

News from P.I.T. (Priest in Training)



With the woman at the well, it is unclear why she has had five husbands. The detail is not included because it's really not that important. Rather, we find her in the same situation that we all find ourselves: she is thirsting for authentic love—she is thirsting for God.

Unfortunately, we live in a fallen world without a lot of authentic love. In fact, cheapened love is all around us! One of its

simplest and most prevalent forms is *immodesty*. Modesty keeps at the forefront that 'I am more than my body, I am more than how attractive I am to others, I am first and most importantly a beloved child of God.' *Immodesty*, on the other hand, cheapens love. For if modesty is about "protect[ing] the intimate center of the person," then *immodesty* must be the opposite. (CCC 2521) This is because immodesty trains us to treat others (and ourselves!) as *objects for use* rather than *persons to be sacrificed for*. Thus, the Catechism says, "Modesty protects the mystery of persons and their love." (CCC 2522) It is an invitation to authentic love and to seeing the full dignity of the human person.

Matthew 5:8 reads, "Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God." Note, then, that this passage not only refers to seeing God Himself, but even seeing God in others! For, when we see others and ourselves in light of our being beloved children of God, then we can more readily treat them as such.

We can therefore see that 'purity of heart' extends to much more than just our sexuality. Soren Kierkegaard's book, *Purity of Heart is to Will One Thing* makes just this point in an interesting way: if we want heaven, if we want peace, if we want a heart that is undivided and filled, then we must give our entire hearts *to one thing and one thing alone*: God.

"You shall love the Lord your God with *ALL* your heart!" (Deut 6:5) "Whoever loves father or mother *more* than *me* is not worthy of me." (Matt 10:37) It seems harsh, it seems counterintuitive, but God *needs* to be number one—even before children and spouses, family and friends—not because *He* needs it, but because *we* need it.

Think about it. If God is my number one, I will love my spouse with the love of God. If God is my number one, I will be intimately acquainted with Beauty, Goodness, and Truth Himself and thus be able to lead my children to all those things. If God is my number one, I will know which path is best, which decision most efficacious, and which lifestyle the most meaningful.

Purity of heart is simplicity of heart—it is to will the one thing! It is the way to satisfy our thirst. The pure of heart will see God, and the pure of heart will find the fullness of love.

Noticias del P.I.T. (Sacerdote en formación)



Con la mujer junto al pozo, no está claro por qué ha tenido cinco maridos. El detalle no está incluido porque realmente no es tan importante. Más bien, la encontramos en la misma situación en la que nos encontramos todos: tiene sed de amor auténtico, tiene sed de Dios.

Desafortunadamente, vivimos en un mundo caído sin mucho amor auténtico. De hecho, jel amor abaratado nos rodea por todas partes! Una de sus formas más simples y predominantes es la

inmodestia. La modestia mantiene a la vanguardia que "Soy más que mi cuerpo, soy más que lo atractivo que soy para los demás, soy ante todo un hijo amado de Dios". La falta de modestia, por otro lado, abarata el amor. Porque si la modestia se trata de "proteger el centro íntimo de la persona", entonces la inmodestia debe ser lo contrario (CCC 2521). Esto se debe a que la falta de modestia nos entrena a tratar a los demás (y a nosotros mismos!) como objetos para usar en lugar de personas por las que sacrificarse. Así, dice el Catecismo, "La modestia protege el misterio de las personas y su amor" (CCC 2522). Es una invitación al amor auténtico y a ver la plena dignidad de la persona humana.

Mateo 5:8 dice: "Bienaventurados los limpios de corazón, porque ellos verán a Dios". Noten, entonces, que este pasaje no solo se refiere a ver a Dios Mismo, ¡sino incluso a ver a Dios en los demás! Porque, cuando vemos a los demás y a nosotros mismos a la luz de que somos hijos amados de Dios, entonces podemos tratarlos más fácilmente como tales.


