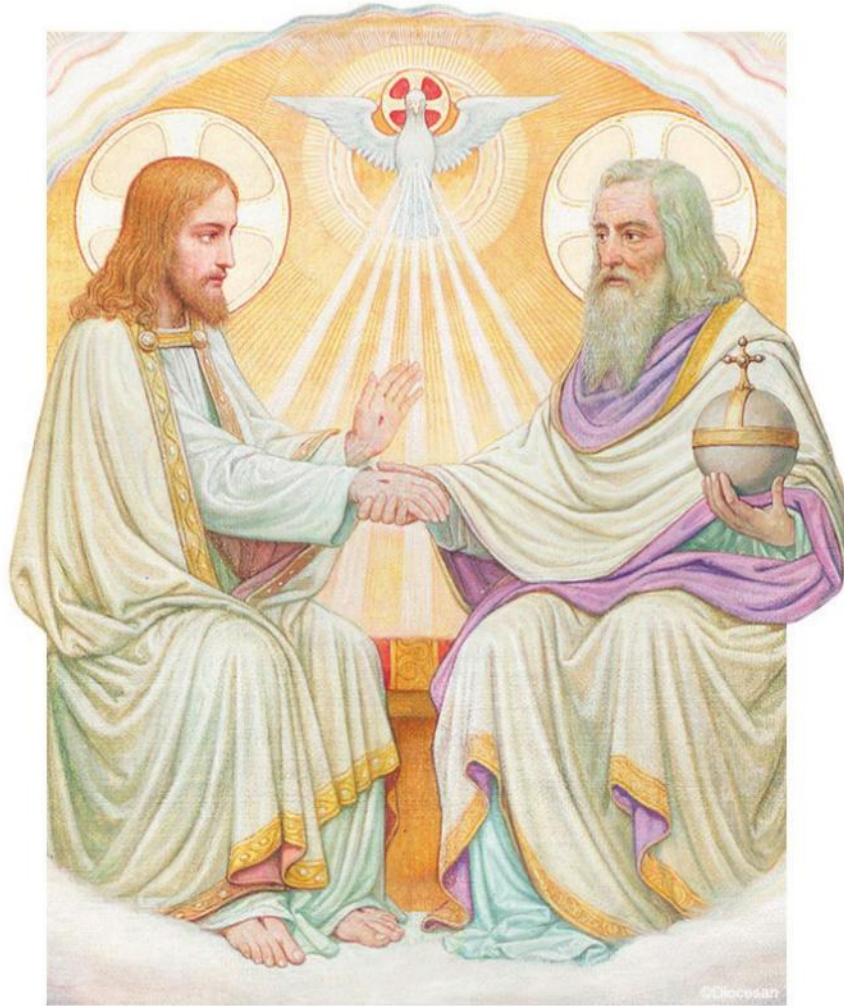

## News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



Growing up in the 90's, one of my favorite TV shows (maybe because of the suspenseful music) was "Unsolved Mysteries". The show, as the name states, reenacted ongoing mysteries from the past. Occasionally, throughout the years of the show, you might be lucky to get "an update" where they would reveal an answer to a former mystery.

As a math guy and an engineer, I have to say, I don't like mysteries. I was always taught to solve the unknown. Even to this day, people will come with me with problems, and my automatic instinct is to calculate the precise solution. My mindset: answers are good, mysteries are bad.

But then, how do I deal with the 'mysteries' of our faith. For example, this weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity: God is three persons, yet one God. Is this a mystery I can solve? The answer is clearly no... but then, are some mysteries therefore good?

Surprisingly, the answer is yes! Some mysteries are not meant to be completely solved, but rather *entered into!* We can see this in other areas of our lives too. For instance, what person in your life can you completely explain or define? Can you ever really *solve* another person? No. There is always more to be discovered in an other—even our very own hearts are a mystery to us! This isn't a bad thing, but an opportunity. It's what makes love, marriage, family, and friends a beautiful adventure that can captivate us for a lifetime! If we're willing to enter into the mystery, to engage the mystery of the other with love and respect, then these relationships can continue to unfold as an ever more beautiful mystery!

So, unlike the 90's show might have us believe, some mysteries are *meant* to be left unsolved—not because they're nonsensical, but because their depths could never truly be exhausted. God revealed himself as love: as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We need not fret if we cannot fully grasp how it is possible to have 3 divine persons and only one God. Instead we can concern ourselves with the question, "How is my relationship going with God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit?" It's the mystery of our relationship with love himself, and the mystery at the heart of heaven.

## Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



Al crecer en los años 90, uno de mis programas de televisión favoritos (tal vez por la música de suspenso) fue "Misterios sin resolver". El espectáculo, como su nombre lo indica, recreó misterios en curso del pasado. Ocasionalmente, a lo largo de los años del programa, fue posible tener suerte de obtener "una actualización" en la que revelarían una respuesta a un misterio anterior.

Como matemático e ingeniero, debo decir que no me gustan los misterios. Siempre me enseñaron a resolver lo desconocido. Incluso hasta el día de hoy, la gente vendrá a mí con problemas, y mi instinto automático es calcular la solución precisa. Mi mentalidad: las respuestas son buenas, los misterios son malos.

Pero entonces, ¿cómo trato con los "misterios" de nuestra fe? Por ejemplo, este fin de semana celebramos la Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad: Dios es tres personas, pero un solo Dios. ¿Es este un misterio que puedo resolver? La respuesta es claramente no... pero entonces, ¿son buenos algunos misterios?

