

# News from P.I.T. (Priest in Training)



Calling Mary the "Mother of God" is a simple syllogism: Mary is the Mother of Jesus. Jesus is God. Therefore, Mary is the mother of God. Logic!! Now, speaking of logic, this isn't to say that Mary is somehow temporally before God, nor that she created God. Mary was not the mother of Jesus' divine nature, but rather His human nature. God is outside of time and space (He created space -time!). Still, she wasn't just the mother of

Jesus' human nature, she was the mother of Jesus Himself—the divine *person*! Jesus' two natures were perfectly and uniquely united in His person. Hence, whatever we can truthfully say about Jesus, we can truthfully say about God.

So, for instance, we can rightly say that God suffered our death on the cross; God became incarnate; God wept at the death of his friend Lazarus; God Himself saved us; and so on. This is important not only because of what it teaches us about God's tenderness, humility, and closeness, but also because it preserves a correct understanding of the central figure of our faith: Jesus! Jesus was both *fully God* and *fully man*, and what we say about Mary helps to make this clear.

We thus have no problem focusing an entire solemnity on a specific title of Mary. Mary always helps us to understand her Son.

In case we are still unconvinced, though, just look at Elizabeth. Elizabeth, "filled with the Holy Spirit" exclaimed, "Why is this granted to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" (Luke 1:41-42) Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, Elizabeth didn't exclaim, "That my Lord should come to me!" but, "That the **mother** of my Lord!" Clearly the Holy Spirit—aka God—has no qualms about guiding His people to get excited about Mary...and not only to get excited, but also to specifically call Mary the mother of my "Kyriou", the mother of my divine Lord. It doesn't get much clearer than that, so enjoy kicking off the new year just as the Holy Spirit would want you to, by celebrating Mary the Mother of our God!



# Noticias del P.I.T. (Sacerdote en formación)



Llamar a María la "Madre de Dios" es un simple silogismo: María es la Madre de Jesús. Jesús es Dios. Por lo tanto, María es la madre de Dios. ¡¡Lógico!! Ahora, hablando de lógica, esto no quiere decir que María esté de alguna manera temporalmente ante Dios, ni que ella haya creado a Dios. María no fue la madre de la naturaleza divina de Jesús, sino su naturaleza humana. Dios está *fuera* del tiempo y del espacio (¡Él creó el espacio-tiempo!). Aún así, ella no era

solo la madre de la naturaleza humana de Jesús, ella era la madre de Jesús Mismo, ¡la *persona* divina! Las dos naturalezas de Jesús estaban perfecta y únicamente unidas en Su persona. Por lo tanto, cualquier cosa que podamos decir con verdad acerca de Jesús, podemos decir con verdad acerca de Dios.

Entonces, por ejemplo, podemos decir correctamente que Dios sufrió nuestra muerte en la cruz; Dios se encarnó; Dios lloró por la muerte de su amigo Lázaro; Dios Mismo nos salvó; etcétera. Esto es importante no solo por lo que nos enseña sobre la ternura, la humildad y la cercanía de Dios, sino también porque preserva una correcta comprensión de la figura central de nuestra fe: ¡Jesús! Jesús era completamente Dios y completamente hombre, y lo que decimos sobre María ayuda a aclarar esto.

No tenemos pues ningún problema en centrar toda una solemnidad en un título específico de María. María siempre nos ayuda a comprender a su Hijo.

Sin embargo, en caso de que aún no estemos convencidos, solo miren a Isabel. Isabel, "Ilena del Espíritu Santo" exclamó: "¿Por qué se me concede esto a mí, que la madre de mi Señor venga a mí?" (Lucas 1:41-42) Bajo la guía del Espíritu Santo, Isabel no exclamó: "¡Que mi Señor venga a mí!" sino, "¡Que la madre de mi Señor!" Claramente el Espíritu Santo—también conocido como Dios—no tiene reparos en guiar a Su pueblo a emocionarse con María... y no solo a emocionarse, sino también a llamar específicamente a María la madre de mi "Kyriou", la madre de mi divino Señor. No hay nada más claro que eso, así que disfruten de comenzar el nuevo año tal como el Espíritu Santo quiere que lo hagan, ¡celebrando a María, la Madre de nuestro Dios!



# Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God

Nm 6:22-27 | Gal 4:4-7 | Lk 2:16-21

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Today's readings remind us of the central role Mary plays in the story of Jesus and the story of our salvation. We may be tempted to place her on a pedestal – as well we should – she is the Mother of God! At the same time, today's Gospel reminds us she is not divine herself, but human – and she bore the incarnate flesh of the Son of God in his divine and human nature. She went through the sleepless nights and the uncertainties of parenting in all its stages. She learned early on what it takes many of us a lifetime to learn – often in fits and starts – absolute trust in God. As we celebrate this solemnity, we can bring our uncertainties, fears, and struggles to Mary our mother, asking for the grace to follow her faithful example.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Of course there's nothing wrong with New Year's resolutions, and I always admire people who have thought about them in advance. Me? I'm often tongue-tied on January 1 when someone asks me what my resolutions are (hmm ... maybe I should think about kicking that procrastination habit in 2023?) This is why Mary's reaction to the visit of the shepherds strikes me so profoundly. The shepherds pay homage to Jesus and spread the word that God's Son has been born. Mary, Luke writes, "kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." As we move into a new year, so rich with possibility, we might follow Mary's example and reflect before jumping headlong into this or that goal or New Year's resolution. Instead, perhaps we can take the day - or a week or a month - to prayerfully reflect on how we can best put our faith in Jesus into action. How can we witness to our faith in our daily lives? What changes might help us do that? We can ask God to help us draw up a list of ways that we can be more faithful to him.

**PRAY** Pray the Hail Mary, reflecting on each line with gratitude. If you have more time, give yourself a "mini-retreat" by reading or reflecting on a book or devotional about Mary.

### Pastoral Care

#### Happy New Year! Be at Peace!

With the beginning of 2023, take some time to reflect on the meaning of peace in your life and in the world. We are living in a time when we may ask what does it mean to be at peace? We may be fearful as to what is going on around us and not have a sense of peace. Peace may be defined as having no conflict. Peace of mind or inner peace is a state of being mentally, emotionally and spiritually at peace. It is keeping the mind at peace regardless of external circumstances.

Consider the following ways to help nurture peace within you. Take time to be quiet as it is in the silence that God speaks. Think about what you have done in the past few days to promote and practice peace. Renew what you must change in order to answer Jesus' call to be a peacemaker. Reflect on your relationships and think what you can do to improve or strengthen them. Be an active participant in your Catholic faith - grow closer in your relationship with God and serve others. Pray that peace may reign in everyone and everywhere in the world. Practice gratitude, be patient, forgive, care for others.

As Catholics, we can think about making spiritual resolutions at the beginning of the new year. A few ideas to consider are: increase your Marian devotion asking the Blessed Mother to lead you to deeper conversion or enriched faith in Jesus; set aside time to walk with God in spiritual reading such as classics written by Catholic saints such as Teresa of Avila, Francis de Sales, Therese of Lisieux or John of the Cross; practice good stewardship over the gifts that God has given you; share your Catholic faith with others through your

words, actions and attitude; go to Adoration; go to Mass an extra day during the week; pray the rosary; pick a new saint to learn about, and entrust your year to their special intercession. There is no time like the present to grow closer to the Lord.

A Christian describes true peace as coming from being in the presence of God. It is knowing that our lives are in God's hands. If we trust God – he will take care of us even through illness, suffering, pain or loss. In scripture, Jesus says, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid." (John 14:27)

Wishing you a Blessed and Happy New Year filled with the peace and joy of the Lord!




