

From The Pastor's Desk...



Bishop Ronald Hicks in consultation with the Priest Personnel Board has appointed **Fr. Michael Kearney** to succeed Fr. Don McLaughlin as Pastor of Our Lady of Mercy in Aurora effective July 1, 2022.

Fr. Michael writes: "I grew up in Naperville, just down the road, since I was four years old. I went to Naperville Central for high school and I can remember coming to play against Waubonsie High School in volleyball. I went to the University of Illinois in Champaign-

Urbana and received my General Engineering degree concentrated in Control Theory Robotics with the hope to go in consulting work after college. God, clearly had a different plan.

It was in college my love for my Catholic faith grew exponentially and I wanted to share my faith with others. After college I was blessed to do 7 years of college ministry and missionary work with FOCUS (Fellowship of Catholic University Students). I worked at Washington University in St. Louis, Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, University of Kansas City in Missouri, and University of Colorado in Boulder!

After hearing the Lord call me to the priesthood through prayer and ministry, I knew the Lord was calling me to serve in the Diocese of Joliet where I grew up! I was ordained a Priest in May of 2016 and was assigned at Visitation Parish in Elmhurst. And after 3 years, I was blessed to be assigned to serve in seminary formation helping young men discern their own vocational calling toward priesthood at St. John Vianney Minor Seminary in St. Paul Minnesota. I currently serve as Formation Advisor and Spiritual Director for men in college seminary, including men from our own diocese.

I'm truly excited to be named by Bishop Ronald Hicks to be your next pastor at Our Lady of Mercy. I know I have many things to learn, but excited to be back in the Diocese and be back in parish life! I joke with my brother priests; I'm being called up from the Minors (as I worked at a minor seminary). Please know of my prayers and I look forward to meeting you in July!"



First Sunday of Lent

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

If you are anything like me, you may still be deciding what to give up or do for Lent even though we're already five days in. I know ... "Stop procrastinating!" Today's readings can help us enter more deeply into this season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. They are a reminder that Lent isn't primarily about us, as if it were a self-improvement project, but about taking the opportunity to go deeper into our relationship with God. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are ways of reducing distractions in our life and focusing on God's mercy, his sacrifice for us, and his generosity and love. I am one who likes to control things and make plans, so the readings challenge me to look beyond myself, beginning with prayer, and ask the Lord to help me grow in faith. Paul writes, "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." Jesus exemplifies this dependence on God, allowing himself to be led to the desert by the Spirit. Each time the devil tempts him, he responds and in turn shows us how to respond: by turning to God and God's words, the source of our strength. As we choose how to observe the next 35 days, we are reminded to ask God to help us find those things that help draw us closer to him.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

What comes to mind when you picture a desert? I imagine sand, heat, thirst. It's more challenging to examine the landscape of my personal desert – barren places of prayer or too much focus on the details of everyday life. Lent, however, presents a rich opportunity to pause and reprioritize our lives based on Jesus' words in today's Gospel: "You shall worship the Lord, your God, and him alone shall you serve." Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving can help us do that, reminding us of our dependence on God and helping us shift our focus from ourselves to God and others. How we observe and experience Lent will differ for each of us. Whatever our personal desert looks like, we can rest assured that God will help us find our way back to him.

ACCOMPANIMENT Find an accountability partner for Lent who can help you stay the course these next 40 days. Perhaps you can pray together each day, or simply send a text sharing how God is working in and through you in this penitential season.

A Different Approach to Fasting

Lenten fasts have a tendency to be oriented toward things like giving up food or television. But there are many other creative ways we can welcome Jesus' healing touch this Lent. Below are some suggestions you may want to consider.

- Fast from anger and hatred. Give your family an extra dose of love each day.
- Fast from judging others. Before making judgments, recall how Jesus overlooks our faults.
- Fast from discouragement. Hold on to Jesus' promise that he has a perfect plan for your life. (Jer. 29:11).
- Fast from complaining. When you find yourself about to complain, close your eyes and recall some of the little moments of joy Jesus has giving you.
- Fast from resentment or bitterness. Work on forgiving those who may have hurt you.
- Fast from spending too much money. Try to reduce your spending by ten percent and give these savings to the poor.

Leviticus 25:35 tells us when someone is reduced to poverty, we have an obligation to help. In Ruth 2:2-23, Boaz cares for Ruth, a widow and a foreigner, giving her far more than the law requires. Tobit 4:5-11 tells us to give from what we have received and do not turn away from the poor. In Proverbs 31:8-9 we hear, you must open your mouth to speak on behalf of those in need. And in Isaiah 1:16-17 we are called to seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow. In Matthew 25: 31-46 we are reminded that just as you did it to the least of these, you did it to me. In James 2:14-18 we hear that faith without works is dead.

Pope Francis, On Care for Our Common Home [Laudato Si'], no. 157 states that society as a whole, and the state in particular, are obliged to defend and promote the common good.

At Our Lady of Mercy we participate in caring for one another through the work of those involved in a variety of ministries such as Loving Hands, St. Vincent de Paul Society, PADS, the teen Mission Trip, and many collections such as the missions around the world, CCHD (the Catholic Campaign for Human Development), CRS (Catholic Relief Services), etc.

We are encouraged to advocate, as well, for those who are hungry, homeless, without a voice, for their rights to human live in fullest capacity - to bring about the structural changes needed to achieve this. With rights come responsibilities.
