

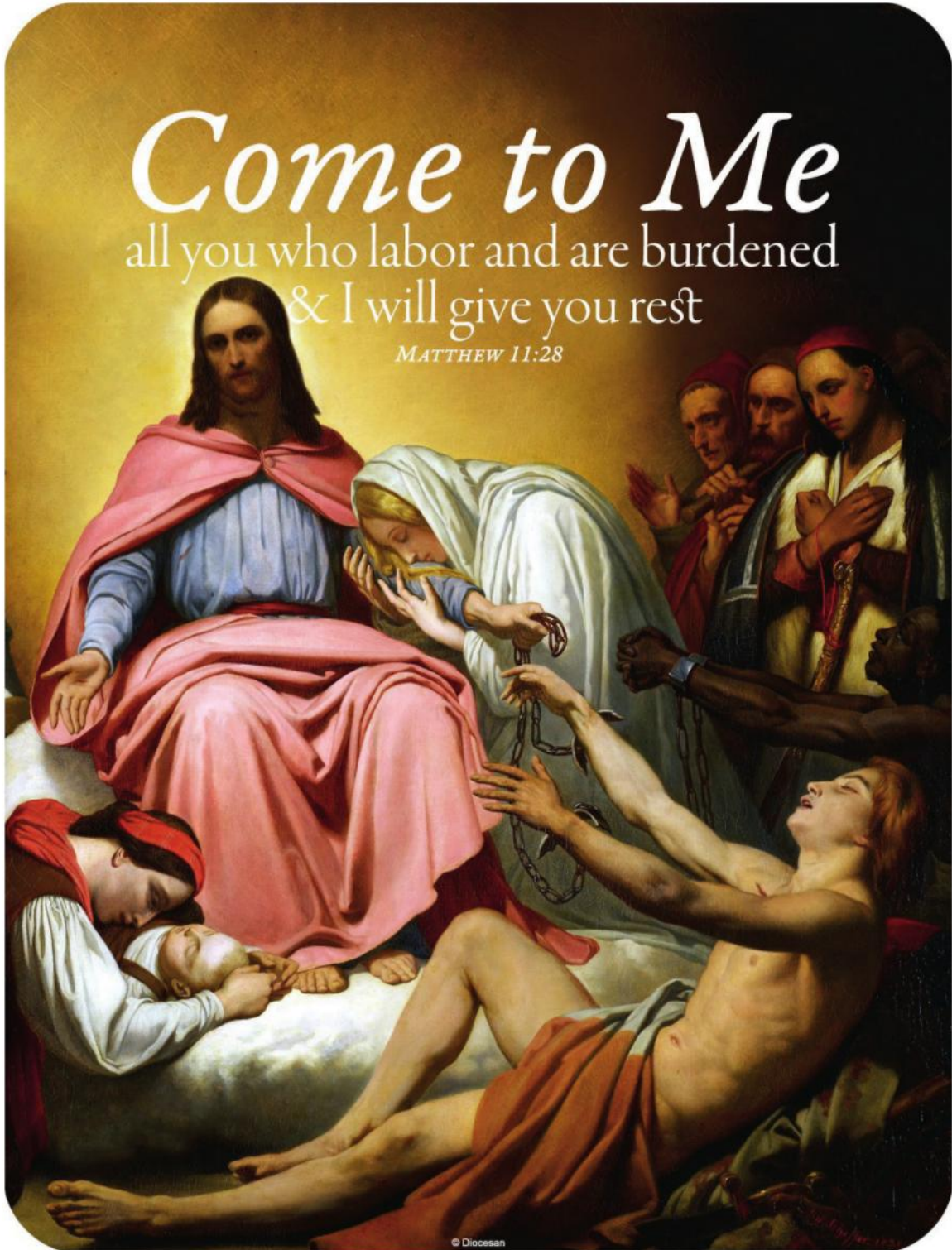

News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



It's amazing how we can learn a lot about our faith by reflecting through the eyes of a child. Jesus says as much in our Gospel this weekend: *"For although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned, you have revealed them to little ones."*

Think about this, for instance: What were your first words as a child? You probably don't even remember them, but that's okay, because you could probably make a good guess. Mom and Dad were our everything as toddlers—so much so that they were the foremost things on our minds and in our words. We really couldn't understand ourselves or the world apart from them.

As beings made in the image and likeness of a trinitarian God—a God who's *essence* is relational—this doesn't surprise us. *Our* essence and identity too is inherently relational. This explains why Christ talks about his relationship with his Father in heaven immediately after talking about the wisdom of children. Children come to know who they are because of their relationship to their parents. We come to know who we are because of our relationship to our Heaven Father.

