GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

"Do not be afraid; just have faith." It's likely we've heard and seen Jesus' reassuring words or even shared them with others. When I read the story of Jairus and his daughter, I thought of a man with whom I spoke recently. As his lungs failed him during a bout with coronavirus, doctors advised him to say good-bye to his wife and daughters before they placed him on a ventilator. "I was expecting to wake up in heaven," he said, recalling the moment not as one of fear or panic, but of deep peace. In today's Gospel passage, Jairus had that kind of "fearless faith" as well, placing his daughter's life wholly in Jesus' hands even as others in the crowd ridiculed him. When we pray or ask for God's healing, we can't know the outcome. But we can pray for the gifts of faith and courage, placing our lives in God's loving hands.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

When I was a child, my aunt would always encourage us to make the sign of the cross when we passed an ambulance or accident scene. In her concern for the strangers at the side of the road, my aunt was giving us a lesson in compassion, which stands in marked contrast to the crowds who ridiculed Jairus as he desperately sought help for his daughter. The Church has a rich tradition of intercessory prayer, encouraging us to pray for the needs of others. Today's readings remind me that we can share our faith by praying for others who are sick, dying, grieving, or struggling in some way. Likewise, we can ask others to pray for us, trusting that God will hear our prayers.

PRAY Do you ever offer to pray for someone and then completely forget? Try writing each person's name on a Post-it and placing it on your bedside table. Other ideas: Pray the Rosary while driving or exercising, devoting a decade to each person; include prayers for others when you say Grace before meals; as soon as you offer to pray for someone, drop everything and do it!



Pastoral Care

Practice Sun Safety

We are spending more time outdoors to enjoy warmer weather activities. It is important to practice sun safety because skin cancer is the most common cancer in the U.S. UV exposure is the most preventable risk factor for skin cancer.

One in five Americans will develop skin cancer. The American Academy of Dermatology Association recommends the following ways to protect your skin from the sun's harmful rays and reduce the risk of skin cancer. Seek shade. Remember that the sun's rays are the strongest between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Wear sun-protective clothing. When possible, wear a lightweight and longsleeved shirt and pants, a widebrimmed hat and sunglasses with UV protection. Apply sunscreen. It is recommended to apply a broadspectrum, water-resistant sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher to all skin not covered by clothing.

When detected early, skin cancer is highly treatable. Perform regular skin self-exams using the ABCDEs of melanoma. It is important to contact a board-certified dermatologist if you notice any new spots on your skin or spots that are changing, itching or bleeding.

Melanoma is the most dangerous form of skin cancer. If it is "in situ", the cancer is confined to the top layer of skin and is highly curable. If it is "malignant", the cancer can spread to other parts of the body. Early detection and treatment will assist in an increased survival. Make your day in the sun safe and fun!

When it is Time to Get Help

Everyone experiences stress or goes through a difficult time. Pay attention to your body and your feelings to evaluate if you may need extra help. Some indications that you may need help are that you can't get out of bed; you feel like you can't function; nothing brings you joy; your appetite or sleep is disturbed; and/or you feel irritable all the time.

If you are experiencing several symptoms and they persist for a week or more, contact your primary care physician for evaluation. There may be a variety of reasons why you are feeling the way you are that could be related to nutrition, activity, hydration or stress.
