News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)

When Pope St. John Paul II was asked why he became a priest he responded, "I must begin by saying that it is impossible to explain entirely. For it remains a mystery, even to myself. How does one explain the ways of God!" These words, of course, ring true to my own priestly vocation. I am sometimes confounded when I realize the beautiful vocation I have been called too. This reflection continues to come back to me as I begin at Our Lady of Mercy as your next pastor. Even though every person's vocation is a mystery, I always find a glimpse of understanding within my own vocation through our Sunday readings.

In our Gospel, we see Jesus appointing 72 others to go out saying, "At the time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent..." Luke 10:1. Jesus calls and he sends! In my own vocation, the Lord never stopped calling me to Him. However, as easy as it is to ignore a call on a cell phone, so was my initial response to the Lord. In spite of myself, the Lord continued to draw me to himself and I simply responded to his call in college. This led me to missionary work after college. Initially, there was a fear in being sent and the unknown, but with that leap of faith, I discovered a great peace and joy walking with the Lord. Which leads me to one last point referenced in our second reading from St. Paul, "May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Gal 6:14).

The Lord brought clarity to my vocation in the way of the Cross. When I was in college I was diagnosed with an autoimmune disease, which I continue to live with through the help of doctors and medicine. When I was in my mid 20s I was diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma, a type of cancer, and did 12 rounds of chemo therapy treatment. I am grateful to be in remission for 16 years now. These moments, crosses and trials, allowed me to walk and trust the Lord all the more! And as hard as it is to believe, I found great peace in these trials. If it weren't for these crosses, I don't believe I would have discovered the great joy of being a priest for the Lord and for you!

It still amazes me in the way the Lord has worked in my life and in my priesthood. And in the words of Pope St. JP II, "it remains a (beautiful) mystery." My hope for the parish and for myself is that we find joy and peace in the Lord's calling and sending, even in the midst of the cross.

News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)

Cuando le preguntaron al Papa San Juan Pablo II por qué se hizo sacerdote, el respondió: “Empezaré diciendo que es imposible explicarlo por completo, porque sigue siendo un misterio, incluso para mí mismo. ¡Cómo uno explica los planes de Dios!” Por supuesto, estas palabras son reales con mi propia vocación sacerdotal, y a veces me sorprende cuando me doy cuenta de la hermosa vocación a la que también he sido llamado. Esta reflexión la continúo recordando ahora que empiezo en Our Lady of Mercy como su nuevo párroco. Aunque el misterio de la vocación de cada persona es un misterio, encontré un poco de entendimiento dentro de mi propia vocación a través de nuestras lecturas dominicales.

En nuestro Evangelio, vemos a Jesús designando a otros 72 para salir diciendo: “Después de esto, el Señor designó a otros setenta y dos a quienes envió...” Lucas 10:1. ¡Jesús llama y envía! En mi propia vocación, el Señor nunca dejó de llamarme hacia Él. Sin embargo, mi respuesta inicial al Señor fue tan fácil como ignorar una llamada en un teléfono celular. A pesar de mí respuestas, el Señor continuó llamándome hacia Él, y simplemente respondí a su llamado cuando estaba en la universidad. Esto me llevó a una obra de misiones después de la universidad. Inicialmente, yo sentí miedo de ser enviado y de lo desconocido, pero con ese acto de fe descubrí una gran paz y alegría en los caminos con el Señor. Lo que me lleva a un último punto al que se hace referencia en nuestra segunda lectura de San Pablo: “Pero lejos esté de mí gloriarme, sino en la cruz de nuestro Señor Jesucristo” (Gálatas 6:14).

El Señor mostró mi vocación en el camino de la Cruz. Cuando estaba en la universidad me diagnosticaron una enfermedad autoinmune, con la que sigo viviendo gracias a la ayuda de los médicos y la medicina. Cuando tenía veintitantos años, me diagnosticaron con Linfoma de Hodgkin, un tipo de cáncer, e hice 12 sesiones de quimioterapia. Estoy agradecido de estar en remisión por 16 años. ¡Estos momentos, cruces y pruebas, me permitieron caminar y confiar aún más en el Señor! Y aunque es difícil de creer, encontré una gran paz en estas pruebas. ¡Si no fuera por estas cruces, no creo que hubiera descubierto la gran alegría de ser sacerdote para el Señor y para ustedes!

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

So what comes to mind when you imagine your dream road trip? A well-planned route with scenic stops, nice hotels, good restaurants and quirky sights along the way? Jesus may be my copilot, but given his words in today's Gospel I'm not sure I'd want him to be my travel agent! As he sends the 72 ahead of him, he gives them no illusions about the mission that lies ahead: "Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals." Settle for the first house that welcomes you, regardless of the amenities. Eat and drink whatever they offer. Give those you encounter a greeting of peace and remind them the kingdom of God is at hand. As always, Jesus gives these travelers all they will need to share the Good News with others. They return rejoicing! The early disciples refute my "travel agent" doubts, as they show us by example to place our trust in God and take nothing for the journey except our faith and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. In doing so, we can rest assured that our "names are written in heaven."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I'm a planner. When we went to Disney World, my sons split off from me after I unveiled an app that would show us exactly which ride or attraction to hit based on crowd numbers, time of day and other variables. I loved that app! So had I been one of the 72 we read about today appointed by Jesus to spread the Gospel in pairs, hopefully my companion would not have abandoned me because of my insistence on planning. Ultimately, our journey of faith - as we share it with others and walk toward the kingdom ourselves - is not something we can choreograph. The more we plan and the more baggage we carry, the less likely we are to hear God's voice cutting through the noise. By stripping away the nonessentials, we can place our trust in the Lord, who will show us the right path. When we place our lives in the service of the Lord, the harvest will be abundant.

PRAY Many U.S. dioceses will be welcoming newly ordained priests this month. Pray for them as they begin their ministry, and pray for more vocations.

Practice Sun Safety

As we spend more time outdoors to enjoy warm weather activities, remember to practice sun safety. Skin

cancer is the most common cancer in the U.S. UV exposure is the most preventable risk factor for skin cancer.

One in five Americans will develop skin cancer. The American Academy of Dermatology Association recommends the following ways to protect your skin from the sun's harmful rays and reduce the risk of skin cancer. *Seek shade.* Remember that the sun's rays are the strongest between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. *Wear sun-protective clothing.* When possible, wear a lightweight and long-sleeved shirt and pants, a wide-brimmed hat and sunglasses with UV protection. *Apply sunscreen.* It is recommended to apply a broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher to all skin not covered by clothing.

When detected early, skin cancer is highly treatable. Perform regular skin self-exams using the ABCDEs of melanoma. It is important to contact a board-certified dermatologist if you notice any new spots on your skin or spots that are changing, itching or bleeding.

Melanoma is the most dangerous form of skin cancer. If it is "in situ", the cancer is confined to the top layer of skin and is highly curable. If it is "malignant", the cancer can spread to other parts of the body. Early detection and treatment will assist in an increased survival. Make your day in the sun safe and fun!
