

### News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



You can find many statistics and studies pointing to the fact that faith in first world countries is in decline. The question "why is this happening?" can be asked. How could the cultures and countries that were instrumental in the spread of the Catholic faith now be lacking in faith? One thing I would propose is that we are going too fast. These countries and peoples, which include us, are not taking time to recollect, reflect, and pray.

Have you ever tried to recall an event that happened suddenly in your life, such as an accident? Many times, we struggle to put all the details together. Or have you ever tried to capture information while traveling down a highway? If you aren't giving your complete attention, you will miss all the details as you go by.

In our first reading, in the midst of the sorrow and sadness of being in exile, King Cyrus issues a decree allowing the Jewish people to return to their land and rebuild their temple. Here the Lord is acting through a world leader. As the Jewish people return to rebuild, they still mourn because the new temple would never measure up to the glory of Solomon's original temple. The people were failing to see God's hand in it, despite the fact that he had freed them from years of captivity and oppression.

In our second reading, St. Paul asks the people of Ephesus to recall God's Mercy in Christ. In a way, they had forgotten about it, maybe due to the busyness of their lives. How many times have we been so caught up in our busyness that we fail to recall God's Mercy in our lives? Do we fail to reflect on what Christ has done for you and me?

Finally, in our Gospel today Nicodemus comes to Jesus at night, a sign that he was searching for the true Light of the World. It was also at a time when there was nobody else around. Nicodemus went to encounter Christ when the world was sleeping; he went to seek him in the silence. This first encounter would lead to Nicodemus's conversion, and eventually to his acceptance of Christ's sacrifice, as he would help bury our Lord's body after the Crucifixion.

What can we do to grow in our faith, especially in the season of Lent? May I encourage us to slow down, take time to recollect, and reflect on the way the Lord has worked, is working, and continues to work in our lives? May we never get too busy to miss the workings of the Lord and his presence in our lives, thanking him for all the good he has done for us.

## Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



Se pueden encontrar muchas estadísticas y estudios que señalan el hecho de que la fe en los países del primer mundo está en declive. La pregunta "¿por qué está sucediendo esto?" puede ser formulada. ¿Cómo es posible que las culturas y los países que contribuyeron decisivamente a la difusión de la fe católica carezcan ahora de fe? Una cosa que yo propondría es que vamos demasiado rápido. Estos países y pueblos, entre los que nos incluye a nosotros, no se toman el tiempo para

recordar, reflexionar y orar.

¿Alguna vez han tratado de recordar un evento que ocurrió repentinamente en su vida, como un accidente? Muchas veces nos cuesta reunir todos los detalles. ¿O alguna vez han intentado capturar información mientras viajaban por una autopista? Si no prestas toda tu atención, te perderás todos los detalles a medida que pases.

En nuestra primera lectura, en medio del dolor y la tristeza del exilio, el rey Ciro emite un decreto que permite al pueblo judío regresar a su tierra y reconstruir su templo. Aquí el Señor está actuando a través de un líder mundial. Mientras el pueblo judío regresa para reconstruir, todavía está triste porque el nuevo templo nunca estaría a la altura de la gloria del templo original de Salomón. El pueblo no veía la mano de Dios en ello, a pesar de que Él los había liberado de años de cautiverio y opresión.

En nuestra segunda lectura, San Pablo pide al pueblo de Éfeso que recuerden la Misericordia de Dios en Cristo. En cierto modo, lo habían olvidado, tal vez debido al ajetreo de sus vidas. ¿Cuántas veces hemos estado tan atrapados en nuestras ocupaciones que no logramos recordar la Misericordia de Dios en nuestras vidas? ¿No reflexionamos sobre lo que Cristo ha hecho por ti y por mí?

Finalmente, en nuestro Evangelio de hoy Nicodemo viene a Jesús por la noche, señal de que estaba buscando la verdadera Luz del Mundo. También fue en un momento en el que no había nadie más alrededor. Nicodemo fue al encuentro de Cristo cuando el mundo dormía; fue a buscarlo en el silencio. Este primer encuentro conduciría a la conversión de Nicodemo y, finalmente, a su aceptación del sacrificio de Cristo, ya que ayudaría a enterrar el cuerpo de nuestro Señor después de la Crucifixión.

¿Qué podemos hacer para crecer en nuestra fe, especialmente en el tiempo de Cuaresma? ¿Puedo animarnos a reducir el ritmo, tomarnos tiempo para recordar y reflexionar sobre la forma en que el Señor ha obrado, está obrando y continúa obrando en nuestras vidas? Que nunca estemos demasiado ocupados para perdernos las obras del Señor y su presencia en nuestras vidas, agradeciéndole por todo el bien que ha hecho por nosotros.

## Fourth Sunday in Lent

2 Chr 36:14-16, 19-23 | Eph 2:4-10 | Jn 3:14-21

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

"The floor is lava!" We used to play this game as children, and it still seems popular today: you arrange furniture and other objects in such a way as to make it from point to point, and even room to room, without touching the floor. There may be more than one way to go, but the crux of the matter is that you have to use these waypoints to stay alive in the game. Following Jesus is somewhat similar, although obviously infinitely more serious and important! He himself, through his sacrifice on the cross, opened the doors of salvation to us - he has provided the ways and means to live free from death. His sacrifice is the only thing that makes it possible for us to enter heaven. In other words, he has arranged the spiritual furniture, made clear those waypoints, and, differing from children who play the lava game, is ready and willing to help us at any time to move safely and confidently along the journey. St Paul writes, "we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them."

#### GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

St. Paul also writes, "by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from you; it is the gift of God." And in today's Gospel, St. John writes these words we know so well. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." Both testaments include words of comfort, but John here also includes a call to action. Notice the word "might." Like "may," which is found in other translations, it indicates possibility, probability, and contingency. In other words, it is offered – freely given! – but we must accept. And acceptance means, just as the prophets shared with the Israelites, we need to follow God's commands. It means that in our words and deeds we act from and in love of God and love of one another. For "whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God."

**ENGAGE** Today we are about halfway through Lent. If you haven't yet taken advantage of the rich opportunity to pray the Stations of the Cross with your family, do so this week. Most parishes pray the stations on Fridays during Lent, and perhaps other days as well. This ancient tradition of our Church is a beautiful and meaningful way to walk the Way of the Cross with our Lord.

We adore you, O Christ, and bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the whole world.



No baby equipment such as cribs, walkers, strollers, playpens, etc.


