## News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



I remember when I was in the seminary, the Powerball Lottery got up to its highest pay out yet; 700+ Million dollars. Needless to say, I couldn't help but stop by a gas station and buy a ticket. All of sudden, I started doing the calculations: half to taxes, hundred million to the Diocese, Catholic Schools and the Hospital; take care of my family debts; pay for my nephew and niece's colleges... In the end, I would only keep 10 million to myself. How I came up with that number, I don't know, but needless to say, I

wanted to keep some of the winnings for myself, despite the fact that I was on my way to serving the Church and the People of God.

A similar situation occurred after becoming a priest. A rather well-off parishioner from my former parish was boasting on my behalf saying, "I bet I could offer you a million dollars and I know you would turn it down!" Little did he know of my *lack* of humility and how eager I would have been to take him up on his offer! Without hesitation, my mind went through the same process: support this and that ministry, give some gifts to my family, and in the end, buy myself a nice new car!

These experiences taught me something very simple: when the occasion presents itself, I do have a tendency to keep things for myself, even if I try to justify it with charity. As a result, I can now see the Church's wisdom in the spiritual discipline of tithing. Money is a perennial temptation for all of us—"You cannot worship God and money," (Matt 6:24) and, "Truly I tell you, it will be hard for a rich person to enter the kingdom of heaven." (Matt 19:23) In tithing I have found the freedom to stop calculating where I can splurge on myself, and instead to grow in dependence upon God. Tithing gives us an opportunity to let go of our attachments and to give ourselves back to God.

Of course, tithing literally 10% of one's income is not as doable for everyone. The financial situation in our country is only getting harder. Tithing is not meant to be a cold calculation as if God were taxing us in addition to Uncle Sam, but rather it is meant to be a response to God's generous love. That being said, I also know from my own brokenness that we humans have a tendency to justify keeping more than we need for ourselves. Perhaps that's why the very first beatitude is, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." God has designed that the Body of Christ be built up not by Church taxes, but by the individual decisions of her members to "seek first the kingdom of God." Regardless of which of the many beautiful Catholic movements and charities that you decide to support, may we continue to strive to be generous in building up His Kingdom so that we can say with St. Paul, "I know indeed how to live in humble circumstances; I know also how to live with abundance," but "more than that, I even consider everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord." (Phil 4:12 and 3:8)

## Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



Recuerdo cuando estaba en el seminario, la lotería Powerball alcanzó su pago más alto hasta el momento; mas de 700 Millones de dólares. No hace falta decir que no pude evitar pasar por una estación de servicio y comprar un boleto. De repente me puse a hacer los cálculos: la mitad para impuestos, cien millones para la Diócesis, las Escuelas Católicas y el Hospital; pagar las deudas de mi familia; pagar la universidad de mi sobrino y mi sobrina... Al final, solo me quedaría con 10 millones para mí. Cómo llegué a ese número, no lo sé, pero obviamente quería quedarme con algo de la ganancia, a pesar del hecho que estaba

en camino de servir a la Iglesia y al Pueblo de Dios.

Una situación similar ocurrió después de convertirme en sacerdote. Un feligrés bastante acomodado de mi antigua parroquia alardeaba a mi favor diciendo: "¡Apuesto a que podría ofrecerte un millón de dólares y sé que lo rechazarías!" ¡Poco sabía él de mi falta de humildad y de lo dispuesto que hubiera estado por aceptar su oferta! Sin dudarlo, mi mente pasó por el mismo proceso: apoyar este y aquel ministerio, dar algunos regalos a mi familia y, al final, ¡comprarme un lindo auto nuevo!

Estas experiencias me enseñaron algo muy simple: cuando se presenta la ocasión, tengo una tendencia a guardarme las cosas, aunque trato de justificarlo con la caridad. Como resultado, ahora puedo ver la sabiduría de la Iglesia en la disciplina espiritual del diezmo. El dinero es una tentación perenne para todos nosotros: "Uds. no pueden adorar a Dios y al dinero" (Mateo 6:24) y "Créanme que a un rico se le hace muy difícil entrar al reino de los cielos" (Mateo 19:23.) Al dar el diezmo he encontrado la libertad de dejar de calcular dónde puedo derrochar en mí mismo y, en cambio, crecer en la dependencia de Dios. El diezmo nos da la oportunidad de soltar nuestros apegos y entregarnos de nuevo a Dios.

Por supuesto, el diezmar literalmente el 10% de los ingresos de uno no es factible para todos. La situación financiera en nuestro país solo se está poniendo más difícil. El diezmo no pretende ser un cálculo frío como si Dios nos estuviera cobrando impuestos además del Gobierno, sino que pretende ser una respuesta al amor generoso de Dios. Dicho esto, también sé por mi propia imperfección que los humanos tenemos una tendencia a justificar tener más de lo que necesitamos para nosotros mismos. Tal vez por eso la primera bienaventuranza es: "Bienaventurados los pobres en espíritu, porque de ellos es el reino de los cielos". Dios ha diseñado que el Cuerpo de Cristo sea edificado no por los impuestos de la Iglesia, sino por las decisiones individuales de sus miembros de "buscar primero el reino de Dios". Independientemente de cuál de los muchos hermosos movimientos Católicos y organizaciones benéficas que decidas apoyar, que sigamos esforzándonos por ser generosos en la construcción de Su Reino para que podamos decir con San Pablo: "Sé pasar privaciones, como vivir en la abundancia", pero "más aún, todo lo tengo al presente por pérdida, en comparación con este tan sublime conocimiento de Cristo Jesús, mi Señor" (Filipenses 4:12 y 3:8).

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I have a competitive streak. Whether it's guessing Wordle in one try, grabbing the last Doorbuster deal at Kohl's or snagging Boardwalk early in a game of Monopoly, I like to win. For this reason, the readings today especially challenge me. In a world that values success, wealth and "winning," today's readings turn things upside down when it comes to status and justice. In Zephaniah, God chooses the "humble and lowly." In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus lays out a road map to lasting happiness that bears little resemblance to what the world tells us, and even what our own instincts may tell us, about being "happy." I'll still buy Boardwalk at the first opportunity, but Jesus' words invite me to focus on seeking righteousness, and to be merciful and "clean of heart." They encourage me to seek the happiness that only Christ can give. Through prayer and reflection on these words, we can ask the Lord to transform our hearts and lives to align with what it truly means to be blessed.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Pope Francis has referred to the Eight Beatitudes as a kind of Christian "identity card." (General Audience, Jan. 2020) And he had a suggestion for those of us, like me, who love to listen to the Sermon on the Mount but may not be sure where to start when it comes to living it. His suggestion is simple: "There are eight Beatitudes, and it would be nice to learn them by heart and to repeat them in order to keep this law that Jesus gives us in our mind and in our hearts." Perhaps we can place each Beatitude on a sticky note by the mirror, incorporate them into our morning prayers, teach them to our children or discuss them with friends. Practice makes perfect, yes? As Pope Francis reminds us, "the Beatitudes always bring you to joy; they are the paths to reach joy."

**STUDY** Memorize the Eight Beatitudes. Learn about each one by reading the writings of Pope Francis or another theologian such as Bishop Robert Barron. Ask God to help you incorporate them into your daily life.




The St. Vincent de Paul Society is a group of men and women, inspired by gospel values, growing in holiness and building a more just world through personal relationships and service to our neighbors in need.


