News from P.I.T (Pastor in Training)



My dad's first cousin is a priest for the Diocese of Des Moines. My dad's step-brother was a Jesuit priest and professor at Creighton University. My great-aunt was a Blessed Virgin Mary (BVM) sister and taught in Chicagoland area. My mom's first cousin is a Franciscan priest in the Holy Land and was the former pastor at the Church of Nativity and the Church of Annunciation in Nazareth. If you ask my mom, she could list even more distant cousins with religious

vocations. Needless to say, religious vocations have been present in my family. However, it might surprise you to know that while growing up, the idea of priesthood never entered my mind!

Now that I am older and I can reflect back, I can see signs of the invitation, but at the time I was completely absent-minded to the Lord's call. You could say I grew up in the Lord's house, the Church; by going to Mass on weekends and Holy Day of Obligations, but I was unaware of the Lord's plan for me.

Whenever I hear the story of the Prodigal Son, I see a similar a struggle; both sons fail to see the invitation of the father. The first son wanted to find his identity away from his father, while the oldest son thought he only need to live under his father's roof. But the father was offering something more than just shelter, food, and work to both of them. He was offering his very self, his very heart.

I believe we as Catholics continue to miss out on the invitation given to us by Our Father in heaven through his Son. We are personally aware that many have left the faith like the younger son, but how many of us in the pews, or should I say those in the presider's chair, fail to realize the invitation to the Father's heart through the gift of his Son?

Some may think that it would be the job of the pastor/priest and our ministries is to get people into the Church. But that would miss the point of the Gospel and the lesson that needs to be learned by the older son in the parable. The goal of the priest and our ministries at OLM is to make people aware of the beautiful invitation before them. The invitation to God's heart! I'm truly grateful for all the ministries at our parish that invites each and everyone of us to enter more deeply into the Father's heart.

El primo hermano de mi papá es sacerdote de la Diócesis de Des Moines. El hermanastro de mi papá era un sacerdote Jesuita y profesor en la Universidad de Creighton. Mi tía abuela era una hermana de la Santísima Virgen María (BVM) y enseñaba en el área de Chicago. El primo hermano de mi mamá es un sacerdote franciscano en la Tierra Santa y fue párroco de la Iglesia de la Natividad y la Iglesia de la Anunciación en Nazaret. Si le preguntas a mi mamá,

podría enumerar primos aún más lejanos con vocaciones religiosas. Ni que decir, las vocaciones religiosas han estado presentes en mi familia. Sin embargo, puede que te sorprenda saber que mientras crecía, ila idea del sacerdocio nunca pasó por mi mente!

Ahora que soy mayor y puedo reflexionar, puedo ver señales de la invitación, pero en ese momento estaba completamente despistado del llamado del Señor. Se podría decir que crecí en la casa del Señor, la Iglesia; yendo a Misa los fines de semana y los Días de Obligación, pero desconocía el plan que el Señor tenía para mí.

Cada vez que escucho la historia del Hijo Pródigo, veo una lucha similar; ambos hijos no ven la invitación del padre. El primer hijo quería encontrar su identidad lejos de su padre, mientras que el hijo mayor pensó que solo necesitaba vivir bajo el techo de su padre. Pero el padre les estaba ofreciendo a ambos algo más que techo, comida y trabajo. Se estaba ofreciendo a sí mismo, su mismo corazón.

Creo que nosotros como Católicos seguimos perdiendo la invitación que nos hizo Nuestro Padre en el cielo a través de su Hijo. Somos conscientes personalmente de que muchos han dejado la fe como el hijo menor, pero ¿cuántos de nosotros en los bancos, o debería decir los que están en la silla del que preside, no somos conscientes de la invitación al corazón del Padre a través del regalo de su Hijo?

Algunos pueden pensar que el trabajo del pastor/sacerdote y de nuestros ministerios sería atraer gente a la Iglesia. Pero eso perdería el punto del Evangelio y la lección que necesita ser aprendida por el hijo mayor en la parábola. El objetivo del sacerdote y de nuestros ministerios en OLM es hacer que las personas tomen conciencia de la hermosa invitación que se les presenta. ¡La invitación al corazón de Dios! Estoy verdaderamente agradecido por todos los ministerios en nuestra parroquia que invitan a todos y cada uno de nosotros a entrar más profundamente en el corazón del Padre.

I think I lose more things than the average person. Car keys. That magic security card that gets me into my office. My son's birth certificate (the night before the driver's test). And my wedding ring, more often than I care to admit. I can't rest until I find them. Oh, the elation when the missing item turns up! So this is one parable I think I "get." Of course, these items pale in comparison to our value as human beings – sons and daughters of God. Even – or perhaps especially – us sinners. As Jesus tells us, "There will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents." What good news for all of us! Rather than wallow in our failures or close ourselves off to God, we are challenged to follow Paul's example and turn to God for our strength – we can turn to him knowing we are loved, valued, and cherished.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I confess I sometimes feel unworthy to become very active in my parish. I've made more mistakes than I can count; so, no, I'll pass on volunteering to be a lector or a catechist. That's a job for the "good Catholics." As we see time and again in Scripture, ours is a Church of sinners. As was the case with Paul, "once a blasphemer and a persecutor and arrogant," the Lord has mercy upon us, and his grace is abundant. Just as he considered Paul trustworthy to lead the Church, he trusts us; we need only trust ourselves. Gaining our strength from God, we can share our gifts through ministry and service. September is National Food Safety Education Month


According to the CDC, it is estimated that every year one in six Americans or 48 million people get sick from eating contaminated food. Foodborne illness is caused by organisms that we cannot see, smell or taste. Even though the U.S. food supply is among the safest in the world, we need to be aware of foodborne illness. The most common foodborne pathogens known to cause the most number of illnesses as recognized by the CDC are *Salmonella*, *Campylobacter*, *E. coli* and Norovirus.


One important way to reduce the risk of foodborne illness is: Don't wash your chicken. By washing or rinsing raw chicken harmful bacteria can be spread around the kitchen. The harmful bacteria is not removed by rinsing or washing – anything that is in the chicken will get cooked off. Use a clean paper towel to remove anything you see on raw chicken and throw away the towel. Raw chicken and juices should touch as few things as possible. Clean surfaces with hot, soapy water.

There are Core Four Practices to reduce the risk of foodborne illness. Practice One: Clean. Wash hands and surfaces often. Practice Two: Separate. Don't crosscontaminate as that is how bacteria is spread. Separate raw meat, poultry, seafood and eggs from other foods. Use one cutting board for fresh produce and a separate one for raw meat, poultry, and seafood. Practice Three: Cook. Cook food to the internal temperature recommended to kill harmful bacteria that causes foodborne illness. Cook roasts, steak, and fish to a minimum of 145 degrees Fahrenheit. All poultry should be cooked to 165 degrees. Practice Four: Chill. Refrigerate foods at 40 degrees Fahrenheit. Never let raw meat, poultry, eggs, cooked food or cut fresh fruits or vegetables sit at room temperature more than two hours before putting them in the refrigerator or freezer (one hour when the temperature is above 90 degrees Fahrenheit). 




Join us for donuts and coffee, and stay a while for great fellowship after the 8am and 10am masses on Sunday October 9, in the PLC Gym
