## News from P.I.T. (Priest in Training)



Oddly enough, one of the best parts of my two-week pilgrimage to France this month was returning to OLM and celebrating Sunday Mass with all of you. I felt more joy praying the Mass with the people whom I have come to know and love over the last three years than when I was visiting some of my favorite saints: St. Therese of Lisieux, St. John Vianney, and St. Bernadette of Lourdes to name a few. Maybe you find that hard to believe. Maybe that's just the jet-lag speaking. True, saying Mass at the tombs of

these heroes of our faith was a blessing I'll never forget—I'd do it again in a heartbeat! But I think the Lord was telling me at 8am Mass last Sunday something along the lines of "there's no place like home."

People imagine that the priesthood is somehow *extra*-ordinarily demanding—that we must be so brave and selfless to give up a wife and children and money for the collar...but we're not. I'm just as much a sinner in need of God's grace as anyone else—slow to relinquish my preferences, slow to give God my heart, slow to trust that He'll give me more than I give Him. I became a priest because God called me to, and what I found was the pearl of great price—what I pray all of you discover as well. *That "whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."* (Matt 16:25)

The issue at hand is that we imagine that the opposite of the Gospel is true. We think, "Whoever preserves his life from the excessive demands of God will find it." But to preserve oneself from God's invitations, is to preserve oneself from love. Hence, "Whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." (Matt 16:25)

It is certainly a big demand from God to me to have to leave here. I will always remember OLM, and yes, I will deeply miss it, because I will deeply miss you. I started tearing up *months ago* at the thought of leaving this place that has been my family and my joy! But I know that the Lord has good things in store for all of us.

With St. Paul, I hope that I have at least somewhat succeeded in living out the words: "what we preach is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake." (2 Cor 4:5) Many times I have fallen short of living this out, so I humbly ask that you forgive me where I have fallen short. But above all, I must say, thank you... for your love, your friendship, and for blessing me over the last three years. I have learned so much here from Fr. Don, from Fr. Michael, and from all of you. The priesthood has been an inestimable gift to me. This assignment has been an inestimable gift to me. Serving you has been an inestimable gift to me. Please pray for us priests as we seek to lose our lives for His sake, as we try to help you to do the same!

Curiosamente, una de las mejores partes de mi peregrinaje de dos semanas a Francia este mes fue regresar a OLM y celebrar la Misa dominical con todos ustedes. Sentí más alegría rezando la Misa con las personas a las que he llegado a conocer y amar durante los últimos tres años que cuando visitaba a algunos de mis santos favoritos: Santa Teresa de Lisieux, San Juan Vianney y Santa Bernardita de Lourdes por nombrar algunos. Tal vez encuentren eso difícil de creer. Tal vez eso es solo el jet-lag hablando.

Cierto, hacer Misa en las tumbas de estos héroes de nuestra fe fue una bendición que nunca olvidaré. ¡Lo haría de nuevo en un santiamén! Pero creo que el Señor me estaba diciendo en la Misa de las 8 a.m. el domingo pasado algo así como "no hay lugar como el hogar".

La gente imagina que el sacerdocio es de alguna manera *extra*ordinariamente exigente, que debemos ser tan valientes y desinteresados para renunciar a una esposa e hijos y dinero por el collar... pero no
lo somos. Soy un pecador tan necesitado de la gracia de Dios como cualquier otra persona: lento para renunciar a mis preferencias, lento para
darle a Dios mi corazón, lento para confiar en que Él me dará más de lo
que yo le doy. Me convertí en sacerdote porque Dios me llamó a hacerlo, y lo que encontré fue la perla de gran precio, oro para que todos
ustedes la descubran también. *Que "el que pierda su vida por mi causa, la hallará"* (Mateo 16:25).

El tema en cuestión es que imaginamos que lo contrario del Evangelio es cierto. Pensamos: "El que preserve su vida de las excesivas demandas de Dios, la hallará". Pero preservarse de las invitaciones de Dios es preservarse del amor. Por lo tanto, "El que quiera salvar su vida, la perderá, pero el que pierda su vida por mi causa, la encontrará" (Mateo 16:25).

Ciertamente es una gran exigencia de Dios para mí tener que irme de aquí. Siempre recordaré a OLM, y sí, la extrañaré profundamente, porque los extrañaré profundamente a ustedes. Empecé a llorar hace meses al pensar en dejar este lugar que ha sido mi familia y mi alegría! Pero sé que el Señor tiene buenas cosas reservadas para todos nosotros.

Con San Pablo, espero haber tenido al menos algo de éxito en vivir las palabras: "Io que predicamos no es a nosotros mismos, sino a Jesucristo como Señor, con nosotros como vuestros servidores por amor a Jesús" (2 Corintios 4:5). Muchas veces me he quedado corto en vivir esto, así que humildemente les pido que me perdonen donde me he quedado corto. Pero sobre todo, debo decir, gracias... por su amor, su amistad y por bendecirme durante los últimos tres años. He aprendido mucho aquí del Padre Don, del Padre Michael, y de todos ustedes. ## GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

When I was in middle school, I came upon a group of students who had singled out another student, accusing her of some pretty rotten things. The Lord must have helped me to be brave that day because I decided to step in and defend her. Thankfully, calling them out on their cruelty was enough to fend them off. Thank God for his presence and aid in that moment! In the first reading today, Jeremiah tells of his experience of being betrayed and accused: "All those who were my friends are on the watch for any misstep of mine. 'Perhaps he will be trapped [they say]; then we can prevail, and take our vengeance on him." But Jeremiah does not lose heart, saying also, "the Lord is with me, like a mighty champion." And Jesus' words in the Gospel echo the resolve of Jeremiah when he says: "Fear no one ... What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light ... And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul." It seems pretty clear, then, that our job is to bring the Good News of Jesus into the world whenever we can and let his light shine forth by our words and actions. We are commissioned to be warriors for Christ who should not fear injury but rather call upon him in our need and trust in his goodness and mercy to render aid.

## GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Stepping into a conflict or situation can be difficult. But we are not meant to do it alone. Yes, we are called to proclaim the Word of God at every opportunity – to let "zeal" for our Father's house consume us, as we heard in the psalm. And the task at hand may seem a daunting one – until we focus on the second part of the Gospel and soak in the depth of the love Jesus has for each of his children. Matthew writes: "Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge. Even all the hairs of your head are counted." We are not alone as we do the work of the Father; rather, we are known and loved by him and strengthened by the Advocate, the Holy Spirit. We can feel emboldened by this as we pursue the everlasting gift of heaven.

**ENGAGE** This world often tells us to do what makes us happy. Let's challenge ourselves to, instead, do what makes us *holy*, as we keep our eyes fixed on the path to eternity.