Hence why we are pursuing a family-centered faith formation process for our children! If we truly want our children to better understand themselves in light of their *heavenly* Father, it is most effectively passed on through catechesis of their *earthly* parents. If children learn to walk, talk, and do just about everything else essential for life from their parents, why not also the most essential thing of all?

God revealed that He is a loving communion of persons. May the communion of our families be at the heart of where our children come to know communion with our loving God.

Es increíble cómo podemos aprender mucho sobre nuestra fe reflexionando a través de los ojos de un niño. Jesús dice tanto en nuestro Evangelio este fin de semana: *“Porque aunque escondiste estas cosas de los sabios y de los entendidos, se las has revelado a los pequeños”*.

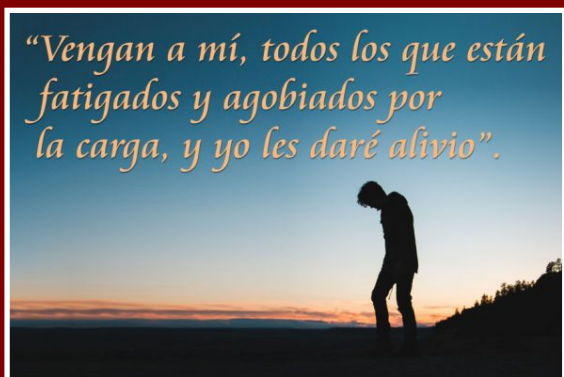
Piensa en esto, por ejemplo: ¿Cuáles fueron tus primeras palabras cuando eras niño? Probablemente ni siquiera las recuerdes, pero está bien, porque probablemente podrías hacer una buena suposición. Mamá y papá eran nuestro todo cuando éramos niños pequeños, tanto que eran lo más importante en nuestras mentes y en nuestras palabras. Realmente no podíamos entendernos a nosotros mismos o al mundo aparte de ellos.

Como seres hechos a imagen y semejanza de un Dios trinitario, un Dios cuya *esencia* es relacional, esto no nos sorprende. *Nuestra* esencia e identidad también es inherentemente relacional. Esto explica por qué Cristo habla de su relación con su Padre en el cielo inmediatamente después de hablar de la sabiduría de los niños. Los niños llegan a saber quiénes son debido a la relación que tienen con sus padres. Llegamos a saber quiénes somos debido a nuestra relación con nuestro Padre Celestial.

¡Por eso estamos siguiendo un proceso de formación de fe centrado en la familia para nuestros niños! Si verdaderamente queremos que nuestros niños se comprendan mejor a sí mismos a la luz de su Padre *celestial*, se transmite más eficazmente a través de la catequesis de sus padres *terrenales*. Si los niños aprenden de sus padres a caminar, hablar y hacer casi todo lo demás esencial para la vida, ¿por qué no también lo más esencial de todo?

Dios reveló que Él es una comunión amorosa de personas. Que la comunión de nuestras familias esté en el corazón de donde nuestros hijos lleguen a conocer la comunión con nuestro Dios amoroso.

What does a restful day look like to you? Maybe it's a lazy day poolside with a good book and a cold drink, or perhaps a dark room, cozy blanket, and a good movie. Lazy days like these are hard to come by; truly restful days in our busy world are even fewer and farther between. Although "taking a break" every once in a while from the cares of the world is certainly good for everyone, in today's Gospel Jesus is referring to true rest that only he can provide. Jesus asks us to take up his yoke and learn from him "and [we] will find rest for ourselves." Our burdens will be lighter because he shares them with us. Jesus says: "I am meek and humble of heart." Imagine the strength to be found in that meekness, that humility! We will know true rest when we surrender ourselves to Jesus and live in the freedom only he can provide.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In order to find rest in the Lord, we must remember that "[we] are in the spirit, if only the Spirit of God dwells in [us]," as Saint Paul writes to the Romans. Therefore, Jesus is inviting us into union with him, as well as with the Father and the Holy Spirit. How do we yoke ourselves to Christ? By living out our baptismal promises, celebrating the sacraments, and through our lives of faith, we allow Jesus to work through us and lead the way. 

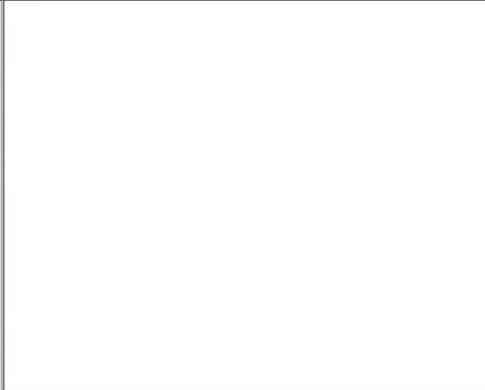
