

News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



Have you ever noticed that in every aspect of life, there is a the need for the student to become the teacher? In a way, it is how the Lord created us. Starting with family life, the child will eventually become the parent, the apprentice become the professional, the student become the teacher.

We do this in small ways and in small steps. For example, I remember my dad teaching me how to change a tire. He did it once and then he told me to do it by myself so that I could be prepared to change a flat. Or I remember in math class, the teacher would solve a problem on the projector screen and then assign me to repeat the solution on ten other problems just like it. Even studying for the priesthood, I had the opportunity to shadow many priests in their ministry with the hope that when I myself was ordained, I could do likewise.

Everything in life, points to learning, doing it ourself, and even teaching others to do likewise! Our faith is no different. What was the Lord doing when he was with his disciples for 3 years? He wasn't just teaching them rules or concepts, but also how to live—even to the point that the early Church would describe the Christian religion as "the way" ...the way to the Father, the way to beatitude, the way to salvation! What is the Ascension all about? Yes, it is the account of our Lord ascending to the right hand of the Father in Heaven; but it also the story of our Lord asking his disciples to now live what they were taught, and to lead others on the way.

What about us? Do we not only *know* but also *live* the faith well enough so as to be able to teach it to others? Thankfully we don't need to be Padre Pio or Mother Teresa to lead others to the next step on the way, because the Lord desires to send each and every one of us out—including you! For all of the ways in which we feel inadequate, let us ask the Lord on this feast of the Ascension to give us the discipline, courage, and zeal to learn, live, and share the gift of our faith with others!

Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



¿Han notado alguna vez que en todos los aspectos de la vida existe la necesidad de que el alumno se convierta en maestro? En cierto modo, así nos creó el Señor. Comenzando con la vida familiar, el niño eventualmente se convertirá en padre, el aprendiz en profesional, el estudiante en maestro.

Hacemos esto en pequeñas formas y en pequeños pasos. Por ejemplo, recuerdo a mi papá enseñándome a cambiar una llanta. Lo hizo una vez y luego me dijo que lo hiciera yo solo para estar preparado a cambiar una llanta baja. O recuerdo que en la clase de matemáticas, el maestro resolvía un problema en la pantalla del proyector y luego me asignaba repetir la solución en otros diez problemas iguales. Incluso estudiando para el sacerdocio, tuve la oportunidad de seguir a muchos sacerdotes en su ministerio con la esperanza de que cuando yo mismo fuera ordenado, podría hacer lo mismo.

¡Todo en la vida apunta a aprender, hacerlo uno mismo, e incluso enseñar a otros a hacer lo mismo! Nuestra fe no es diferente. ¿Qué estaba haciendo el Señor cuando estuvo con sus discípulos durante 3 años? No solo les estaba enseñando reglas o conceptos, sino también cómo vivir, hasta el punto de que la Iglesia primitiva describía la religión Cristiana como "el camino"... jel camino al Padre, el camino a la bienaventuranza, el camino a la salvación! ¿De qué se trata la Ascensión? Sí, es el relato de nuestro Señor ascendiendo a la diestra del Padre en el Cielo; pero también es la historia de nuestro Señor pidiendo a sus discípulos que ahora vivan lo que se les enseñó, y que guíen a otros por el camino.

¿Qué pasa con nosotros? ¿No sólo conocemos sino que también vivimos la fe lo suficientemente bien como para poder enseñarla a otros? Afortunadamente, no necesitamos ser el Padre Pío o la Madre Teresa para guiar a otros al siguiente paso en el camino, porque el Señor desea enviarnos a todos y cada uno de nosotros, jincluyéndote a ti! ¡Por todas las formas en que nos sentimos inadecuados, pidamos al Señor en esta fiesta de la Ascensión que nos dé la disciplina, el coraje y el celo para aprender, vivir y compartir el don de nuestra fe con los demás!



The Ascension of the Lord

Acts 1:1-11 | Eph 1: 17-23 | Mt 28: 16-20

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Actions speak louder than words. How many of us have heard or said this exact phrase? I suspect most, if not all of us are quite familiar with this old adage. In fact, this is exactly what we are being told by Jesus himself in today's Gospel when he says, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations." Jesus continues his direction of action by telling us to baptize "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." We are not directed to simply speak about Jesus with our families and church communities, we are told to GO among all nations and add to Jesus' flock. We continue Christ's mission when we seek to spread his love. Before Jesus joined his Father in heaven, his instructions were very clear. This is an opportunity to think about the commission we were given as part of the baptized community, and how Jesus is asking us to take action in his name.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Easier said than done. We've all heard that one as well. It's hard to feel equipped to spread the word and the will of God. We worry our words will fail us and we will look foolish. We know we are not perfect, and wonder if that means we cannot possibly be Christ's hands and feet on this earth. However, today's reading from Ephesians provides us with the perfect prayer to give us hope and faith in the Holy Spirit as we set out to fulfill the Great Commission given to us in this week's Gospel: "May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him." We are challenged to act for God, but not without being given the tools to do so with confidence.

PRAY Meditate on today's second reading from Ephesians. Read it as if your priest was giving you a blessing before you head out of your house each morning. Let it fill your soul with love and awe for our Father, and let it give you the confidence you need to play an active role in building his kingdom until he comes again.




