thank Fr. Mark for what he has done for our parish (the list is endless) and for me personally during his three years at OLM. As a priest nearing retirement, it was a special honor to have a newly ordained priest assigned to minister with me. I have been a pastor 27 of my 39 years ordained, with eight different parochial vicars ministering with me during my four pastorates. I cannot thank him enough for the youthful vision, hope, and hard work he has brought to ministry and rectory life. Fr. Mark encouraged me to embrace a new vision for the future church! – moving a parish from maintenance to mission. Fr. Mark is an excellent preacher putting his heart and soul in preparing homilies. I have said that he is the Bishop Fulton Sheen of our time! His homilies at times challenged me in areas I didn't want to be challenged. He is a man with a deep spiritual life of prayer, lives a life of simplicity (compare his clothes closet to mine!) and is a convicted disciple of Jesus! I once told his mother that I didn't know if I was living with a future bishop or saint!!

While we have had our arguments over theology and rubrics of celebrating the Mass, we have had fun too. We have enjoyed bantering back and forth with each other at Masses to make you laugh. I just pray that one day his heart will be converted to liking dogs. I hope so...his new pastor has 3 dogs! God bless you Fr. Mark! May the people at St. Mary in Mokena be as blessed as we have been with your presence and ministry!

DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PASTOR.....
¡También conocido como Chardonnay W(h)ines!

Lamentablemente, hoy es el último fin de semana del Padre Mark con nosotros. A la mayoría de los sacerdotes recién ordenados les resulta difícil dejar su primera asignación. Espero que el Padre Mark se lleve consigo recuerdos atesorados de su primera misión sacerdotal aquí en Our Lady of Mercy. Sé que lo hago, después de dejar mi primera asignación hace 35 años en St. Alexander en Villa Park. No sé si es cierto o no, pero se ha dicho acerca de las transferencias de los sacerdotes (supongo que para mantenernos humildes) que el 10% de los feligreses están felices de verlos partir, el 20% están realmente molestos y el resto simplemente sigue la corriente. ¡Sospecho que un porcentaje mucho mayor aquí en OLM están extremadamente tristes de ver al Padre Mark irse! ¡Me uno a Uds.! Sé que el Padre Mark y todos nosotros nos sentimos afectados por las restricciones de COVID-19. ¡No poder expresarle nuestra gratitud, amor y nuestros mejores deseos con una recepción adecuada y la oportunidad de saludarlo individualmente realmente fastidia! Las transferencias de sacerdotes son extrañas porque este fin de semana nos despedimos del Padre Mark, y el próximo fin de semana, mientras seguimos lamentando la pérdida del Padre Mark, damos la bienvenida al Padre James. Y el Padre Mark es bienvenido en una nueva parroquia. ¡Apenas una semana parece tiempo suficiente para estar triste!

Quiero agradecer especialmente al Padre Mark por lo que ha hecho por nuestra parroquia (la lista es interminable) y por mí personalmente durante sus tres años en OLM. Como sacerdote a punto de jubilarse, fue un honor especial tener un sacerdote recién ordenado asignado para ministrar conmigo. He sido pastor 27 de mis 39 años ordenado, con ocho vicarios parroquiales diferentes ministrando conmigo durante mis cuatro pastoreados. No puedo agradecerle lo suficiente por la visión juvenil, la esperanza y el arduo trabajo que ha aportado al ministerio y la vida rectoral. ¡El Padre Mark me animó a adoptar una nueva visión para la futura iglesia! - mover una parroquia del mantenimiento a la misión. El Padre Mark es un excelente predicador que pone su corazón y su alma en la preparación de homilías. ¡He dicho que él es el obispo Fulton Sheen de nuestro tiempo! Sus homilías a veces me desafiaron en áreas en las que no quería que me desafiaran. ¡Es un hombre con una profunda vida espiritual de oración, vive una vida de simplicidad (¡compara su armario de ropa con el mío!) y es un discípulo convicto de Jesús! ¡Una vez le dije a su madre que no sabía si estaba viviendo con un futuro obispo o santo!

