

News from P.I.T. (Pastor in Training)



Understanding our Catholic faith and beliefs are important. In a world where there are countless beliefs, many that are contrary to our faith, it is important to study and learn our own faith. However, with the globalization of many cultures, some people will try to avoid conflict and take a universal approach by accepting all beliefs as "equal but

different." Or, in order to avoid conflict all together without rejecting their own beliefs, they will say, "I agree to disagree."

I, however, would like challenge us with a simple fact: belief leads to action. This means that right beliefs leads to right action, and wrong belief leads to wrong action. Therefore, it is important to practice right beliefs. For example, if I don't believe there is anything wrong with my weight or health when I'm overweight and out of shape, I won't change my habits to correct it.

That's why I'm grateful for not only these last few years of our Eucharistic revival in the Catholic Church in the U.S., but these last few weeks at Mass as we proclaimed the 6th chapter of the Gospel of John, also known as "The Bread of Life Discourse." The Lord confirms what we truly believe as he states, "I am the living bread that came down from Heaven, whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." Even as the Jews seem to quarrel, Jesus doubles down "Amen, Amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you."

This belief should draw us to right action! It should stir up in us the desire to receive our Lord, to be with our Lord, and to encounter the depth of his love in the Eucharist. Recently, I was approached and asked the following question, "I am away from the Lord, but how can I grow in my relationship with Jesus?" My response was to seek out the Sacraments. We truly believe that God acts in them and that through them He encounters us. Seek out the Sacrament of Confession, the Anointing of the Sick, and never, I repeat never, separate yourself from the Eucharist! Do these simple things and you will never be far from the Lord. Even Jesus makes it clear, "For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." May we always be grateful to have received the great gift of the Catholic Faith, and these incredible truths that Jesus himself shares with us.

Noticias del P.I.T. (Párroco en Formación)



Es importante comprender nuestra fe y creencias católicas. En un mundo en el que hay innumerables creencias, muchas de ellas contrarias a nuestra fe, es importante estudiar y aprender nuestra propia fe. Sin embargo, con la globalización de muchas culturas, algunas personas intentarán evitar el conflicto y adoptarán un enfoque universal al aceptar todas las creencias como "iguales pero diferentes".

O, para evitar el conflicto por completo sin rechazar sus propias creencias, dirán: "Estoy de acuerdo en estar en desacuerdo".

Sin embargo, me gustaría desafiarnos con un hecho simple: la creencia conduce a la acción. Esto significa que las creencias correctas conducen a la acción correcta, y la creencia incorrecta conduce a la acción incorrecta. Por lo tanto, es importante practicar las creencias correctas. Por ejemplo, si no creo que haya nada malo con mi peso o mi salud cuando tengo sobrepeso y estoy fuera de forma, no cambiaré mis hábitos para corregirlo.

Por eso estoy agradecido no sólo por estos últimos años de nuestro avivamiento Eucarístico en la Iglesia Católica en los Estados Unidos, sino también por estas últimas semanas en la Misa en las que proclamamos el capítulo 6 del Evangelio de Juan, también conocido como "El discurso del Pan de Vida". El Señor confirma lo que realmente creemos cuando afirma: "Yo soy el pan vivo, que ha bajado del cielo; el que coma de este pan vivirá para siempre; y el pan que yo les voy a dar es mi carne, para que el mundo tenga vida". Incluso cuando los judíos parecen discutir entre sí, Jesús insiste: "Yo les aseguro: si no comen la carne del Hijo del Hombre y no beben su sangre, no podrán tener vida en ustedes".

¡Esta creencia debería llevarnos a la acción correcta! Debería despertar en nosotros el deseo de recibir a nuestro Señor, de estar con nuestro Señor y de encontrar la profundidad de su amor en la Eucaristía. Recientemente, alguien se me acercó y me hizo la siguiente pregunta: "Estoy lejos del Señor, pero ¿cómo puedo crecer en mi relación con Jesús?" Mi respuesta fue buscar los Sacramentos. Creemos verdaderamente que Dios actúa en ellos y que a través de ellos Él nos encuentra. Busquen el Sacramento de la Confesión, la Unción de los Enfermos, y nunca, repito, nunca se separen de la Eucaristía. Hagan estas cosas sencillas y nunca estarán lejos del Señor. Incluso Jesús lo deja claro: "Porque mi carne es verdadera comida y mi sangre es verdadera bebida. El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre permanece en mí y yo en él". Que siempre estemos agradecidos por haber recibido el gran don de la Fe Católica, y estas increíbles verdades que el mismo Jesús comparte con nosotros.



Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Prov 9:1-6 | Eph 5:15-20 | John 6:51-58

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

We tell our children, from a young age through their teen years: make wise choices. It's a sort of catch-all to cover the endless possibilities of circumstances - good, bad, or neutral - they might find themselves in. But what does it mean to be wise? To have wisdom? In today's first reading from Proverbs, we are shown a depiction of wisdom herself, spreading a table where the guests will dine when they arrive. "Come, eat of my food, and drink of the wine I have mixed!" she says. This invitation is echoed in the Gospel, by Wisdom personified: Jesus Christ. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day." Simplicity of heart and the forsaking of foolishness are the only criteria for accepting the offering of wisdom. It seems we are to come and be fed. But how do we discern, in our fast-paced, consumer-based world, what exactly is a wise choice? It's hard to advance in true wisdom; it is acquired by the humble and the simple, not the busy and the overcomplicated. Often, what the Christian deems important the world finds "foolish." It can be hard to keep our priorities rightly ordered, but advancing on the path to wisdom begins first by recognizing the centrality of God in our lives and humbly allowing him in.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, he instructs the people, saying, "Watch carefully how you live." I'd like to think that's where we got our "make wise choices" instruction, but I can't be sure. Again, the dichotomy between foolishness and wisdom is addressed. Wisdom is described as being prudent, which is living with one eye in the present, but also one eye toward the future, and being filled with the Holy Spirit. Elaborating even further, Paul provides a beautiful image of "singing and playing to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks always and for everything." In the life of one living with wisdom, there is a turning toward true joy. Living in a spirit of gladness is in direct opposition to living in a spirit of fear or comparison. Since wisdom and understanding are both gifts given to us by the Holy Spirit, we can invite him into our midst and ask him to increase our wisdom, understanding, and our capacity for joy.

ENGAGE Cultivating wisdom and understanding is a lofty, but worthy, goal! This week, spend some time familiarizing yourself with the Wisdom literature of the Bible (which consists of Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs, Wisdom, and Sirach) by reading the introductions to one or more of them. Explore some of the Scriptures themselves.




