
















Here are 3 ideas for using these cards

- I. Print and cut each saint and the description to the right as one big rectangle, fold in half, laminate. Now the card will be like a flashcard with the picture on one side and the information about the saint on the other side.
- 2. Print and cut apart all of the cards. Put the cards face down in rows and columns. Flip over two cards at a time looking for a match. A match will be the saint on one card and the matching description on the other card. This would be the memory game option.
- 3. Use the cards as a Go Fish type game. Ask other players for a certain saint by determining which saint matches the description in your hand.







#### Fast Facts:


- older brother of St. Peter

Feast: July 26 Patron: homemakers


#### Fast Facts:

- grandmother of Jesus




Feast: June 13 Patron: lost things

- Franciscan friar






- lived a simple, sincere, Christian life

Feast: July 11 Patron: students


- brother of St. Scholastica




- fed the poor, healed them and donated her possessions

- her family did not understand and tried to keep her from praying




Feast: November 22 Patron: musicians

- he heard heavenly music and accepted Jesus as His Savior






#### Fast Facts:

Feast: May 10 Patron: Hawaii


- priest who served in Hawaii

#### Fast Facts:


- spent nights

#### Fast Facts:


- loved to read the Bible and was drawn to Christ in the Eucharist

- first native born American to become a saint




Feast: November 17 Patron: widows

- others told her husband and he supported her generous giving






- wanted to be a nun but her parents said no

- she was visited by Jesus and asked to be an example of mercy to others




Feast: November 13 Patron: immigrants

#### Fast Facts:


- worked in an orphanage in Italy
- the bishop finally allowed her to become a nun after seeing her devotion to God as she cared for others






#### Fast Facts:

- had wise advice and wrote to teach about holiness




Feast: October 4 Patron: animals

- showed honor, love, and respect to everyone even animals and nature






- enjoyed school and sports

Feast: January 3 Patron: Paris




during a time of war, when the people of Paris were starving, she gathered grains and baked them into bread and gave it to the neediest people of Paris




Feast: October 16 Patron: expectant mothers

- helped the poor and sick and did the Will of God






- left the Spanish army to become a priest and win souls for Jesus

Patron: librarians


#### Fast Facts:


- learned several languages

- loved reading and praying using the Bible




Feast: May 30 Patron: France

- the enemies kidnapped her and put her to death






- spent his life training young boys to make a living and know & love God

#### Fast Facts:


- studied to be a priest but the bishop in Bohemia wouldn't ordain him

Patron: booksellers


#### Fast Facts:

Feast: June 24 Patron: Puerto Rico


- · cousin of Jesus

Patron: environment


#### Fast Facts:

Feast: December 13 Patron: eyesight


- like the woman in the Bible who was healed after touching Jesus, Lucy's mother was healed by touching the tomb of St. Agatha

#### Fast Facts:


- a princess who married the king of Scotland

#### Fast Facts:


- learned how to be a barber and take care of the sick

#### Fast Facts:


- mother of Jesus

#### Fast Facts:


- Jesus cast demons out of her and she was so grateful that she became a devoted follower

- wrote the first Gospel






- was in a concentration camp during World War II

- devotion to Mary




Feast: August 27 Patron: wives

#### Fast Facts:


- mother of St.

- prayed constantly for her son and her prayers were answered when he became a Christian and a great man of God






#### Fast Facts:

Feast: March 17 Patron: Ireland


- used a shamrock to teach about the Holy Trinity

#### Fast Facts:


- was blind for 3 days and heard Jesus telling him to change his life

#### &Fast Facts:


- fisherman

#### Fast Facts:


- took care of those in need, in particular slaves
- would meet slave ships as they arrived and offer food & medicine and teach about the love of Jesus




Feast: May 26 Patron: Rome

- first to become a saint because of what happened after she died




- wanted to become a nun but became a wife and a mother and later became a nun after her husband and sons died
- had a devotion to the Passion of Christ




Feast: September 17 Patron: catechumens

- named a Doctor of the Church






- was beautiful but did not want others to notice her beauty

#### Rest Facts:


- sister of St.

- there was an attempt to kill him with arrows, but he survived




Feast: December 26 Patron: stonemasons

- first martyr






- suffered from terrible headaches but was cured through prayer

#### Fast Facts:


- started a new order of nuns to work with the poor and dying






Feast: January 28 Patron: universities

- considered one of the Church's greatest theologians but gave all glory to God






- highly respected lawyer & judge

Feast: February 14 Patron: love


#### Fast Facts:


- priest

- was in prison yet continued to share about Christianity and help and heal others while he was there




Feast: July 12 Patron: laundry workers
