


### News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



I love Colorado! I would always joke that those words would just come out of my mouth as I tried to grasp the majesty of the Rocky Mountains. I had a chance to live in Colorado for 4 years, 1 year in Colorado Springs and 3 years in Boulder. In that time, I had a chance to hike some beautiful mountains, or 14er's, which the locals called mountains that were 14,000 feet above sea level.

One thing is clear; to climb a mountain takes a lot of work and preparation - and sometimes even training! It's interesting to see that the Scriptures and early church writers both saw the spiritual journey as similar to climbing a mountain. Some of it has to do with the idea of climbing to the heights of heaven. But, it also reveals the simple truth of our faith; we can't be passive and we can't just stand still. We must always seek God's grace to grow ever closer to him; otherwise, we would just slide down the mountain due to our tendency to sin, known as concupiscence.



In the story of the Exodus, God revealed his ultimate power over creation through the 10 plagues. Then the Israelites were protected from Pharaoh and his army through the miraculous crossing of the Red Sea. And yet, after all that we see the Israelites slide into sin and

desire to go back to Egypt, longing to return to slavery and worship of pagan idols. What happened? They stopped surrendering and trusting in the Lord in the midst of the desert, even though they had seen his power.

How many of us in our Christian journey have had a powerful encounter with God, only to doubt his love for us when we enter the desert of life or encounter a cross we did not want. The Israelites reaction was, "I want to go back to when life didn't involve the cross."

In the first reading, God reveals to the people that he will provide the food they need to make it through the desert. In the Gospel today, the Lord leads us into the Bread of Life Discourse, revealing that which will give us the strength to endure through the desert and crosses of life. He is going to give us his very self in the Eucharist at every Mass. As we come to our last year of the Eucharistic Revival, may the desire remain that we cling close to the Lord and that we stay close to the Eucharist. Let us pray that despite whatever we may be going through in our lives, we may always seek the grace of God in the Eucharist- that which will nourish and strengthen us on our journey to God!



## Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



¡Amo Colorado! Siempre bromeaba diciendo que esas palabras salían de mi boca cuando intentaba captar la majestuosidad de las Montañas Rocosas. Tuve la oportunidad de vivir en Colorado durante 4 años, 1 año en Colorado Springs y 3 años en Boulder. En ese tiempo, tuve la oportunidad de escalar algunas montañas hermosas, o 14er's, como los lugareños llamaban a las montañas que estaban a 14.000 pies sobre el nivel del mar.

Una cosa está clara: escalar una montaña requiere mucho trabajo y preparación, jy a veces incluso entrenamiento! Es interesante ver que las Escrituras y los escritores de la iglesia primitiva veían el viaje espiritual como algo similar a escalar una montaña. Parte de esto tiene que ver con la idea de escalar a las alturas del cielo. Pero también revela la simple verdad de nuestra fe: no podemos ser pasivos y no podemos quedarnos quietos. Siempre debemos buscar la gracia de Dios para acercarnos cada vez más a él; de lo contrario, simplemente nos deslizaríamos montaña abajo debido a nuestra tendencia al pecado, conocida como concupiscencia.



En la historia del Éxodo, Dios reveló su máximo poder sobre la creación a través de las 10 plagas. Luego, los israelitas fueron protegidos del faraón y su ejército mediante el cruce milagroso del Mar Rojo. Y, sin embargo, después de todo eso, vemos que los israelitas cayeron en pecado y

desearon regresar a Egipto, anhelando regresar a la esclavitud y la adoración de ídolos paganos. ¿Qué sucedió? Dejaron de entregarse y confiar en el Señor en medio del desierto, a pesar de que habían visto su poder.

¿Cuántos de nosotros en nuestro camino cristiano, hemos tenido un encuentro poderoso con Dios, solo para dudar de su amor por nosotros cuando entramos en el desierto de la vida o nos encontramos con una cruz que no queríamos? La reacción de los israelitas fue: "Quiero volver a cuando la vida no involucraba la cruz".

En la primera lectura, Dios revela al pueblo que él les proporcionará el alimento que necesitan para atravesar el desierto. En el Evangelio de hoy, el Señor nos conduce al discurso del Pan de Vida, revelando lo que nos dará la fuerza para soportar el desierto y las cruces de la vida. Él se nos entregará en la Eucaristía en cada Misa. Al llegar a nuestro último año de Renacimiento Eucarístico, que permanezca el deseo de que nos aferremos al Señor y permanezcamos cerca de la Eucaristía. Oremos para que, a pesar de lo que estemos atravesando en nuestras vidas, siempre busquemos la gracia de Dios en la Eucaristía, ¡la que nos alimentará y nos fortalecerá en nuestro camino hacia Dios!

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE


When have you grumbled against God instead of consenting, trusting, and believing he would see you through to a brighter future? In this first reading from Exodus, the whole Israelite community laments over their wanderings in the desert; their earthly focus on hunger and thirst leads them to believe slavery in Egypt would have been better than God's freedom for them. When we are struggling for whatever reason, it's easy to forget all that God has done for us in the past and all he desires to do for us in the future. We may not even recognize the very life-giving and life-sustaining "bread" that lays before us, much as the Israelites did not recognize the bread that lay before them in the desert. In spite of our hard-heartedness at times, however, God is truly patient; he loves us beyond measure. Just as he did not condemn the Israelites, he does not condemn us but rather, calls us back to him time and again with love and mercy.


#### GO EVANGELIZE


PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

As we heard, God sends the people quail and manna – bread from heaven – to satisfy their frustrated longings while preparing them for an even greater "bread from heaven" that is still to come. In the Gospel, Jesus references this Scripture passage and clarifies that it was not Moses, but his Father who provided the bread from heaven. Jesus tells his disciples to "work for food that endures for eternal life" because he wants them to see the bigger picture. He wants them (and us!) to understand that we should not toil only for physical bread, but for the truest food that is lifegiving to our souls – the food found in accomplishing the works of God by believing and following the one he sent: Jesus. We do this by following Paul's advice from the second reading and seek to "be renewed in the spirit of [our] minds," following God's way of holiness. Only in and through this conformity to Christ will we be prepared to go forth and witness to the mystery of our faith.

**REFLECT** This week, in thinking about how you can "accomplish the works of God," turn to Paul's Letter to the Ephesians. He tells them to put away their old self and "put on the new self, created in God's way." Examine where you might not be seeing your own manna from heaven, and refocus you efforts to give praise and thanksgiving to God for his never-ending mercy and care.










### CMAA Pledge Report for Our Lady of Mercy
