### From The Pastor's Desk...

#### Also Known as Chardonnay W(h)ines!



Jesus had little stomach for hypocrisy. Few of us do. "Hypocrite," is one of the harshest words in our vocabulary and is reserved for people we find particularly two-faced. One observation about hypocrites...they are usually the last to recognize that they are. No

one wants to believe they are two-faced or phony. Most hypocrites are convinced they are perfectly honest. When the Pharisees condemned Jesus for working miracles on the Sabbath, they believed with all their hearts they were speaking for God. This should make us suspicious about ourselves. Are we hypocritical and don't recognize it?

In light of today's readings, this question merits consideration. In the reading from James, we are warned: "Be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves." Practice what you preach, James says, and don't fool yourself that you are virtuous simply because you're fond of virtuous teachings. In the gospel, Jesus deplores the hypocrisy of the Pharisees. Of what sense is their agitation over the proper washing of hands when their hearts are full of murder and hatred?

Parents often condemn activities in their teenager that they themselves have been guilty of for years. Business people complain about the crime rates among minority groups who wouldn't have the slightest qualms about cheating on their expense accounts or involving themselves in shady deals. Even in religious circles, we may find some of the most conservative and fundamentalist Christians to also be some of the most bigoted and uncharitable people one could meet. When preachers, for example, passionately put down other Christian denominations "in the name of Jesus," don't you wonder what "Jesus" they are talking about?

This is not to serve as a condemnation of others, but to make us aware that hypocrisy is devious and not necessarily a vice only in someone else. When criticizing, chastising, or condemning others, we should first see if our own house is really in order. Better yet, we follow Christ more authentically when we completely give up judging and condemning others. And we have good reason for doing so when we consider the many ways we may be hypocrites ourselves.

The only way to avoid the charge of hypocrisy is to live our lives with integrity. We are one-faced when we act like Jesus, no matter how difficult it might be!

## Desde el Excritorio Del Pastor

#### ¡También conocido como Chardonnay W(h)ines!



Jesús tenía poco estómago para la hipocresía. Pocos de nosotros lo hacemos. "Hipócrita" es una de las palabras más duras de nuestro vocabulario y está reservada para personas que encontramos particularmente de dos caras. Una observación sobre los hipócritas... suelen ser los últimos en recono-

cer que lo son. Nadie quiere creer que tienen dos caras o son falsos. La mayoría de los hipócritas están convencidos de que son perfectamente honestos. Cuando los fariseos condenaron a Jesús por obrar milagros en el Sabbat, creyeron con todo su corazón que estaban hablando por Dios. Esto debería hacernos sospechar de nosotros mismos. ¿Somos hipócritas y no lo reconocemos?

A la luz de las lecturas de hoy, esta cuestión merece consideración. En la lectura de Santiago, se nos advierte: "Sean hacedores de la palabra, y no solamente oidores, engañándose a ustedes mismos". Practica lo que predicas, dice James, y no te engañes pensando que eres virtuoso simplemente porque te gustan las enseñanzas virtuosas. En el evangelio, Jesús deplora la hipocresía de los Fariseos. ¿Qué sentido tiene su agitación por el debido lavado de manos cuando sus corazones están llenos de asesinato y odio?

Los padres a menudo condenan las actividades de sus hijos adolescentes de las que ellos mismos han sido culpables durante años. Los empresarios se quejan de las tasas de delincuencia entre los grupos minoritarios, quienes no tendrían el menor reparo en hacer trampa en sus cuentas de gastos o involucrarse en negocios turbios. Incluso en los círculos religiosos, podemos encontrar que algunos de los cristianos más conservadores y fundamentalistas también son algunas de las personas más intolerantes y poco caritativas que uno podría conocer. Cuando los predicadores, por ejemplo, rechazan apasionadamente otras denominaciones cristianas "en el nombre de Jesús", ¿no se preguntan de qué "Jesús" están hablando?

Esto no es para que sirva de condena a los demás, sino para hacernos conscientes de que la hipocresía es tortuosa y no necesariamente un vicio solo en otra persona. Al criticar, castigar o condenar a otros, primero debemos ver si nuestra propia casa está realmente en orden. Mejor aún, seguimos a Cristo de manera más auténtica cuando renunciamos por completo a juzgar y condenar a los demás. Y tenemos una buena razón para hacerlo cuando consideramos las muchas formas en que nosotros mismos podemos ser hipócritas.

La única forma de evitar la acusación de hipocresía es vivir nuestras vidas con integridad. Somos de una sola cara cuando actuamos como Jesús, ino importa lo difícil que sea!

# Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dt 4:1-2, 6-8 | Jas 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27 | Mk 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

As I began reading the Gospel for today, I initially thought, "Here we go - those hypocritical Pharisees are at it again! They are always questioning Jesus, always judging others, and always looking for ways to make themselves look 'holier' than everyone else." Uh oh; then I realized that I was feeling pretty smug as I judged the Pharisees! Sadly, it can be easy for me to fall into a "Pharisee attitude," thinking I "walk blamelessly and do justice" when really I am just deluding myself. While Jesus uses this encounter to point out the hypocrisy of the Pharisees, he also calls the crowd to a greater understanding of the source of evil in their lives, "From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts." Maybe I need to hear these words, too, and examine my own thoughts and actions before judging others.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

St. James provides an answer to combating the evil we discover in our hearts: "Humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your souls." The Word, Jesus, came to us and has given us the way to free ourselves from the evil within. Our relationship with him is the key. We know we are to "be doers of the word and not hearers only." We have the Holy Spirit to help us stay close to him and access his saving power that transforms our hearts to reflect his goodness and truth. It requires us to humbly assess and own the things we need to change; and to turn to him for guidance so that we may have nothing within us — no evil thoughts, greed, malice, envy or arrogance (etc.) — to defile us. Only then are we most free in Christ — truly free to "care for orphans and widows in their affliction and to keep oneself unstained by the world."

