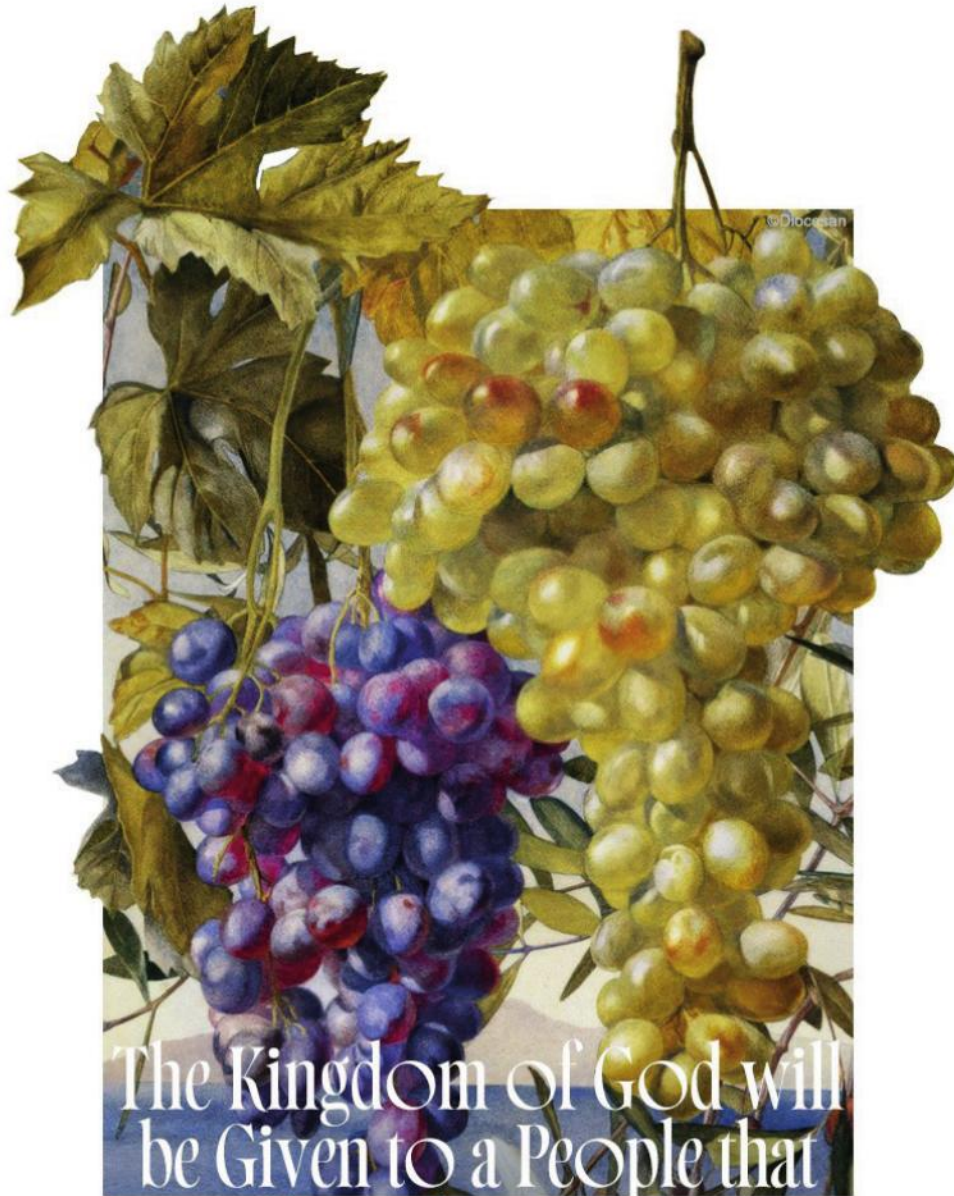

News from P.I.T. (Priest in Training)



As soon as I was old enough, my parents would put me in charge of watching my two younger siblings when they would go out. If they didn't listen to me, I would put them in time-out, which meant they were pretty much in time-out every time my parents went out. One day they decided that they wouldn't listen to me anymore, so I called my parents because they were ganging up on me!

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells a parable about a vineyard owner, who at harvest-time sends servants, and ultimately his son, to collect his produce from his tenants. The tenants did not accept them as representatives of the vineyard owner, and in disrespecting them, ultimately disrespected the vineyard owner, showing that they would rather be their own master.

Because my siblings did not respect my authority as the one my parents put in charge when they were gone, they did not respect my parents. They wanted to be in charge of themselves. The only problem was that my parents had not asked me to discipline my siblings; they had only asked me to keep an eye on them. In my own way, I was taking advantage of being put in charge, and trying just as much as my siblings to be a law unto myself.

Do we also reject the authority of God? Maybe we do this in outright ways by choosing to sin, but very often this happens in more subtle ways. We might feel a tug to pray but choose to watch TV instead. We might know that we need to reach out to that one person who really annoys us, but we instead choose to ignore them and talk to our friends. Or maybe there is one part of our life that we don't want to surrender to Jesus yet because we don't want to give that thing up yet.

Jesus ends the parable by saying, "The kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit." He doesn't do this as a master over a servant, but as a loving Father.

In John 15, Jesus calls Himself the True Vine, and us the branches. We can bear fruit if we abide in Him. Instead of desiring to be in charge of ourselves, we become so united with Jesus, the Vine, that our wills become one. We are no longer hired servants working for wages, but we simply want to do His will because we know this is what will make us truly happy, and because, as beloved children of the Father, we desire to return that love He has given us.

Unlike my siblings' desire to do whatever they wanted when my parents were gone, or my desire to take over when they put me in charge, we are called to surrender to God. By doing this, we are able to bear fruit because we have united ourselves to the True Vine, Jesus Christ.

