From The Pastor's Desk...

An interesting phenomenon of our times is the emergence of social media. Through websites and mobile applications, we can access Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Linkedin, Tumblr, Forsquare, and Pinterest, to name only a few. It's hard to know how many of these sites there actually are, but it

would be safe to say they are in the hundreds. Some of these sites have redefined the very meaning of friendship. It's possible now to have "friends" whom we've never met and might never meet in person. While the ability to "connect" with others during the COVID pandemic through this technology has been helpful, the one thing I hear the most that people have missed is in person contact with other family and friends. Our faith is a community effort requiring "real presence." Just as Jesus is really present in the Eucharist, we are community of "real presence" to one another. We need to worship with one another. With our safety protocols in place, I encourage those who have not yet returned to Mass to join us. Facemasks are required, there are hand sanitizing stations, and an air filtration system was installed in the church last year and runs continuously. We long to see your face!

I ask your prayers for the success of the radioactive iodine ablation treatment for my thyroid cancer I began last Monday. This past Wednesday, I was given the radioactive iodine pill and have been in isolation since. That's why you don't see me this weekend as I am in isolation at the rectory until Thursday, September 30.

I also ask your prayers for the priests of the Joliet Diocese who will be on a convocation with the bishop September 27 - 30. The Joliet priest convocation is held every other year, and this will be the first time with our new bishop. Due to being in isolation, I will not be able to attend.

On the cover Sunday's bulletin on September 12th was an invite to all Our Lady of Mercy parishioners to celebrate my 40th anniversary of ordination on Sunday, October 10. I will be preaching all Masses that weekend. I was ordained a priest on October 10, 1981. There will be coffee and donuts after all the Masses. I will celebrate a special Mass of Thanksgiving at 2:00pm followed by a reception in the PLC and outdoors weather permitting. You are welcome to attend this Mass and reception at 2:00pm. If you plan to attend this Mass, please RSVP to me at frdon@olmercy.com so we have an accurate count when we order food for the reception. If you are attending one of the regular scheduled Sunday Masses, there is no need to RSVP. I look forward to celebrating this milestone with my Our Lady of Mercy parish family!

Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Nm 11:25-29 | Jas 5:1-6 | Mk 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Today's graphic Gospel passage always sounds a bit jarring: "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off." Upon first reading that passage, our response might be, "What?" But upon further reflection, it strikes me that Jesus is challenging us to attend to what causes us to sin: the vices we have acquired, the temptations we do not ignore, the sinful thoughts and behaviors we entertain or in which we engage. It is also important to identify where we might be culpable in leading others astray. In all of this, Jesus is asking us to be honest with ourselves and to take the necessary steps to "cut" out of our lives the things that lead us away from the Lord, allowing us to move toward him. Lest we get discouraged, we need only remember that we are not alone: We belong to Christ whose word is truth, whose precepts "give joy to the heart," and who tells us "whoever is not against us is for us." Like Moses in the first reading, we can ask that the Spirit descend upon us and give us strength.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Amazing feats we see on TV or read in the news can't help but capture our imagination. Our rich Catholic faith can be a little like that: just take a look at the lives of the saints. That's why I find the other passage in today's Gospel so encouraging. Jesus reminds us that even the smallest things we do matter — actions to help others grow in their faith: "Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward." As the Lord's spirit moves us to be a prophet to others – that is, to perform deeds in his name (mighty or not-so-mighty) – we have the ability to witness the Gospel of Jesus Christ in very real and concrete ways. As St. Teresa of Avila said: "Accustom yourself continually to make many acts of love, for they enkindle and melt the soul."

ACTIONS Prepare for the sacrament of reconciliation by asking Jesus to help you identify what causes you to sin or drives a wedge between you and others or between you and God. Then participate in this beautiful sacrament and pray for the grace to make changes.

Participants must be at least 18 years of age. The cost of the vaccine is \$25 (cash, check or Medicare Part B). Credit/debit cards not accepted for payment. For payment with Medicare Part B, please bring your Medicare card to the clinic.

Do You Know Your Cholesterol Level?

September is National Cholesterol Education Month is an opportunity to raise awareness about cholesterol and the importance of knowing your levels as high cholesterol has no symptoms. High cholesterol has no symptoms.

terol is a major risk factor for heart disease such as heart attack and stroke.

Cholesterol is a waxy substance that is found in all cells. This substance has several useful functions including heling build your body's cells. Cholesterol comes from the liver and foods that are consumed. It travels throughout the blood.

There are two types of cholesterol. High-density lipoprotein cholesterol or HDL is often referred to as "good" cholesterol. HDL picks up excess cholesterol in the blood and takes it back to the liver where it is broken down and removed from the body. Normal HDL levels are: men 20 and older more than 40 milligrams; women 20 and older more than 50 milligrams. Low-density cholesterol or LDL is often referred to as "bad" cholesterol. LDL is the type of cholesterol that can build up within the walls of the arteries, leading to a heart attack or stroke. Normal LDL levels are: men 20 and older is less than 100 milligrams and women 20 and older is less than 100 milligrams.

Lifestyle or behavior choices that can help keep cholesterol levels in a healthy range are: eat a hearthealthy diet; become more physically active; quit smoking; lose weight; and take medication as prescribed by a healthcare provider. The American Heart Association recommends that people ages 20 and older should have their cholesterol levels checked at least every four to six years. It is important to follow the advice of your healthcare provider if you are taking medication for routine blood tests as that is how cholesterol levels are checked.
