I thank their parents, catechists, and all who helped prepare them for this special day. As they receive Eucharist for the first time, it is always a good time for us who have been receiving communion for a long time to renew our wonder and gratitude to Jesus for nourishing our spiritual life and helping keep us close to Him. GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I'm an expressive one when it comes to sharing my opinions: I absolutely LOVE these new shoes! I LOVE, LOVE, LOVE this lemon meringue pie! All good. My friends and family are mildly pleased that I am content with my wardrobe and my diet. But in today's Gospel, Jesus gives us the great commandment, combining the two commandments - to love God and to love neighbor - into one: "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." But what does it really mean to *love*? Saint Paul says it is to be patient, kind, and to rejoice with the truth; it is not being jealous, pompous, rude, or quick-tempered. (1 Cor 13: 4-6) Saint Thomas Aquinas says that "to love is to will the good of another." The love we show is the very essence of what it means to be Christian. "*This* (italics added) is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In today's reading from Acts, Paul, and Barnabas return from their travels to various Christian communities. They have shared the Good News, making disciples in each place and building up the Church. Yet when they return, they do not gloat or boast of their accomplishments. Rather, they "reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles." Sometimes in our strivings - to be better friends or parents, better Christians, better at sharing our faith - we can become discouraged when we fall short. Paul, arguably the best evangelist ever, reminds us that God works through us, not the other way around. We are to persevere, placing our trust in God. Through him we are able to love as he does, and help others come to know that same love.

ACTIONS Spring is upon us! Plant something and watch it grow. Just as the sun and water nurture a garden, God nurtures and helps us grow through the Holy Spirit and the people around us. How can we in turn share that love with others?

Kindergarten and Teaching the Faith

Kindergarten for many of our children is their very first experience in an educational setting. This important foundational year sets the stage for a lifetime love of learning. It is a time of great social, physical, emotional and intellectual growth.

While students enter kindergarten at differing levels of ability, they all finish the school year as readers, writers, and mathematicians, developing early literacy and critical thinking skills along the way. There is a lot of truth in Robert Fulghum's best selling book *All I Really Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten*.

Students at All Saints have had the great opportunity and good fortune to have enjoyed two consecutive years of 5 day a week, full day, in person instruction in a safe and nurturing environment. At ASCA, the bar is set high for all of our students.

Most importantly in a Catholic school, everyone works together and grows together, united by a common mission to form young people in faith and knowledge for success in this life and the next. Catholic educators are more than simply teachers; they are servant leaders and catechists who echo



and pass on the faith. When Pope Benedict XVI visited the United States in April 2008, he gave an address to educators at the Catholic University of America, explaining this distinction:

“Education is integral to the mission of the Church to proclaim the good news. First and foremost, every Catholic institution is a place to encounter the living God, who in Jesus Christ, reveals his transforming love and truth” (Meeting with Catholic Educators, April 17, 2008, Washington, D.C., par. 2).

It is essential that our students, and especially our youngest children in preschool and kindergarten, develop a relationship with Jesus and recognize His presence in their lives. A Catholic education helps form the next generation in faith. Today's world is secular; it doesn't like to hear or mention the name of Jesus. In contrast, the

Catholic school is an environment where faith is alive, visible, proclaimed, and honored.

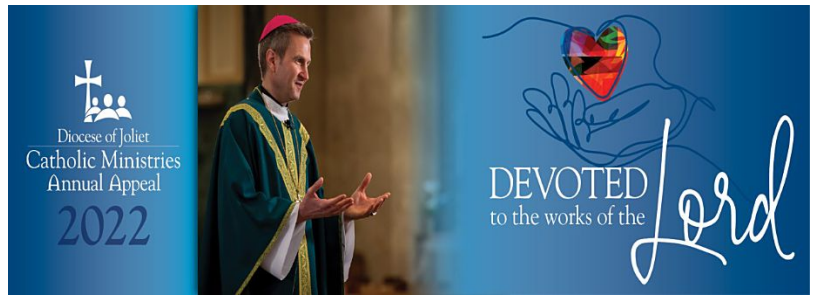
Important Notice

Several steps you can take if you think you have received a scam email.

Double-check the sender's email address. A spoofed email address often has an extension similar to the legitimate email address. You can outsmart them by looking beyond the name and checking the "from" email address to see if it matches what you know the alleged sender's email to be.

Always verify in person/telephone before sending money or sensitive data. Be suspicious! Make it standard operating procedure to confirm email requests for wire transfer, debit cards, account information or confidential information.
