

News from P.I.T. (Priest in Training)



I hope you've heard of the Bible in a Year with Fr. Mike Schmitz by now! It was the leading podcast for a long time and still seems to top the charts every January. There's even a Spanish version now with Fr. Sergio Serrano O.P. which is just as good! This year Ascension has also just released *The Catechism in a Year*.

Now, when you hear catechism you might think, *BORING!* And that's what I thought when I was first asked to read the catechism in seminary. How wrong I was! I found the 1992 Catechism

gifted to us by St. John Paul II's initiative and (then) Cardinal Ratzinger's theological leadership to be *an absolute masterpiece* that shines forth with the beauty and clarity of everything that Jesus' Church has taught and handed on throughout the centuries. It's a single book that can concisely and seriously answer just about every question phrased as: What does the Catholic Church teach about

I cannot recommend enough that every Catholic read/listen through the Catechism cover to cover at least once in their lifetime, especially if it's with a guide like Fr. Mike. Why? For one because we cannot love what we do not know. For two because the more we know another (like God and His Church) the better we can love and follow them. For three because knowing Church teaching backwards and forwards is both freeing and healing. Yes. As Jesus Himself says, "The truth will set you free." (Jn 8:32)

Many people nowadays tout the importance of 'following your conscience' in order to justify all sorts of things. Part of their reasoning is true because our consciences are binding. However, most people don't realize that the word *conscience* literally means "to know-with", conscientia. Who are we *knowing with*? Jesus and His Church. If we thus do not inform our consciences such that they know-with Jesus' Body, the Church, then we may just be *knowing-with* 'the world, the flesh, and the devil'. (Remember Jesus' rebuke to Peter in Matt 16:23)

We are all born with the wounds of original sin, and one of them is called the 'darkness of the intellect'. If we understand this, then we know that informing our consciences isn't just obligatory, it is *healing*! Knowing with Christ's Church heals our wounded intellects that tend to undervalue the things of heaven and over-value the things of this world. It heals our ability to see, discern, and know that which is the best choice in any given circumstance. It heals our worldview because it habituates our intellects to the full truth of things rather than misguided understandings. This will dispose us to living with deeper faith, hope, and charity.

Each time we sin, we do violence to our intellects by habituating them to making wrong judgements about which is the greater good that we could choose. This is why we're so good at self-justification, regardless of the wrongness of the act! On the other hand, when we habituate our intellects to knowing things for as they really are—like by reading the Catechism—we heal the violence previously done by our sins. This frees us to not only know what is the best choice to be made, but also to more easily choose it, difficult as it may be, because of how firmly we know it to be true! So don't wait any longer—check out *The Catechism in a Year* on all your podcasting apps!

Espero que hasta ahora hayan oído hablar de la Biblia en un Año con el Padre Mike Schmitz! Fue el podcast líder durante mucho tiempo y todavía parece encabezar las listas cada mes de enero. Incluso hay una versión en español ahora con el Padre Sergio Serrano O.P. que es igual de buena! Este año, Ascensión también acaba de publicar *El Catecismo en un Año*.

Ahora, cuando escuchas el catecismo puedes pensar, ¡ABURRIDO! Y eso es lo que pensé cuando me pidieron por primera vez que leyera el catecismo en el seminario. ¡Qué equivocado estaba! Encontré el Catecismo de

1992 que nos fue regalado por la iniciativa de San Juan Pablo II y (entonces) el liderazgo teológico del Cardenal Ratzinger como *una obra maestra absoluta* que brilla con la belleza y la claridad de todo lo que la Iglesia de Jesús ha enseñado y transmitido a lo largo de los siglos. Es un solo libro que puede responder de manera concisa y seria casi todas las preguntas formuladas como: ¿Qué enseña la Iglesia Católica sobre ?

No puedo recomendar lo suficiente que cada Católico lea/escuche el Catecismo de cabo a rabo al menos una vez en su vida, especialmente si es con una guía como el Padre Mike. ¿Por qué? 1) porque no podemos amar lo que no conocemos. 2) Porque cuanto más conocemos a otro (como Dios y Su Iglesia) podemos amarlo y seguirlo mejor. 3) Porque conociendo la enseñanza de la Iglesia al derecho y al revés es a la vez liberador y sanador. Sí. Como dice el mismo Jesús: "La verdad os hará libres". (Juan 8:32)

Mucha gente hoy en día pregona la importancia de "seguir tu conciencia" para justificar todo tipo de cosas. Parte de su razonamiento es cierto porque nuestras conciencias son vinculantes. Sin embargo, la mayoría de la gente no se da cuenta de que la palabra *conciencia* significa literalmente "saber con", conscientia. ¿Con quién estamos sabiendo? Jesús y Su Iglesia. Si no informamos a nuestras conciencias de tal manera que sepan, con el Cuerpo de Jesús, la Iglesia, entonces podemos estar simplemente sabiendo con 'el mundo, la carne y el diablo'. (Recuerden la reprensión de Jesús a Pedro en Mateo 16:23).

Todos nacemos con las heridas del pecado original, y una de ellas se llama las "tinieblas del intelecto". Si entendemos esto, entonces sabemos que el informar a nuestras conciencias no es solo obligatorio, jes sanador! El conocer con la Iglesia de Cristo sana nuestros intelectos heridos que tienden a menospreciar las cosas del cielo y sobrevalorar las cosas de este mundo. Sana nuestra capacidad de ver, discernir y saber cuál es la mejor opción en cualquier circunstancia. Sana nuestra visión del mundo porque habitúa nuestro intelecto a la verdad completa de las cosas en lugar de entendimientos erróneos. Esto nos dispondrá a vivir con una fe, una esperanza y una caridad más profundas.

Cada vez que pecamos, violentamos nuestros intelectos al habituarlos a hacer juicios erróneos sobre cuál es el mejor bien que podemos elegir. ¡Es por eso que somos tan buenos en la autojustificación, independientemente de lo incorrecto del acto! Por otro lado, cuando habituamos nuestro intelecto a conocer las cosas tal como son en realidad, como leyendo el Catecismo, sanamos la violencia que antes causaron nuestros pecados. Esto nos libera no solo para saber cuál es la mejor elección, sino también para elegirla más fácilmente, por difícil que sea, idebido a la firmeza con la que sabemos que es verdad! Así que no esperen más: jechen un vistazo a El Catecismo en un Año en todas sus aplicaciones de podcasting!

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Since the Fall, the world has been riddled with strife and divisiveness. From the disobedience in the Garden, to Cain and Abel, to conflicts and wars throughout the centuries, it's clear that we humans are prone to picking sides and fighting over them. We hear about this even within the early Church from St. Paul in today's second reading. There were rivalries, and Christians were saying things such as, "I belong to Paul" or "I belong to Cephas." But Paul wisely asks: "Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul?" Clearly not. There is only one source of Truth - Jesus Christ - and Paul never hesitated to refuse credit for himself, and to instead glorify the Lord in his word and deed. This is the model set for us - to refuse to set ourselves or God-made-in-our-ownimage over and against the Triune God who created us. Christ came to unite us with himself and to one another, in reconciliation with the Father. His words are now our words: Repent and believe in the Gospel. Pray for the grace to come together as the body of Christ so that we can be his hands and feet in the world and carry out the work he began.

In Jesus Christ the kingdom of God enters into human history, fulfilling God's promise of salvation for his people. Christ inaugurated the kingdom on earth, and as members of his Church we are responsible for continuing to build it – here and now. As Christ called his first disciples and made them "fishers of men," so he calls us, that we might go forth "proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and curing every disease and illness among the people."