PRAY The Daily Examen, created by St. Ignatius of Loyola, is an ideal way for growing closer to Jesus and seeking his guidance. Suggested for the day's end, this prayerful reflection helps you recognize God's presence in the day's events, assess your thoughts and behavior, ask for his help in growing in goodness, and discern his plans for you.

## Pastoral Care

#### **Preventive Health Services**

Preventive services includes screening tests and immunizations to prevent certain kinds of illness. "Screening" means looking for a condition before there are any signs or symptoms of that condition. Conditions that a person may want to be screened for are depression, high blood pressure, risk for stroke or heart attack, cancer, abdominal aortic aneurysm or high cholesterol. There are a variety of immunizations available to prevent illnesses which most are aware of for school attendance.

To stay informed about COVID-19 news including testing and vaccinations, check out your local health department website.

It is important to live a healthy lifestyle which includes the following: know your blood sugar, blood pressure and cholesterol levels, eat wisely, be physically active, limit alcohol, sleep well, strive for a healthy weight, manage stress, be tobacco free, be safe and prevent falls, and be involved in your health care.

#### Crisis Services

For individuals experiencing a crisis, there is phone support for crisis services at 630-627-1700, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. There are also crisis residential services that provide short-term psychiatric stabilization to DuPage County residents, regardless of insurance or ability to pay. This is an alternative to inpatient hospitalization. Services provided include psychiatric evaluation, integrated assessment and treatment planning, case management and group and individual therapy. If you need these crisis services, call 630-627-1700 or walk in to the office location at 115 N. County Farm Road, Door Number 5 in Wheaton.

The Screening, Assessment and Support Services (SASS) program for children and adolescents is a statewide program developed to provide improved coordination in the delivery of mental health services for youth experiencing a mental health crisis whose care will require public funding. The program has a single point of entry, Crisis and Referral Entry Service (CARES) and ensures that youth receive crisis services in the most appropriate setting.

#### **Open Hearts Ministry**

The mental and emotional health and wellness ministry of the parish will meet on Monday, September 13 in Room 218 from 7:00 to 8:30pm. During the month of September, there is a national focus on suicide awareness and prevention. The ministry offers spiritual support, resources and education. ## SAINT TERESA of CALCUTTA

Born, August 27, 1910

Died, September 5, 1997 Feast Day, September 5

"Yesterday is gone. Tomorrow has yet to come. We have only today. Let us begin."



#### Who She Was~

Teresa was the daughter of Nikola and Dropnda Bojazhiu. Her parents named her Gonxha, or Agnes. Teresa was the youngest child in a loving Catholic family. She had an older sister name Aga and a brother named Lazar. Agnes's father died suddenly when Agnes was just seven years old. Her mother had to raise her children alone. When Agnes was twelve she realized God was calling her to become a missionary. She read all the stories she could find about the work of Catholic missionaries around the world. And she studied geography to learn about the lands where missionaries worked.

When Agnes was eighteen years old, she joined the Sisters of Loreto. The Sisters of Loreto are a community of Irish sisters who did missionary work in India. She traveled first to Ireland, where she began her studies. Then she was sent to India in 1929. There she took her first vows as a sister. She chose Teresa as her religious name in honor of Saint Teresa of Avila and Saint Therese of Lisieux.

From the time she first arrived in India until 1948, Mother Teresa, as she was now called, was a teacher. She taught at Saint Mary's High School in Calcutta. Many of the students at the school were girls from wealthy families. But the city of Calcutta was very large, and many people who lived there were very poor. Day after day, Mother Teresa saw the difficult lives of Calcutta's poor people. She wanted to help these poor people live better lives.

In 1948 Pope Pius XII and Teresa's order allowed her to leave Saint Mary's and devote her life to caring for the homeless people on the streets of Calcutta. Teresa studied nursing so she would be able to help the sick. She opened a school for Calcutta's poorest children. She stopped wearing the religious habit of the Sisters of Loreto. Instead, she wore the clothes of the poor Indian woman: a plain cotton sari and sandals.

As word of Mother Teresa's new mission spread, volunteers—young women from India and around the world arrived to help her in her work. Then, in 1950, the Church gave Mother Teresa permission to start a new order of religious sisters, the Missionaries of Charity. Their mission is to love and serve the poor, especially those who have no one else to care for them.

In 2003, only six years after her death, Mother Teresa was declared Blessed by Pope John Paul II. Mother Teresa was canonized a saint by Pope Francis on September 4, 2016. Today, Missionaries of Charity serve the poorest of the poor around the world, from the streets of India to the streets of New York. And, as St. Teresa reminded us, with yesterday gone and tomorrow not yet here, we have only today to reach out and help those who need it most. So let us begin.

### Haiti Mission

Meet and Support Father Don's Friend Ertha Papilion from Haiti at the Masses on 9/11 & 9/12. This is a rescheduled date.

In the summer of 2014, Father Don traveled to the small village of Duchity in the mountains of southwest Haiti. It was there that he met Ertha Papillon, a leader in her faith community of Ste. Marie-Madeleine.

Ertha is the founder and director of an orphanage and an elementary school. She has dedicated her life to serving the poorest of the poor in the countryside near Duchity. Ertha will return Father Don's visit and will speak at all the Masses. She will share her story and the story of the people she serves.


