News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



As someone who studied math, when I come across this Gospel, I think of the other possible sons that the man in the Gospel could have had. The first son says he will not work in the vineyard but changes his mind and works, while the second son says he will work but never actually does. Couldn't the man have had a son that said yes to the father's task and actually completed it? Wouldn't that be a perfect son, like me? Or couldn't the man have had a son that said no, and then didn't complete his task? Wouldn't that be a son who was completely depraved and separated?

Of course, you could make up those possibilities, but Christ only puts two options in the story for a reason. Why? Well, none of us are perfect and none of us are completely deprived from God's grace! And yet, don't we put ourselves and others in those categories all the time?

How often do we try to pursue perfection, not only in our work and relationships, but also in our spiritual life? How many of us walk around thinking that nothing is wrong, and that everything is just fine? It's an illusion that usually moves from indifference to despair. Usually those who believe they are perfect eventually see their illusion crumble and end up falling into despair! It confirms what the prophet Ezekiel shares with us in our first reading: "Thus says the Lord: You say, 'The LORD's way is not fair!' Hear now, house of Israel: Is it my way that is unfair, or rather, are not your ways unfair?" (Ezekiel 18:25)

The Lord is not expecting us to be perfect, but to seek his mercy and love and to turn back to him when we fall. To live a life of conversion means that we can never stop turning back to him. Let us not fall into this unfair way of thinking: where we feel either too perfect for the Lord, or too far from calling out to him in our failures. Let us always trust that it is never too late to be redeemed by him. When we call out to him, the Lord will always respond!

Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



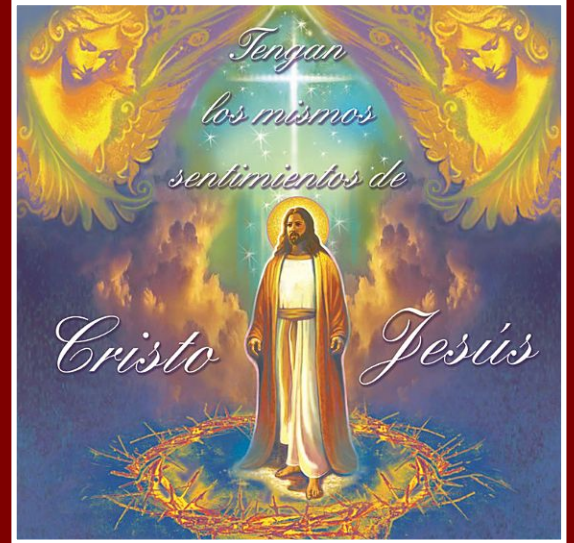
Como alguien que estudió matemáticas, cuando me encuentro con este Evangelio, pienso en los otros posibles hijos que pudo haber tenido el hombre del Evangelio. El primer hijo dice que no trabajará en la viña pero cambia de opinión y trabaja, mientras que el segundo hijo dice que trabajará pero nunca lo hace. ¿No podría el hombre haber tenido un hijo que hubiera dicho sí a la tarea del padre y realmente la hubiera completado? ¿No sería un hijo perfecto, como yo? ¿O no pudo el hombre haber tenido un hijo que dijo que no y luego no completó su tarea? ¿No sería ese un hijo completamente depravado y separado?

Por supuesto, pueden inventar esas posibilidades, pero Cristo sólo pone dos opciones en la historia por una razón. ¿Por qué? Bueno, ¡ninguno de nosotros es perfecto y ninguno de nosotros está completamente depravado de la gracia de Dios! Y, sin embargo, ¿no nos ponemos a nosotros mismos y a los demás en esas categorías todo el tiempo?

¿Con qué frecuencia intentamos buscar la perfección, no sólo en nuestro trabajo y nuestras relaciones, sino también en nuestra vida espiritual? ¿Cuántos de nosotros andamos pensando que nada está mal y que todo está bien? Es una alusión que suele pasar de la indiferencia a la desesperación. ¡Por lo general, aquellos que creen que son perfectos eventualmente ven que su alusión se desmorona y terminan cayendo en la desesperación! Confirma lo que el profeta Ezequiel comparte con nosotros en nuestra primera lectura: “Esto dice el Señor: Si ustedes dicen: “No es justo el proceder del Señor”, escucha, casa de Israel: ¿Conque es injusto mi proceder? ¿No es más bien el proceder de ustedes el injusto?” (Ezequiel 18:25).