¡Sorprendentemente, la respuesta es sí! ¡Algunos misterios no están destinados a ser resueltos por completo, sino más bien a *entrar*! Podemos ver esto en otras áreas de nuestras vidas también. Por ejemplo, ¿a qué persona en tu vida puedes explicar o definir completamente? ¿Puedes realmente *resolver* a otra persona? No. Siempre hay más por descubrir en los demás, ¡incluso nuestros propios corazones son un misterio para nosotros! Esto no es algo malo, sino una oportunidad. ¡Es lo que hace que el amor, el matrimonio, la familia y los amigos sean una hermosa aventura que puede cautivarnos para toda la vida! Si estamos dispuestos a entrar en el misterio, a comprometernos con el misterio del otro con amor y respeto, ¡entonces estas relaciones pueden continuar desarrollándose como un misterio cada vez más hermoso!

Entonces, a diferencia de lo que el programa de los años 90 podría hacernos creer, algunos misterios están *destinados* a quedar sin resolver, no porque no tengan sentido, sino porque sus profundidades nunca podrían agotarse realmente. Dios se reveló como amor: como Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo. No debemos preocuparnos si no podemos comprender completamente cómo es posible tener 3 personas divinas y un solo Dios. En cambio, podemos preocuparnos por la pregunta: "¿Cómo va mi relación con Dios Padre, Dios Hijo y Dios Espíritu Santo?" Es el misterio de nuestra relación con el amor mismo, y el misterio en el corazón del cielo.

## Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Ex 34:4b-6, 8-9 | 2 Cor 13:11-13 | Jn 3:16-18

### **GROW AS A DISCIPLE** | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Last Sunday the Church celebrated the Solemnity of Pentecost: the birthday of the Church and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit into the world. Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, giving adoration and glory to the three divine persons in our one God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – three in unity, or Triune. In the Gospel we heard, John tells us: “God so loved the world that he gave his only Son.” If you’re going to write one Bible verse on a piece of cardboard and hold it up at a football game, this is it! John 3:16 encapsulates a Christian belief: We are loved by the Father beyond measure, and that love is incarnated – takes human flesh – in the divine person of his Son. But there is something deeper within this verse that comes to light much later in the Gospel: Jesus revealed that when he, the Son, returned to the Father, he would not leave us alone. (Jn 14: 26-28) Instead, the Holy Spirit came to be with us and remain with us. This is our God whom we celebrate and give thanks to: one in being, three in person. His love is unceasing and his Spirit dwells within and among us to guide us, advocate for us, and draw us ever closer to himself in that love.

### **GO EVANGELIZE**

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

When it comes to evangelization, you could write a Bible verse on a piece of cardboard, hold it up in a crowded place and hope it piques someone’s interest. But we can take a cue from St. Paul in the second reading as well. He encourages us to mend our ways, encourage one another and “greet one another with a holy kiss.” And then he offers a prayer for the Corinthians: “The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.” Imagine what the world would be like if we all lived like that – if we worked to mend our mistakes, encouraged each other, and earnestly prayed for the grace, love, and fellowship of God to be upon every person. That would be a true witness to God’s presence in the world.

**PRAY** This week, pray a Holy Trinity novena. The word “novena” comes from the Latin word for “nine,” and they typically include nine days of prayer, asking God for a specific intention, and beginning or ending on a feast or solemnity. Trust in the Triune God who loves you and offer him your heart. You may find the comfort or wisdom you seek.

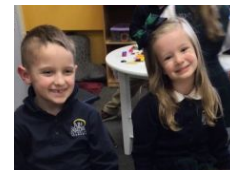

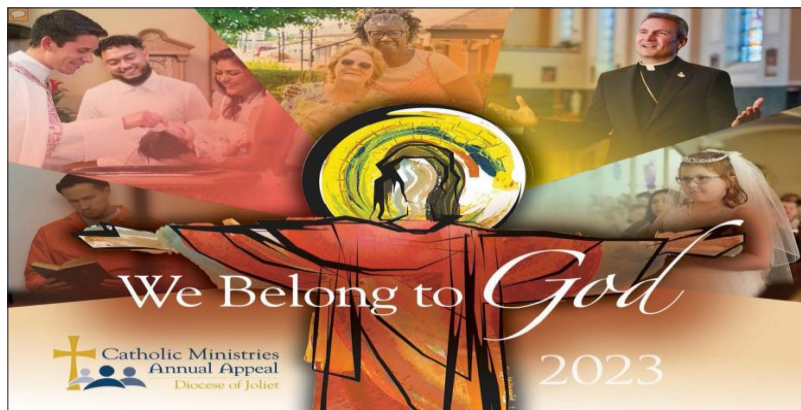

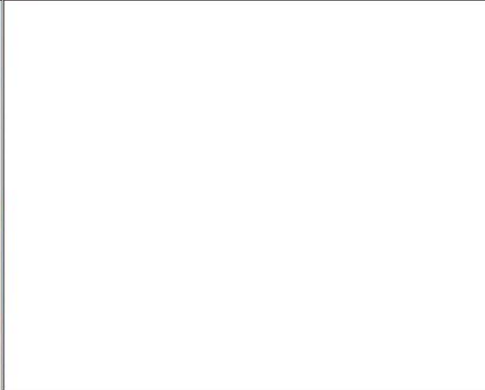
