

# News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



I remember shortly after being ordained, I decided that my Lenten sacrifice was going to be giving up adult beverages. I don't drink all too often, but it was still a sacrifice I thought was worthy to give over to the Lord. Ash Wednesday came and the following weekend was a big St. Patrick's Day celebration in the town. I went to the parade; seeing parishioners in their festive green gear and I visited

houses in the midst of the all day celebration. A simple question was asked, "Father, can I get you a drink?" You would think that my keen memory would remember the sacrifices I was going to make 3 days ago; but I forgot and I gladly said, "Yes". It wasn't until that night when I got back to the Rectory that I realized, only 3 days into Lent and I already failed in my Lenten resolve. It was a humbling experience, but another opportunity to join the patriarchs and apostles, and ask the Lord for his unending mercy!

The story of Abram (Abraham) is a story of salvation history and example of God's patience. The Lord even in the midst of many of Abram's failure never removed God's desire to be with His people. Abram was promised great things; a great nation, a great name (dynasty), and a worldwide blessing. But there was a requirement that we missed; he had to leave his kin behind. If you were to read one line past our first reading, you would discover he took his nephew Lot. Throughout Abram/ Abraham's story, he falls short many times failing to give a complete surrender to the Lord; yet the Lord is kind and merciful.

This is no different for the Apostles and those who follow the Lord. The season of Lent is a season of repentance, turning back to the Lord. Let us ask the Lord for that continued gift to seek his mercy without end. No matter how many times we fall.

# Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



Recuerdo que poco después de ser ordenado, decidí que en mi sacrificio de Cuaresma iba a renunciar a las bebidas para adultos. No bebo con demasiada frecuencia, pero todavía era un sacrificio que pensé que era digno de entregarle al Señor. Llegó el Miércoles de Ceniza y el siguiente fin de semana fue una gran celebración del Día de San Patricio en la ciudad. Fuí al desfile; ví a los feligreses en su festivo traje verde y visité

casas en medio de la celebración de todo el día. Se hizo una pregunta simple: "Padre, ¿puedo traerte una copa?" Uno pensaría que mi gran memoria recordaría los sacrificios que iba a hacer hace 3 días; pero lo olvidé y con mucho gusto dije: "Sí". No fue hasta esa noche, cuando volví a la Rectoría que me di cuenta, solo 3 días en la Cuaresma y ya fallé en mi compromise de Cuaresma. Fue una experiencia humillante, pero otra oportunidad para unirse a los patriarcas y los apóstoles, jy pedirle al Señor su misericordia interminable!

El relato de Abram (Abraham) es un relato de la historia de la salvación y el ejemplo de la paciencia de Dios. El Señor, incluso en medio del fracaso de Abram, nunca eliminó el deseo de Dios de estar con Su pueblo. A Abram se le prometieron grandes cosas; una gran nación, un gran nombre (dinastía) y una bendición mundial. Pero había un requisito que lo perdimos; tenía que dejar atrás a sus parientes. # GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

As we enter the second week of Lent, today's readings encourage us to place our trust in God when we are dealing with hardship or uncertainty. Last week, we heard about how Jesus resisted the devil's temptations in the desert, trusting in the Father. This week, we follow Peter, James and John up the mountain, where Jesus "was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light." Jesus had told his followers he would suffer and die. The Transfiguration gave them a foretaste of Christ's glorious coming (CCC 554-56). As we continue on our Lenten journeys, we, too, can place our trust in the Lord. Though we may experience hardships and perhaps even doubts, the Transfiguration reminds us that Jesus has gone before us and prepared a place for us. As Pope Francis reminds us, "by his Transfiguration [Jesus] invites us to gaze at him. And looking at Jesus purifies our eyes and prepares them for eternal life, for the vision of heaven" (Homily, March 2014).

# GO EVANGELIZE

### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

We Catholics like to pray out loud. Whether we're singing the "Holy, Holy" with gusto or quietly reciting the rosary, most of us can say with confidence, "we have a prayer for that." And, of course, prayer is one of the three pillars of Lent (along with fasting and almsgiving). Today's account of the Transfiguration instructs us pretty clearly to listen. As Jesus is transfigured, the disciples hear a voice from the cloud: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." As we enter the second week of Lent, many of us have chosen something to "give up" or done something more proactive. Either way, today's readings remind us to enter this penitential season with open hearts – and open ears. We can listen to Jesus by studying Scripture, being especially attentive to the Sunday homily, or quietly soaking in his presence through eucharistic adoration.

**PRAY** Try driving with the radio off this week. Use the time to pray and "listen" to Jesus.

# **LENTEN GUIDELINES Diocese of Joliet-in-Illinois**

**Fast and Abstinence Regulations** 

- 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on *Ash Wednesday* and all the *Fridays of Lent*.
- 2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast and to abstain on *Ash Wednesday* and *Good Friday*.
- 3. On *Ash Wednesday* and *Good Friday*, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
- 5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year; all, in addition to following the Lenten regulations, are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

# Care for Creation Corner

Approximately a third of all food produced is discarded, and "whenever food is thrown out it is as if it were stolen from the table of the poor". Pope Francis, Laudato Si (29) This week stand in solidarity with the hungry - find ways to limit food waste; one way - create a meal calendar, purchase only the items you will need; have family members make suggestions thus preparing meals they will enjoy and consume. Another way - start a compost box/bin using food scraps, peelings, even yard waste to produce "black gold", a rich soil you can use to nourish gardens, plants, bushes and trees. Besides making rich soil it cuts down on waste that ends up in landfills, reducing the amount of methane—a greenhouse gas with a much greater warming potential than carbon dioxide. 
