



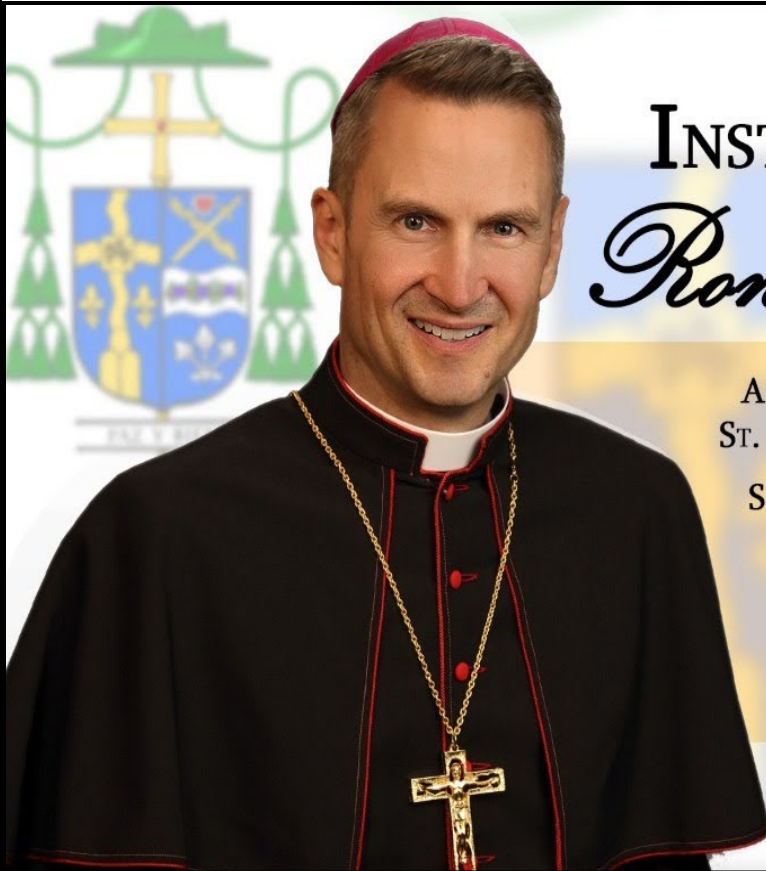

A sacred event is coming up. Sacred in the sense of our duty as Catholic Christians and citizens of the United States. That sacred duty is to vote in the general election on November 2, 2020. As Election Day draws near it is important for everyone to know what is permitted and

what is not permitted regarding the Church's involvement in politics and the election. What **IS** permitted: Educating Catholics and others on the teachings of the Church as they relate to social policies. Analyzing and measuring policies against the values of the Gospel. Speaking out on issues, such as those involving the life and dignity of the human person, social justice, the promotion of the common good, and the life of the Church in society. Encouraging voters to participate fully in the political process. What **IS NOT** permitted: Endorsing a candidate or political party. The Church donating money or other resources to a candidate or political party. Exclusively offering the parish or church organization's facilities to a candidate or political party. Campaign materials or other materials produced by candidates or political parties are not to be distributed on Church property including cars parked in the church parking lot or signs in the parkway. In a bulletin article or homily, there is not enough time or space to go into depth about the teachings of the Church. Regarding all the issues that one must consider in forming ones conscience the basic Catholic Social teaching includes the following major themes:

- Life and Dignity of the Human Person
- Protection of and Participation in the Family and Community
- Rights of the Human Person be Protected
- Care for the Poor and Vulnerable
- Dignity of work and the rights of Workers
- Solidarity as One Human Family
- Care for God's Creation