Por lo tanto, podemos ver que la "pureza de corazón" se extiende a mucho más que nuestra sexualidad. El libro de Soren Kierkegaard, *La Pureza del Corazón es Querer Una Sola Cosa*, plantea este punto de una manera interesante: si queremos el cielo, si queremos la paz, si queremos un corazón indiviso y lleno, entonces debemos dar todo nuestro *corazón a una cosa y una sola cosa: Dios.*

"¡Amarás al Señor tu Dios con TODO tu corazón!" (Deuteronomio 6:5). "El que ama a su padre o madre *más* que a *mí*, no es digno de mí" (Mateo 10:37). Parece duro, parece contrario a la intuición, pero Dios necesita ser el número uno, incluso antes que los hijos y los cónyuges, la familia y los amigos, no porque Él lo necesite, sino porque nosotros lo necesitamos.

Piénsalo. Si Dios es mi número uno, amaré a mi cónyuge con el amor de Dios. Si Dios es mi número uno, conoceré íntimamente la Belleza, la Bondad y la Verdad Misma y así podré guiar a mis hijos a todas esas cosas. Si Dios es mi número uno, sabré qué camino es el mejor, qué decisión es la más eficaz y qué estilo de vida es el más significativo.

La pureza del corazón es la sencillez de corazón: jes querer la única cosa! Es la manera de saciar nuestra sed. Los puros de corazón verán a Dios, y los puros de corazón encontrarán la plenitud del amor.



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Even St. Teresa of Calcutta experienced a period of "spiritual dryness." We pray, we go to Mass faithfully, we serve others yet at times God's presence may seem elusive. Like the Israelites, we may ask, "Is the Lord in our midst or not?" As we enter the third Sunday of Lent, today's readings assure us that God remains with us even during those times we may feel spiritually parched. In Exodus, water flows from a rock to satisfy the people. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the Samaritan woman at the well: "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." The woman, a sinner and an outcast, recognizes Jesus as Messiah, and it changes her life. Even when we don't "feel" God's presence, we can rest assured that Jesus stands beside us. He is our redemption and our Hope, and "Hope does not disappoint."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In today's Gospel, Jesus breaks with custom by talking to a woman – a Samaritan woman, no less. He "sees" her – knowing she has been married five times before and is living with a man not her husband. Yet he chooses to reveal to her his identity as the Messiah and offers her "living water." But it doesn't end there. The woman at the well goes forth and shares her experience with others. Many more came to believe in the Messiah based on her testimony. What an unlikely disciple! We may feel that we, too, are unlikely disciples: We are sinners, we've made mistakes, perhaps we feel we are unworthy to "represent" Jesus to others. But nothing is further from the truth. Jesus invites us not only to partake of the living water but to share it with others so that all may believe.

ACTION Put a note on your mirror or bedside: "Hope does not disappoint." Each morning, remind yourself that Jesus is the source of our hope, and try to think of ways to share this hope with others.

The Lily





LENTEN GUIDELINES Diocese of Joliet-in-Illinois

Fast and Abstinence Regulations

- 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on *Ash Wednesday* and all the *Fridays of Lent*.
- 2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast and to abstain on *Ash Wednesday* and *Good Friday*.
- 3. On *Ash Wednesday* and *Good Friday*, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
- 5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year; all, in addition to following the Lenten regulations, are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

Care for Creation Corner

"We are all called to protect our common home." The Laudato Si' Action Plan in one diocese outlined steps individuals can take to protect the environment - one is to increase the tree canopy. Tree canopy refers to that part of an area or location shaded by trees. Trees have a beautiful spiritual analogy; there is an absolute beauty and wonder of creation in trees that we have been absolutely callous in appreciating and nurturing. Trees have a positive impact create oxygen, pull in carbon dioxide, improve air quality in urban areas, clean water, reduce flooding, reduce air temperature (reducing energy bills), increase property values, slow erosion, provide habitat for wildlife, beautify neighborhoods and generally improve the overall quality of life. Think about planting a tree - in memory of a loved one, to celebrate a special occasion, etc. Research the best trees native to our area because there is a very symbiotic relationship between pollinators and certain species of trees. Or donate to "One Tree Planted" which focuses on Global Reforestation. Visit: one tree planted.org.



Registered parishioners wishing their child baptized must complete a parent workshop. Baptisms are not celebrated during Lent.

Weddings
