

News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



Well, we are in the season of Lent again! And for some reason, every year the sacrifices seem to get harder, not easier. The thought might come across our minds: "do I have to sacrifice anything this year?" It sometimes seems that we find ourselves going in circles. As we see in our yearly liturgical calendar, the weeks flow from Advent to Christmas into

Ordinary Time, and from there they flow into Lent, Easter, and finally back to Ordinary Time again. We continue to see this cycle repeat each subsequent year.

This repetitive pattern might look like we are going in circles, but what if there is something else going on. What if the Lord is using this pattern to help us enter more deeply into our relationship with Him? One image that was given to me over 20 years ago has helped me tremendously in moving away from only going in circles. Instead, it helped me see the growth and depth that the repetition of the liturgical calendar has in our spiritual lives. All you need to do is go to your nearby garage or wood shop; grab a wooden board, a screwdriver and screw. When you start putting the screw into the board, it seems to simply go in circles if you looked at it solely from the top. You only need to look at it from the side to realize that the screw is not just stationary, but it is going deeper into the board!

People may not like repetition, but it is in the repetition, the going in circles, that we can actually enter more deeply into the Paschal Mystery of God: his Passion, death, and Resurrection. It's the constant sacrifices that allow us to enter into the greater joy of Christ's Resurrection! So, if you are frustrated that it is the Lenten season again, I encourage you to look at the ways the Lord is trying to grow deeper in relationship with you. Then, I guarantee that the sacrifices won't be so difficult!

Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



Bueno, ¡estamos nuevamente en la temporada de Cuaresma! Y por alguna razón, cada año los sacrificios parecen volverse más difíciles, no más fáciles. Puede que nos venga a la cabeza el pensamiento: "¿tengo que sacrificar algo este año?" A veces parece que nos encontramos dando vueltas en círculos. Como vemos en nuestro calendario litúrgico anual, las semanas fluyen desde el Adviento hasta la

Navidad y pasan al Tiempo Ordinario, y de allí fluyen hacia la Cuaresma, la Pascua y, finalmente, nuevamente al Tiempo Ordinario. Seguimos viendo que este ciclo se repite cada año siguiente.

Este patrón repetitivo puede parecer como si estuviéramos dando vueltas en círculos, pero ¿qué pasa si está sucediendo algo más? ¿Qué pasa si el Señor está usando este patrón para ayudarnos a entrar más profundamente en nuestra relación con Él? Una imagen que me dieron hace más de 20 años me ha ayudado enormemente a dejar de dar vueltas en círculos. Más bien, me ayudó a ver el crecimiento y la profundidad que tiene la repetición del calendario litúrgico en nuestra vida espiritual. Todo lo que necesitas hacer es ir a tu garaje o taller de carpintería cercano; agarra una tabla de madera, un destornillador y un tornillo. Cuando empiezas a colocar el tornillo en la tabla, parece que simplemente gira en círculos si lo miras únicamente desde arriba. ¡Solo necesitas mirarlo desde un lado para darte cuenta de que el tornillo no solo está estacionario, sino que está penetrando más profundamente en la tabla!

Puede que a la gente no le guste la repetición, pero es en la repetición, en el dar vueltas, que podemos entrar más profundamente en el Misterio Pascual de Dios: su Pasión, muerte y Resurrección. ¡Son los sacrificios constantes los que nos permiten entrar en el mayor gozo de la Resurrección de Cristo! Entonces, si estás frustrado porque nuevamente es la temporada de Cuaresma, te animo a que observes las formas en que el Señor está tratando de profundizar su relación contigo. ¡Entonces te garantizo que los sacrificios no serán tan difíciles!

Gn 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18 | Rom 8:31b-34 | Mk 9:2-10

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Just two weeks ago, when Christians walked around all day with a cross of ashes on our foreheads, we may have received puzzled looks. Who bothers with fasting and almsgiving for 40 whole days? Many of us live with great abundance in this country; the only time we actually need to fast might be for lab work. With this in mind, it's helpful to remember the why: because Christ sacrificed himself for us, and he calls his followers to participate in his redemptive mission through our own sacrifices. Without sacrifice, we simply cannot be like Christ, nor will we see our own transfiguration in the resurrection to come. So Lent is a blessed season of reorienting our lives to Christian sacrifice: that of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Perhaps this season can also dispel some of the complacency that has a tendency to creep into our lives. The poor and hungry and disenfranchised still exist, and Christ depends on us to be his hands and feet to serve them. But how can we serve them if we do not embrace Christ's example as a living sacrifice? Ask the Lord for the grace to see and hear what he is asking us to do for him.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Today's readings show an incredible arc from Abraham's willingness to sacrifice his son for God to Christ's Transfiguration after his Passion. Without Abraham's willingness to give up that which he wanted most and finally obtained, he would not have earned his greatest blessing from God in having countless descendants; and without Christ's sacrifice on the cross, all of mankind would not have been saved. Maybe we aren't called to great sacrifices such as these in our own lives, but we as Christians are called to offer our lives as a living sacrifice to our family, our neighbor, those in need, and God himself. Lent is a reminder not only to help us reorient our lives to God and his call for our lives, but to live it, too. By our own witness and prayer we have the ability to help bring others to the Lord and his promise of eternal life.

ACCOMPANY What is something you have always appreciated being done for you? What is a specific sacrifice, large or small, that you know has been made on your behalf? Make an effort this week to identify a specific need you know someone has, pray for that person/need, and offer to God a sacrifice of treasure, time or even your suffering for the fulfillment of that need.
