

News from P.I.T (Pastor in Training)



Congratulations to our two newest permanent deacons, Deacon 'Bugsy' Sindac and Deacon Doug McIlvaine, who were ordained yesterday at the Cathedral of the Diocese of Joliet! You've seen them up in the sanctuary as Eucharistic ministers, lectors, and visitors to the homebound, but now they'll have their own chair in the sanctuary, proclaim the Gospel, perform baptisms, witness marriages, offer blessings, and even preach! Like

for priests and bishops, the sacrament of holy orders is not just a position, or even an occupation, but a vocation—a calling. It's a call to *diakoneō*, the Greek word for service.

Sacraments, simply put, are visible signs of invisible realities, instituted by Christ, which give grace. While all of us are meant to be visible signs of Jesus in the world (we're part of the Mystical Body of Christ after all!), and while all of us are called to some form of service, when it comes to deacons, they're consecrated as sacramental signs of Christ the servant. They're called from within the parish community to serve at the altar, at the parish, and at the margins of society in a uniquely sacramental way. Whether it's at Mass, in our many ministries, or at Hesed House, their configuration to Jesus in the sacrament of holy orders gives them a special authority to act on behalf of both Jesus and His Church in various ways.

Of course, the only reason why bishops, priests, and deacons have any 'special authority' at all is because Our Lord Himself chose to share His authority with His Church in a sacramental way. He mirrored the structure of His new covenant after that of the old: with twelve apostles mirroring the twelve sons of Israel; and with bishops, priests, and deacons mirroring the three-fold hierarchy of the Temple: high priest, priests, and Levites. These structures are like the structures of the human body with each part relying on the other in for its own unique contribution. (cf. 1 Cor 12) So, just as the old covenant Temple system was meant to be a bridge between God and man, we look forward to the ways in which these men will be a bridge for our parish community to the God who "came not to be served but to serve"! (Matt 20:28) May God bless Deacon Bugsy and Deacon Doug!



Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



¡Felicitaciones a nuestros dos nuevos diáconos permanentes, el Diácono 'Bugsy' Sindac y el Diácono Doug McIlvaine, quienes fueron ordenados ayer en la Catedral de la Diócesis de Joliet! Los han visto en el santuario como ministros Eucarísticos, lectores y visitantes de los confinados, pero ahora tendrán su propio puesto en el santuario, proclamarán el Evangelio, realizarán bautismos, presenciarán matrimonios, ofrecerán bendiciones e incluso predicarán! Al igual que para los sacerdotes y

los obispos, el sacramento del orden sagrado no es solo una posición, ni siquiera una ocupación, sino una vocación, un llamado. Es un llamado al diakoneō, la palabra Griega para servicio.

Los sacramentos, en pocas palabras, son signos visibles de realidades invisibles, instituidas por Cristo, que dan la gracia. Si bien todos nosotros estamos destinados a ser signos visibles de Jesús en el mundo (idespués de todo, somos parte del Cuerpo Místico de Cristo!), y aunque todos estamos llamados a algún tipo de servicio, cuando se trata de los diáconos, ellos están consagrados como signos sacramentales de Cristo el servidor. Son llamados desde dentro de la comunidad parroquial para servir en el altar, en la parroquia y en los márgenes de la sociedad de una manera sacramental única. Ya sea en la Misa, en nuestros muchos ministerios o en la Casa Hesed, su configuración con Jesús en el sacramento del orden sagrado les da una autoridad especial para actuar de varias maneras en nombre de Jesús y Su Iglesia.