El Señor no espera que seamos perfectos, sino que busquemos su misericordia y amor y que volvamos a él cuando caemos. Vivir una vida de conversión significa que nunca podemos dejar de volvernos a él. No caigamos en esta forma injusta de pensar: en la que nos sentimos demasiado perfectos para el Señor o demasiado lejos de invocarlo en nuestros fracasos. Confiemos siempre en que nunca es tarde para ser redimidos por él. Cuando lo invocamos, ¡el Señor siempre responderá!

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I used to be something of a sugar fiend. So much so that one birthday, my then boyfriend (now husband) decided to forego flowers and bought me a jumbo-sized bag of Smarties candies instead. While I loved sugar, I eventually decided I didn't love how it made me feel. Now older and wiser, I reach for vegetables more often. It's not that I crave carrots, but I feel better eating healthy foods. It's what God intends for my body. Similarly, God intends for our souls to follow the laws he has ordained. But sometimes life gets tough and we suffer terrible wrongs or are grieving, and we feel like the Israelites in today's first reading, calling out, "The Lord's way is not fair!" Well, thank God for that! How lost would we be, if God treated us "fairly." Instead, he treats us with love and mercy; with justice. "He humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross," *for us*. If there is any encouragement in Christ, as Paul says, and we know there is, then being of the same mind and heart - attitude - of Christ, gets us through those moments of "unfair!" And we can follow Christ's commands, knowing he loves us more than anyone else could love us, and more than we can ever love him.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

It's easy to talk a good game as Christians. We can all agree that it is right to feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked, visit the sick and imprisoned and bury the dead, as the Corporal Works of Mercy instruct us. But when it comes to actually doing those things - "humbly regard[ing] others as more important than [ourselves], each looking out not for his own interests, but also for those of others" - we can find all sorts of reasons not to. Maybe our days are too busy or maybe we feel just the tiniest bit resentful at the idea of sharing something we've worked hard to earn. However, our words don't mean much without action. Jesus says as much in today's Gospel. If we are like the son who says yes but then does not go to work in the vineyard, we are not doing our Father's will. We are like the chief priests who are being bypassed on the way to heaven by "tax collectors and prostitutes" who heard the word of God and believed.

PRAY This week, let us look for ways to live out our faith. Rather than pray only with our words, let us pray with our actions. If you aren't sure where to start, pay special consideration to the verses from the second reading, highlighted above: "Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vain-glory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but also for those of others."

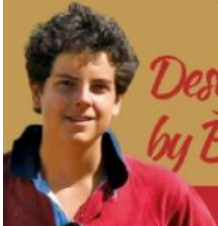

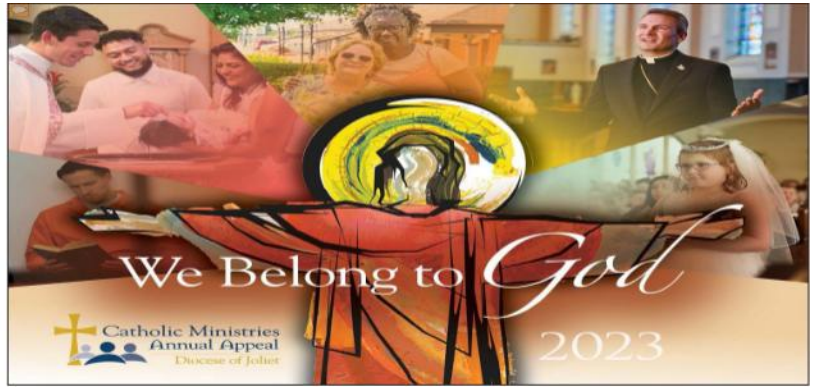
For the Budget Year 2023/24 we have Increased the Parish Sunday goal by 1.3%, to \$31,000/week, to help expand our numerous varied Ministries.