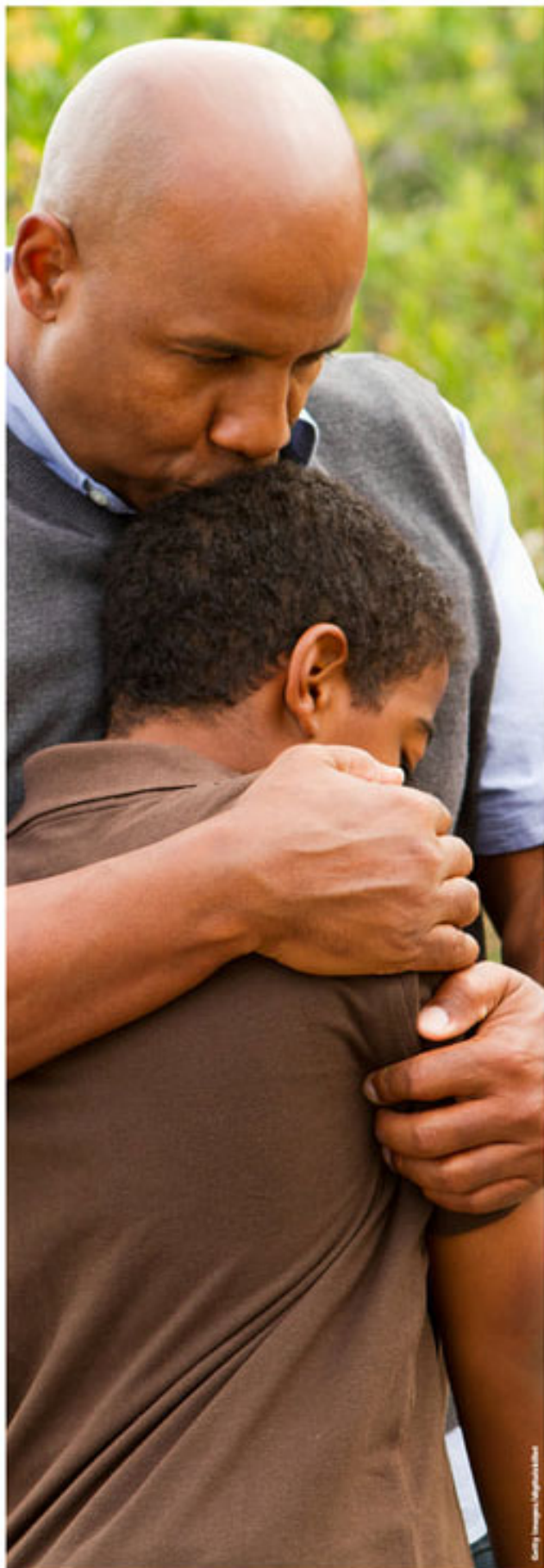

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I've always had a bit of a recalcitrant streak. Ask me to do something, and I'll happily oblige. Order me to do something, and I'll set my jaw. So, I can relate to the first son's knee-jerk reply when told (not asked) to work in the vineyard. "I will not." Yet, despite this initial reaction, the first son obeyed his father's command. He "changed his mind and went." I didn't see it at first, but this parable is not about a clash of wills but obedience – not blind obedience, but choosing to turn over our lives to the will of the Father. The longer version of Paul's Letter to the Philippians illustrates this beautifully, challenging us to imitate Jesus: "He humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." As human beings, we have the freedom to choose to place God's will and the needs of others before our own. It doesn't mean being a doormat, but rather having a healthy humility and willingness to "change our minds (and hearts)" to better conform to the example of Jesus. As the *catechism* reminds us in this gem about obedience: "The more one does what is good, the freer one becomes. There is no true freedom except in the service of what is good and just." (1733)

