News from P.I.T. (Priest in Training)



There is a story about when St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, who received visions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, spoke to a priest about her visions. The priest did not want either one of them to be deceived, so he told her that if Jesus appeared to her again, to ask Him one question. He told her to ask Him what the last mortal sin he confessed was. When Jesus appeared to her again, Margaret Mary asked Him the question, Jesus looked at her and said, "I don't remember."

Even though God knows everything, after He has forgiven our sins, it is as if that sin never happened. It is truly forgiven. Yet in the First Reading, it says, "The vengeful will suffer the LORD's vengeance, for he remembers their sins in detail." In order for us to be forgiven, we first need to forgive. This is what we pray in the Our Father: "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." If our hearts are not open to forgive others, how can they be open to receive forgiveness?

But how do we forgive? We have to start with what forgiveness is not. It is not saying that what the other person did to us is okay. I think that because we think that this, we end up like the unforgiving servant trying to choke his fellow servant, saying, "Pay back what you owe."

Instead, we need to acknowledge that what they did hurt us. Sr. Miriam James Heidland, SOLT, says that with Jesus, we even need to make an account of what that person did to hurt us. We do this, not to hold on to what they owe us, but instead to acknowledge the hurt we experienced. But as we do this, we also need to acknowledge that justice is most likely not possible on this earth. That other person might not even be aware that they hurt us or even be sorry.

Because justice is not possible on this earth, we know that God will bring about justice, if not in this life, in the next. Forgiveness is letting go of what they owe us, and instead giving that up to God, Who will bring about justice. Forgiveness is saying that I acknowledge that you hurt me, but I give that hurt, and you, to God.

If God forgives as if He forgets our sins, are we called to forget how that person has hurt us? The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says, "It is not in our power not to feel or to forget an offense; but the heart that offers itself to the Holy Spirit turns injury into compassion and purifies the memory in transforming the hurt into intercession." When we forgive, God can even transform those painful memories into sources of healing for us and the other person.

Noticias del P.I.T. (Sacerdote en Formación)



Hay una historia sobre cuando Santa Margarita María Alacoque, quien recibió visiones del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús, habló con un sacerdote sobre sus visiones. El sacerdote no quería que ninguno de los dos se engañara, así que le dijo que, si Jesús se le aparecía otra vez, le hiciera una pregunta. Él le dijo que le preguntara cuál había sido el último pecado mortal que él había confesado. Cuando Jesús se le apareció de nuevo, Margarita María le hizo la pregunta, Jesús la miró y dijo: "No lo recuerdo".

Aunque Dios lo sabe todo, después de haber perdonado nuestros pecados, es como si ese pecado nunca hubiera ocurrido. Está verdaderamente perdonado. Sin embargo, en la Primera Lectura dice: "Los vengativos sufrirán la venganza del Señor, porque él recuerda detalladamente sus pecados". Para que seamos perdonados, primero debemos perdonar. Esto es lo que rezamos en el Padre Nuestro: "Perdona nuestras ofensas, como también nosotros perdonamos a los que nos ofenden". Si nuestros corazones no están abiertos para perdonar a los demás, ¿cómo pueden estar abiertos para recibir el perdón?

Pero ¿cómo perdonamos? Tenemos que empezar con lo que no es el perdón. No quiere decir que lo que la otra persona nos hizo esté bien. Creo que, porque pensamos eso, terminamos como el servidor implacable que intenta estrangular a su compañero, diciéndole: "Paga lo que debes".

En cambio, debemos reconocer que lo que hicieron nos lastimó. Sor Miriam James Heidland, SOLT, dice que, con Jesús, incluso necesitamos dar cuenta de lo que esa persona hizo para lastimarnos. Hacemos esto, no para aferrarnos a lo que nos deben, sino para reconocer el dolor que experimentamos. Pero al hacerlo, también debemos reconocer que lo más probable es que la justicia no sea posible en esta tierra. Es posible que esa otra persona ni siquiera se dé cuenta de que nos lastimó o ni siquiera se arrepienta.

Debido a que la justicia no es posible en esta tierra, sabemos que Dios hará justicia, si no en esta vida, en la próxima. El perdón es dejar de lado lo que nos deben y, en cambio, entregárselo a Dios, quien hará justicia. El perdón es decir que reconozco que me lastimaste, pero entrego ese dolor, y tú, a Dios.

Si Dios perdona como si olvidara nuestros pecados, ¿estamos llamados a olvidar cómo esa persona nos ha lastimado? El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica dice: "No está en nuestro poder no sentir u olvidar una ofensa; pero el corazón que se ofrece al Espíritu Santo convierte la herida en compasión y purifica la memoria transformando el dolor en intercesión". Cuando perdonamos, Dios puede incluso transformar esos recuerdos dolorosos en fuentes de sanación para nosotros y la otra persona.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Forgiveness. It seems like a relatively simple concept, doesn't it? We ask our merciful Father for it every day when we pray the Our Father: "... forgive us our trespasses..." Then reality hits, as we remember the second part of that phrase: "...as we forgive those who trespass against us ..." As we forgive others. Oh, that long, hard road of forgiveness! Easier said than done. Sometimes those old sayings have some merit, don't they? And when we look at today's readings, there is nothing cryptic about them: forgive not seven times but seventy-seven times, let go of wrath and anger, forgive your brother and sister from your heart. Yes, forgiveness is a simple concept, but it's not easy. Perhaps the answer is to re-read today's Scriptures and ask the Holy Spirit to give us the strength to put in the hard work if there is someone in our lives to whom we need to offer our heartfelt forgiveness.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Bishop Robert Barron, in his Word on Fire Bible on the Gospels, has four suggestions related to this Gospel on how to become "a better forgiver." The one that stood out to me immediately is "forgive offenses quickly." Don't let them fester and "settle deeply into your psyche." This seems like very sage advice because we can all have a tendency to "stew" about things that are bothering us, which rarely makes them better. Bishop Barron's other suggestions are: Pay attention to your own sins, go to confessions regularly, and offer forgiveness through a concrete act or sign. Which brings us back to the simplicity of it all: God will always forgive us, so we must always forgive others. Doesn't it make sense that to live in the house of our merciful Father, we must emulate him and have loving hearts rather than vengeful hearts?

PRAY Examine your heart and take a hard look at whether you are holding on to a wrong that was committed against you. Take it to God in prayer. The more we open our hearts to forgive others, the more at peace we can be. Ponder the last words of today's reading from Sirach:

Think of the commandments, hate not your neighbor; remember the Most High's covenant, and overlook faults.



SEEK is our great story of faith that describes the stories of being **Created** in love and for love, being **Captured** by sin, **Rescued** by Jesus Christ, and our love **Response** to the Holy Spirit as builders of God's Kingdom. Both children and parents participate, enjoying their two separate learning experiences that culminate with a family prayer.




For the Budget Year 2023/24 we have Increased the Parish Sunday goal by 1.3%, to \$31,000/week, to help expand our numerous varied Ministries.