Por supuesto, la única razón por la cual los obispos, sacerdotes y diáconos tienen alguna "autoridad especial" es porque Nuestro Señor Mismo eligió compartir Su autoridad con Su Iglesia de manera sacramental. El reflejó la estructura de Su nuevo pacto después del antiguo: con doce apóstoles reflejando a los doce hijos de Israel; y con obispos, sacerdotes y diáconos reflejando la triple jerarquía del Templo: sumo sacerdote, sacerdotes y Levitas. Estas estructuras son como las estructuras del cuerpo humano en el que cada parte depende de la otra para su propia contribución única (cf. 1 Cor 12). Entonces, así como el sistema del Templo del antiguo pacto estaba destinado a ser un puente entre Dios y el hombre, esperamos las formas en que estos hombres serán un puente para nuestra comunidad parroquial hacia el Dios que "no ha venido a ser servido sino a servir"! (Mateo 20:28). ¡Que Dios bendiga al Diácono Bugsy y al Diácono Doug!



Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

Is 66:18-21 | Heb 12:5-7, 11-13 | Lk 13:22-30

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

We all have things that come easily to us and things that seem hard. I can bake a delicious pie, but I cannot flip a fried egg. I can resurrect your dead iPhone, but I can't keep a houseplant alive. The list goes on for each of us. Fortunately, neither our natural talents nor foibles will get us into or keep us out of heaven. "Strive to enter through the narrow gate," Jesus tells us. When I first read that passage, I said to myself, "What's the narrow gate?" But I think the key word here might be strive, a verb meaning "to devote serious effort or energy." Getting to heaven, then, requires more than knowing who Jesus is or even going to Mass each week. It takes energy, effort, and persistence. It means establishing a relationship with Jesus - through prayer and following his commandment to love one another - such that he will "know where [we] are from" when we knock on the door. In doing so, we can hope to be among the people who recline at the table of the Lord in the kingdom of God.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

When Jesus was asked how many people will be saved and spoke of the narrow gate, he went on to say, "Many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." Where do we find the strength we will need to pass through this gate that will lead to eternal life? By following Christ with all our being and not taking the easier, mainstream path when it conflicts with our Christian values. By recognizing that our salvation is a gift from our Savior, who willingly took on our human form and died for us. By understanding that Christ's sacrifice on the cross requires a response from us. God invites; we must respond. Jesus is our strength, and he is the only way to get through that narrow gate. Let us strive to do so, and in turn help the others whom God has put in our lives, accompanying them on this journey.

PRAY Make a list of the people in your life who have helped you grow closer to Jesus. Say a prayer of thanksgiving for each of them.

Healing Hearts Ministry

All of us have experienced joys and sorrows, ups and downs, accomplishments and disappointments in our lives. There may have been times that resulted in brokenness or heavy hearts that have affected our attitude and way of living. The Open HEARTS Ministry has changed its name to the Healing Hearts Ministry as it is a ministry for anyone 18 years of age or older who would like to practice self-care for their own health and wellness and would also like to reach out to others to offer healing and hope.

The ministry is also a source of support, resources, education and advocacy for mental health concerns in the parish and community. As we gather to learn and participate in an activity that promotes healing and assists with stress management – we will be in a safe, sacred space to share stories and pray together.

The next gathering is on Monday, August 22 from 7:00 to 8:30pm in Room 218 in the Parish Life Center. We will create a journal and learn the basics of journaling to use as a prayer journal, gratitude journal, blessings journal or scripture journal. 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline

If you or someone you know is struggling or in crisis, help is available by calling or texting 988 or chat 988lifeline.org. When someone is experiencing a medical emergency, 911 is called for immediate medical evaluation and treatment. 988 offers 24/7 access to trained crisis counselors who can help people experiencing mental health-related distress such as thoughts of suicide, mental health or substance use crisis or any other kind of emotional distress.

Congress designated the new 988 dialing code in 2020 to be operated through the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. The Lifeline number transitioned to the 3-digit num-

ber in July 2022. Federal resources have been invested in crisis centers in support of 988 to address the mental health crisis in America. In 2020, there was one death by suicide about every eleven minutes in the U.S. For people aged 10-34 years, suicide is the leading cause of death. From April 2020 to 2021, over 100,000 individuals died from drug overdoses.

No matter where someone lives in the U.S., a trained crisis counselor is available in English and Spanish at the 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline. The Lifeline uses Language Line Solutions to provide translation services in over 250 languages.