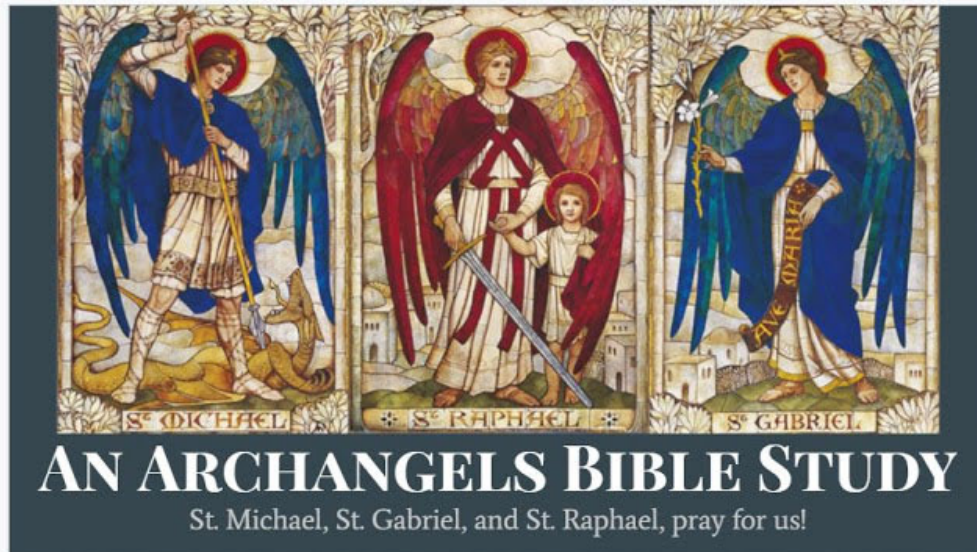
GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Have you ever kicked a bad habit, such as eating too many sweets, falling down the social media rabbit hole, or failure to floss? I've occasionally pulled it off (well, for a few days anyway), but I find it's much tougher to change habits of my mind and heart. In today's Gospel, the first son *changes* his mind, and his heart. This is what Jesus asks of us as well: a change of heart and mind toward love and obedience, wherever it is needed in our lives. For starters, it could mean taking a few moments to pray for guidance each morning before jumping full-speed ahead into our personal agenda. We can ask God to show us how to align our lives more closely with his will for us – through prayer, reading the Scriptures, and reflecting on areas in our lives that need an overhaul. Our "yes" to working in the vineyard begins by attending to what God has shown us, and leads us to even greater freedom in Christ.

PRAY Need a spiritual jump-start? Pray the Daily Examen, an ancient practice from St. Ignatius Loyola of peacefully reflecting on the events of the day in order to detect the presence of God's Spirit and discern his will for you.

The Feast of the Holy Archangels is coming up on September 29. Students might be familiar with their names (maybe?), especially St. Gabriel and St. Michael, but you can help them know their stories too. Guide your child(ren) to grow in devotion to these mighty servants of God by sharing their stories from the Bible.



St. Michael the Archangel~ St. Michael means, "Who is like God?" Read from the last book of the Bible, Revelation 12: 1-18. Close your eyes and imagine what Heaven will be like when we gather together with Mary, the Angels, and the Saints around the throne of God. **Draw or write a description. Print a copy of the Prayer to St. Michael as a family asking this heavenly warrior to defend us from temptation.**

St. Raphael the Archangel~ St. Raphael means, "God heals." In this story, Tobit, his son Tobias and Tobias' future wife Sarah are all suffering in some way. St. Raphael disguises himself and travels as a companion with Tobias, helping him meet and marry Sarah and then assisting him in healing his father Tobit of blindness. After these miracles occur, Raphael reveals himself to them as an angel. **Read Tobit 12:1-22 to learn how Tobit and his family react when they find our Raphael is an angel.**

St. Gabriel the Archangel~ St. Gabriel means, "God is my strength." Read from the Gospel of Luke 1:26-27. Imagine being present in the room when St. Gabriel arrived at Mary's home and announced this good news. What would you think or feel?

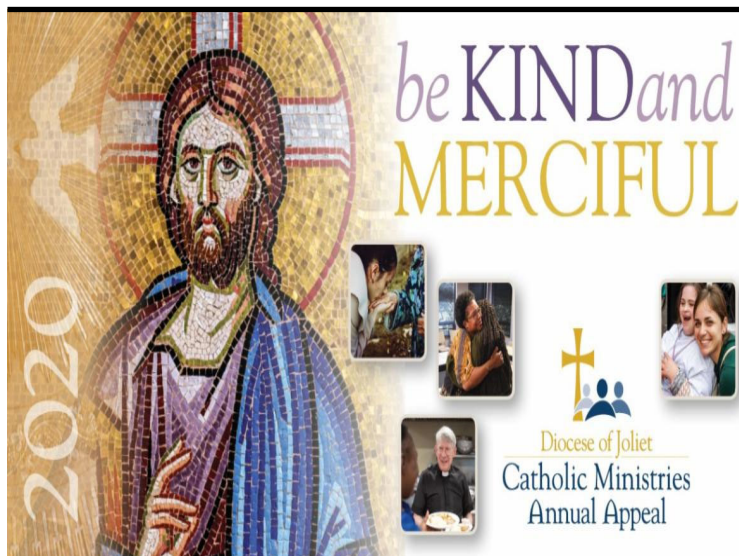