Noticias del P.I.T. (Sacerdote en formación)



Tan pronto como tuve edad suficiente, mis padres me pusieron a cargo de cuidar a mis dos hermanos menores cuando ellos salían. Si no me escuchaban, los ponía en hora de pensar, lo que significaba que prácticamente estaban en hora de pensar cada vez que mis padres salían. Un día decidieron que no me escucharían más, así que llamé a mis padres porque estaban conspirando contra mí!

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús cuenta una parábola sobre el propietario de un viñedo, que en el tiempo de la vendimia envía sirvientes, y finalmente a su hijo, para pedir sus frutos a los viñadores. Los viñadores no los aceptaron como representantes del propietario de la viña y, al faltarles el respeto, finalmente le faltaron el respeto al propietario de la viña, demostrando que preferirían ser su propio amo.

Debido a que mis hermanos no respetaron mi autoridad como la que mis padres pusieron a cargo cuando ellos no estaban, no respetaron a mis padres. Ellos querían estar a cargo de sí mismos. El único problema era que mis padres no me habían pedido que disciplinara a mis hermanos; sólo me habían pedido que los vigilara. A mi manera, estaba aprovechando que me pusieron a cargo y tratando, tanto como mis hermanos, de ser una ley para mí mismo.

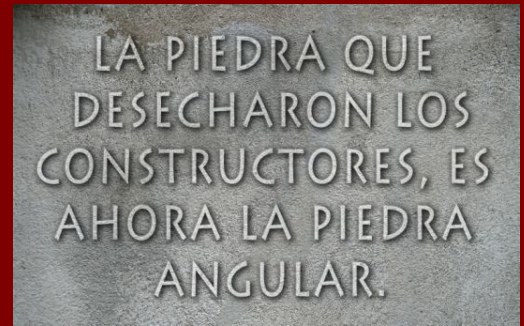
¿Rechazamos también nosotros la autoridad de Dios? Tal vez hagamos esto de manera directa al elegir pecar, pero muy a menudo esto sucede de manera más sutil. Es posible que sintamos la necesidad de orar, pero en su lugar elegimos mirar televisión. Es posible que sepamos que necesitamos acercarnos a esa persona que realmente nos molesta, pero en lugar de eso elegimos ignorarla y hablar con nuestros amigos. O tal vez hay una parte de nuestra vida que aún no queremos entregarle a Jesús porque no queremos renunciar a esa cosa todavía.

Jesús termina la parábola diciendo: "El reino de Dios les será quitado a Uds. y se le dará a un pueblo que produzca sus frutos". Él no hace esto como un amo sobre un sirviente, sino como un Padre amoroso.

En Juan 15, Jesús se llama a Sí Mismo la Vid Verdadera y a nosotros las ramas. Podemos dar fruto si permanecemos en Él. En lugar de desear estar a cargo de nosotros mismos, nos unimos tanto a Jesús, la Vid, que nuestras voluntades se vuelven una. Ya no somos sirvientes contratados que trabajan por un salario, sino que simplemente queremos hacer Su voluntad porque sabemos que esto es lo que nos hará verdaderamente felices y porque, como hijos amados del Padre, deseamos devolverle ese amor que Él nos ha dado. .

A diferencia del deseo de mis hermanos de hacer lo que quisieran cuando mis padres salían, o de mi deseo de tomar el control cuando me pusieron a cargo, estamos llamados a rendirnos a Dios. Al hacer esto, podemos dar fruto porque nos hemos unido a la Vid Verdadera, Jesucristo.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Vineyards were important to the socio-economic structure and well-being of the ancient near east peoples. It would be disastrous for someone to plant and then cultivate a vineyard only for it to be overrun by wild grapes. It would have to be destroyed in order for it to be replanted and recover, which would be financially impossible for most people of that era. So when Isaiah prophesies about God's plan for his vineyard - that is, his people, Israel - it is attention-worthy for its radical nature. Isaiah says that even with all of the Lord's care and cultivation, his people have failed to grow, and they have devolved into idolatry and disobedience. So the Lord will bring his vineyard to ruin. Here's the good news contained (but unspoken in these verses) in that prophecy, however: The Lord will "start over," with a new covenant. And the Word which he sends forth in his Son will be the vine from which all other branches will arise and flourish. Though he will be killed for his message as prophets and messengers before him were, the Son in his victory over death will be the one who gives us the inheritance other tenants have sought. As Jesus himself says in today's Gospel "the stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone." And on this cornerstone is built our salvation.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

There is much to love here on our earthly home - fragrant flowers, beautiful sunsets, and compassionate people. Still, it can be a place of great pain and sadness at times. It can be easy to feel angry and resentful when we encounter the imperfections of the world - when we experience heartache, loss, disappointment. Although working in the Lord's vineyard can be both joyful and heartbreaking, it is up to us to do our best to help it produce fruit until it is time to head to our heavenly home. It is our inheritance, as Christ has made us coheirs with him. St. Paul encourages us to "Have no anxiety at all." Surely, that is easier said than done, but the great Apostle tells us that by our prayers and petitions, "the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."

PRAY

When we pray to God, we should follow the example of the saints who came before us. St. Paul notes: "Keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me. Then the God of peace will be with you." Our prayers are a time to make requests of God but also should be used for thanksgiving. As St. Paul directs, we should make note of all those things that are true, just, lovely, or otherwise worthy of praise.

The bride, groom or either set of parents must be registered members of the parish for at least six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Weddings may be scheduled no less than six months out in order to fulfill the diocesan marriage preparation requirements. Contact Diane Reiter, ext. 221.
