We are in the midst of a highly televised sporting season, from the World Series of Baseball to College and Professional Football.

It is funny to think of the conversations I have with those who love sports as much as I do; the conversation usually revolves around a simple question, "Did you <u>see</u> that game?" As human beings, there is always a longing to see. Not only in the things of this world like sports, but more importantly, we long to see in our faith.

In our Gospel this weekend, Zacchaeus longed to see the Lord by climbing a tree. Zacchaeus was a powerful, wealthy man. He could have used his stature and authority to push his way to the front. However, Zacchaeus instead chose to climb a tree, and this show of humility and poverty of spirit moved our Lord to respond, "Tonight I must stay at your house!" In seeing the Lord, Zacchaeus found Jesus entering his heart and home!

With this in mind, I would like to share in humility a desire I have for Our Lady of Mercy. Just as Jesus blessed and changed Zacchaeus' life forever, I would like to have more opportunities for that same encounter for our parishioners. I would like to have a beautiful, dedicated Adoration Chapel at our parish under the patronage of Divine Mercy.

There are many reasons for this, but allow me to share just a few. You may already be aware that the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) recently called for a Eucharistic Revival in our country. More adoration would follow this call while also spiritually supporting our many beautiful ministries and families. What is more, this would fulfill the original building plans for our Church! If you enjoyed our week of adoration earlier in October, then you'll be happy to hear that I have already taken steps in making this desire a reality by seeking approval from the bishop, staff, volunteers and some parishioners.

I would like to humbly ask for your support. As things develop, from design, to contracting, cost, and God-willing construction, I'll be keeping you informed every step of the way. As seen in the example of Zacchaeus, I believe that allowing more parishioners to see the Lord in adoration will bear tremendous fruit for our parish. May our desire to see the Lord be fulfilled in this effort, so that we might receive the Lord ever more deeply into our hearts and homes.



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

When will wisdom kick in? Even so many years later, I still struggle with some of the same questions that kept me up at night when I was 21. Fortunately, God is patient with late bloomers. The Book of Wisdom reassures us that, first, God loves us, no matter where we are on the continuum of "having it all together." Second, the Lord won't judge us on our worst days, but wants us to grow in wisdom and holiness. The Wisdom writer knows it's not an overnight process; it is often marked by one step forward, two steps back: "You rebuke offenders little by little, warn them and remind them of the sins they are committing, that they may abandon their wickedness and believe in you, O Lord!" Like Zacchaeus in today's Gospel, if we seek out Jesus and ask for his help, he will show us the way. Thanks be to a God who comes "to seek and to save what was lost."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

At Mass recently, the priest encouraged parishioners to turn to the person next to them and ask them for whom they would like us to pray. I've been at Masses where we introduce ourselves, but this "Hi, how are you, please pray for X" was new to me. As Mass continued, I prayed for Matt, the son of the woman in front of me. She prayed for my friend Jim, whose sore knee had sidelined him during his walk along the Camino de Santiago. How encouraging it must have been for the early Christians to know that St. Paul held them in prayer, "that our God may make you worthy of his calling and powerfully bring to fulfillment every good purpose and every effort of faith." Just as Jesus seeks us out, we, in turn, can accompany others who may be lost or hurting or who just happen to be in the next pew. Through our prayers, we can build up one another, our parish, and the wider Church.

PRAY When a friend shares a struggle or challenge, don't be shy about offering your prayers. Make a list of people to pray for and set it by your bedside so you don't forget.

October Health and Safety Tip

October is National Fire Prevention Month. It is an opportunity to take steps to prevent fires especially during the winter months when there is an increase in home fires. It is important to keep our homes warm during the cold weather but just as important to be aware of ways to prevent fires in the home.

The National Fire Prevention Association offers the following suggestions. Make sure the heating source in the home is well maintained. Check the heating source and its equipment before using or have them serviced. Do not store items near a heating source such as boxes, clothes and other fuels. Make sure that combustible items such as draperies and furniture are far from the heating source.

Never leave a burning candle unattended. Do not leave burners or grills unattended. Keep items away from heating elements and open flames. Make sure that smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors are working. Place a fire detector every level of the home and test them monthly. Replace batteries annually. Read about other safety tips from the National Safety Council and the National Fire Protection Association.

The bride, groom or either set of parents must be registered members of the parish for at least six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Weddings may be scheduled no less than six months out in order to fulfill the diocesan marriage preparation requirements. Contact Diane Reiter, ext. 221.
