

News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



If you go to the Cathedral Basilica in St. Louis, you will actually be visiting the second largest mosaic in the world; thousands of small pieces of glass depicting the life of Christ adorn the church. When you walk down the center aisle and look to your right, you will see the following passage on the wall: "Christ is not risen, your faith is in vain." When I first encoun-

tered it, I was confused as the statement was contrary to the faith. Why was this in the Catholic Cathedral Basilica? It wasn't until I moved closer toward that side of the church that a very important word was revealed, which had been previously blocked by my field of vision: "If". This word completes St. Paul's quote from his first letter to the Corinthians, "If Christ is not risen, your faith is in vain."

Every time I walk into that Basilica, I have my own little April Fool's day! Christ is not risen - April fools, just kidding, He has risen! However, what is St. Paul getting at with his rhetorical statement? He is declaring a necessary need for action. Because Jesus rose from the dead it changes everything. Our faith was never meant to be something idle, or something stagnant. It was never meant to be something that we just acknowledge for one hour a week on Sunday, or even once a year! It is meant to move our very being to its core!

When you encounter love, do you just sit there? Or do you respond to it with your whole being? When someone tells you that they love you, what happens if you say nothing? It becomes very awkward. Why? ... Because encountering truth and love requires a response!

What do we celebrate this Easter? God's unconditional love for us: that even in the midst of our sin and death, God conquers both for our sake! The question is: are we going to sit idle while God professes His love for us, or are we going to respond with our very being, saying a great yes, a great AMEN?

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Alleluia!

He has risen indeed! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



Si van a la Basílica Catedral de St. Louis, en realidad estarán visitando el segundo mosaico más grande del mundo; miles de pequeños trozos de vidrio que representan la vida de Cristo adornan la iglesia. Cuando caminan por el pasillo central y miran a su derecha, verán el siguiente pasaje en la pared: "Cristo no ha resucitado, vuestra fe es vana". Cuando lo encontré por primera vez, me sentí confundi-

do porque la declaración era contraria a la fe. ¿Por qué estaba esto en la Basílica Catedral Católica? No fue hasta que me acerqué a ese lado de la iglesia que se reveló una palabra muy importante, que previamente había estado bloqueada en mi campo de visión: "Si". Esta palabra completa la cita de San Pablo en su primera carta a los Corintios: "<u>Si</u> Cristo no ha resucitado, vuestra fe es vana".

¡Cada vez que entro en esa Basílica, tengo mi propio día de los Inocentes! Cristo no ha resucitado-Inocentes, es broma, ¡Él ha resucitado! Sin embargo, ¿a qué se refiere San Pablo con su declaración retórica? Está declarando la necesidad necesaria de acción. Porque Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos, todo cambia. Nuestra fe nunca estuvo destinada a ser algo inactivo o estancado. ¡Nunca tuvo la intención de ser algo que simplemente reconozcamos durante una hora a la semana el domingo, o incluso una vez al año! ¡Está destinada a mover nuestro ser hasta su corazón!

Cuando encuentras el amor, ¿te quedas ahí sentado? ¿O respondes a ello con todo tu ser? Cuando alguien te dice que te ama, ¿qué pasa si no dices nada? Se vuelve muy incómodo. ¿Por qué? ... ¡Porque el encuentro con la verdad y el amor exige una respuesta!

¿Qué celebramos esta Pascua? El amor incondicional de Dios por nosotros: que incluso en medio de nuestro pecado y muerte, ¡Dios vence ambos por nuestro bien! La pregunta es: ¿nos vamos a quedar inactivos mientras Dios profesa su amor por nosotros, o vamos a responder con nuestro propio ser, diciendo un gran sí, un gran AMÉN?

¡Cristo ha Resucitado! ¡Aleluya! ¡Aleluya!



Wishing you a blessed Easter! One of our commitments in growing as disciples of Jesus, especially at the beginning of this most important season of Easter, is to study Scripture. John's Gospel today depicts the story of the empty tomb - the reactions of Mary of Magdala and the two disciples trying to make sense of what they had seen. What we may have missed, however, are the words of St. Peter in the first reading from Acts speaking of Jesus: "This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead." Jesus appeared post-resurrection to those to whom he was closest - the witnesses chosen by God whom he had commissioned to preach the Gospel to all people, so all might believe in him. In this way the chosen few, Christ's heralds, would bring the Good News of his resurrection to the many. So we too, now, are witnesses, chosen by God in our baptism and come to this table of thanksgiving and sacrifice. By faith we grow as his disciples, ready to go forth to lead others to him.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

As we know, these first disciples of Christ went on mission throughout the known world to preach to the Jews as well as the Gentiles. Their task was not easy; all endured opposition and hardship; many were martyred. But gone was the fear they may have felt at the crucifixion; by the power of the Holy Spirit these early missionaries were full of courage and commitment, and were driven to proclaim the risen Jesus to all. What does this have to do with us today? By virtue of our baptism, we also are chosen by God to be his witnesses in the world. We are called to "preach the Gospel" with how we live our lives. When we trust in the promises of Christ and know the peace that only he can bring, it gives us the strength to testify to friends, family and others that God loves us and has redeemed us. Good News indeed.

GROW & GO Christ is risen, Alleluia! The Resurrection means that nothing can separate us from God's love and presence with us. Spend time this week in prayer contemplating these two truths: The purpose of our lives is to continually GROW in intimate relationship with God; and Jesus' final command to his disciples and us is to "GO and make disciples of all nations." (Mt 28:19)



The Lily

According to legend, the lily lost its self-respect on the night of Christ's agony in the garden. The other flowers bowed their heads in sorrow in Christ's presence, but not the lily. How could it, being the most fragrant and beautiful flower (according to its own estimation)? 

Divine Mercy Feast Day Sunday, April 7, at 2 p.m.

In honor of the Feast Day of Divine Mercy on Sunday, April 7, Our Lady of Mercy will hold a beautiful celebratory service in the Church starting at 2 p.m. Our service will include a group recitation in song of The Chaplet of Divine Mercy, a devotional prayer that Jesus revealed among His numerous apparitions to Saint Maria Faustina. Jesus also made what is famously known among the faithful as His 'Extraordinary Promise':

"On that (Feast) Day, the depths of My mercy will be open to all The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment."

Our OLM observance of the Divine Mercy Feast Day will include the following:

- Sacrament of Reconciliation, 2 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.
- Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Eucharistic Adoration starting at 2 p.m.
- Period of Silent Meditation and Prayer
- Placing Divine Mercy Images at the steps of the altar for blessing (images should be placed at the altar steps before 1:45 p.m.)
- Taking of Personal Intentions for the Divine Mercy Chaplet
- Recitation of the Chaplet in song at 3 p.m. (the Hour of Death)
- Blessing of participants' Divine Mercy Images at the altar
- Benediction, closing prayers to Jesus and Mary

A program and assorted pamphlets featuring the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, as well as other resources, will be available, but participants should be sure to bring their Rosary!