Si bien hemos tenido nuestros argumentos sobre la teología y los contenidos de la celebración de la Misa, también nos hemos divertido. Hemos disfrutado bromeando una y otra vez en las Misas para hacerte reír. Solo rezo para que un día su corazón se convierta y le guste los perros. Eso espero... ¡su nuevo pastor tiene 3 perros! ¡Dios te bendiga Padre Mark! ¡Que la gente de St. Mary en Mokena sea tan bendecida como lo hemos sido con tu presencia y ministerio!

Fr. Mark's open letter to Fr. Don...

June 17, 2020

Don,

Do you remember the first words out of your mouth when I met you? I'll remind you. You said, "I forgot to tell you on the phone that I have a dog; I hope you like dogs!" Thankfully, our conversation went much better after that first bump in the road. As we sat and talked in the rectory at St. Thomas, I got my first glimpse at the type of man you are: kind, fun, compassionate, and loving.

I wasn't even ordained a priest yet, but you patiently sat there on the couch nodding your head as I railed off—I'm sure in a rapid fire, incoherent way—all these ideas that I hoped to implement alongside you once we arrived at OLM. I marvel at the way you looked past my naivety and lack of experience that day by allowing me to express my hopes and desires for the parish. You were always patient with me and my ideas.

I've thought about that a lot recently: "Why was Don so patient with me over the years; why did he give me so much freedom; how in the world was he able to put-up with so much of my scheming?" I think it was because you wanted to see me succeed; you wanted me to have a great first experience in my priesthood; you wanted me to see that the priesthood can be fun and exciting; you cared about me; you wanted me to flourish.

We flourished together. To be sure, we had passionate disagreements at times; we got under each other's skins from time-to-time; your dogs even bit me a couple of times (two times to be exact, thanks Heide...may she rest in peace); but overall, we worked so well together. It was such a blessing for me to walk into OLM as a new priest and you as its new pastor. I enjoyed meeting with you and discussing the best path forward in making disciples. We shared and discussed ideas in your office, in my office, and at the kitchen table; I learned so much from you.

Thank you for being patient with me in all my weaknesses and faults. I am a better man and a better priest as a result of spending three years with you. I will be forever grateful that the Lord placed me with you for my first assignment as a priest. I pray I don't squander all the knowledge, experience, and charity you shared with me.

I know that you will allow Fr. James to flourish the same way you allowed me to flourish; you will guide him and mentor him the same way you did for me. I told him numerous times already how blessed he is to have you as his first pastor; he hit the jackpot.

You may not have remembered the first words out of your mouth when we met three years ago, but I pray you always remember these last words out of my mouth to you as I leave OLM: thank you and I love you.

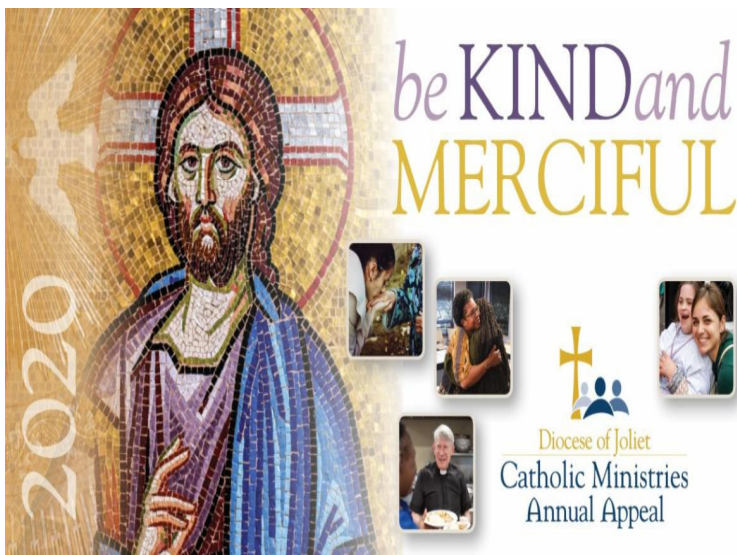
