News from P.I.T (Pastor in Training)



The movie might be a bit dated, but the quote continues to pierce my heart. The movie is Gravity with the protagonist played by Sandra Bullock trying to get back to earth after being stranded in space. Towards the end of the movie, as Sandra enters into Russian spaceship with an icon picture of St. Christopher and the Child Jesus on his shoulder, Sandra's character comes to a vulnerable moment; "Will you

say a prayer for me? Or is it too late...ah, I mean I'd say one for myself but I've never prayed in my life. Nobody ever taught me how...nobody ever taught me how."

My heart aches because of multiple reasons. First, I know this is not only true for the character in the movie, but represents many people today. As a spiritual father and priest, my heart aches for those who desire to come to the Lord, but don't know how. This is why the mission of the Church is so important, people are aching to know the Lord, they just need someone to offer a guiding hand!

The second reason why this quote hits my heart is because it's something I have felt personally. I know where I am with my relationship with God. I also know where I want to be with God, and the two do not align. What brings some peace to those moments is today's Gospel. The early disciples of Christ had that same longing when they asked, "Lord, teach us to pray." Christ's response should not be easily brushed over. It is at this point Jesus teaches them (and us) the beautiful prayer, the Our Father.

There is a tremendous depth to such a simple prayer and I know I can't do it justice in a short P.I.T article. So I would like to encourage/suggest you to look at the Catechism of the Catholic Church. If you don't have this book, you can access it free online. The last section of the Catechism is dedicated to prayer and within that section it ends breaking down the Our Father line by line specifically CCC 2759-2865.

So, if you happen to know someone wanting to learn how to pray, or you have a longing in your own heart for a greater relationship with God, I suggest praying the Our Father.

La película puede ser un poco antigua, pero la cita continúa atravesándome el corazón. La película es Gravity con la protagonista interpretada por Sandra Bullock que intenta volver a la tierra después de quedarse varada en el espacio. Hacia el final de la película, cuando Sandra ingresa a la nave espacial rusa con una imagen icónica de San Cristóbal y el Niño Jesús en su hombro, el personaje de Sandra llega a un momento

vulnerable; "¿Quieres orar por mí? ¿O es demasiado tarde? Quiero decir, lo haría yo misma, pero nunca antes he orado en mi vida. Nunca nadie me enseñó cómo orar... nunca nadie me enseñó cómo orar".

Me duele el corazón por múltiples razones. Primero, sé que esto no solo es cierto para el personaje de la película, sino que representa a muchas personas en la actualidad. Como padre espiritual y sacerdote, me duele el corazón por aquellos que desean venir al Señor, pero no saben cómo. Es por eso que la misión de la Iglesia es tan importante, la gente está ansiosa por conocer al Señor, isolo necesitan que alguien les ofrezca una mano que los guíe!

La segunda razón por la que esta cita me llega al corazón es porque es algo que he sentido personalmente. Sé dónde estoy en mi relación con Dios. También sé dónde quiero estar con Dios, y las dos no se alinean. Lo que trae algo de paz a esos momentos es el Evangelio de hoy. Los primeros discípulos de Cristo tenían ese mismo anhelo cuando pidieron: "Señor, enséñanos a orar". La respuesta de Cristo no debe pasarse por alto fácilmente. Es en este punto que Jesús les enseña (y a nosotros) la hermosa oración, el Padre Nuestro.

Hay una tremenda profundidad en una oración tan simple y sé que no puedo hacer lo mejor en un breve artículo de P.I.T. La última sección del Catecismo está dedicada a la oración y dentro de esa sección termina desglosando el Padre Nuestro línea por línea específicamente CCC 2759-2865.

Entonces, si conocen a alguien que quiere aprender a orar, o tienen un anhelo en su propio corazón por una mayor relación con Dios, les sugiero que recen el Padre Nuestro.

I miss my friend, Carol, a second mother to many of us navigating young adulthood in one of my adopted hometowns. Carol offered wisdom and perspective – and binders full of recipes for any occasion. So, even after moving away, I knew that I could "Dial A Cook" at a moment's notice and Carol would drop everything and patiently dictate a recipe. Today's Gospel fills me with gratitude for Carol, who through her love and generosity hints at God's love and generosity toward us. Carol is with God now, so I still talk to her from time to time. Today's Gospel reminds us that, likewise, we can bring anything to our loving God in prayer, and the Father will listen and respond. We may think we can power through our days, and our lives, on our own, but Jesus reminds us to persist in prayer: "And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Remember the time before smartphones? When you needed a cup of flour or an egg, that meant knocking on a neighbor's door. Now we most often text ahead, making the request a bit less awkward. Well, despite the proliferation of Catholic and spiritual apps, praying still requires "putting ourselves out there" before God. While God knows all and sees all, it us up to us to bring our deepest needs and desires to him. Our smartphones can help us here: We can set a reminder to pray each morning and each evening. We can model our persistence in prayer to our children and others by praying with and for them, especially at times when they are struggling with something or facing a difficult choice or situation. If an earthly Mother or Father knows how to give good gifts to their children, after all, "how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

PRAY Recite the Lord's Prayer, understanding that God knows our needs and will give us each our daily bread.

Prayer for World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

In 2021, Pope Francis started a church-wide celebration of grandparents and the elderly to be held on the fourth Sunday of July, close to the feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of

Jesus. Pope Francis said that the elderly "remind us that old age is a gift and that grandparents are the link between the different generations to pass on to the young the experience of life." The theme for 2022 is "In Old Age They Will Still Bear Fruit" (Psalm 92:15).

The Catholic Grandparents Association has the mission of promoting greater recognition of grandparents and the elderly for their role and vocation in passing on their faith to the next generation.

The message is to hopefully reassure grandparents and the elderly that they are loved and that they are needed to pass on the faith and keep prayer at the heart of family life.

Healthy Grilling and Barbecuing Tips

Healthier choices of protein are fish, skinless chicken breast and lean ground poultry. When choosing pork, get "loin" or "round" cuts and "choice" or "select" grades of beef instead of "prime". A healthy portion of protein is about three ounces or the size of a deck of cards. Use less salt when seasoning your protein or vegetables be marinating or rubbing spices on them. Never reuse marinate or rub after raw meat has touched it. Make sure you use a thermometer to check the proper temperature at which to eat the protein safely.

During the summer there are a

variety of fruits and vegetables available. Choose a variety of colors for the best health benefits – in fact, choose a rainbow of colors. Summer favorites include asparagus, avocado, bell peppers, corn, eggplant, onions, potatoes, squash, zucchini and mushrooms.

Grill fruits for desserts. The natural sugars caramelize in the high heat, giving them extra sweetness and flavor. Some favorites are sliced apple, pear or pineapple or halved bananas, nectarines, peaches or plums.

Choose healthier side dishes such as a colorful bean salad, fruit salad or leafy green salad.

Be sure to scrub down the rack or grill pan after each use to prevent burning, smoking and bitter flavors the next time you grill. These tips are recommended by the American Heart Association for a healthier heart and a healthier life!




